Thompson, Farah light up the track

Elaine Thompson continued Jamaica's dominance in sprint by winning the women's 100m gold medal with a time of 10.71 seconds on Saturday, beating two-time defending champion and compatriot Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce to third place.

The 24-year-old finished 0.12 seconds ahead of America's Tori Bowie with Fraser-Pryce settling for bronze at 10.86sec.

Fraser-Pryce ran a confident first 50m of the final but faded as Thompson powered through the second half of the race to win in 10.71 seconds. Thompson confessed that she surprised herself by winning the most coveted title in women's sprint.

"When I crossed the line and glanced across to see I was clear [I] didn't quite know how to celebrate," she told reporters. Fraser-Pryce, who was looking for a third consecutive

title, said she was happy that the sprint title was staying in Jamaica. "What I'm most happy about is that the 100m title is staying in Jamaica. I'm on the podium with my training partner. I'm proud of Jamaica."

Yemen school bombed: MSF

10 children killed; Saudi-led coalition denies claim

The Saudi-led coalition yesterday denied targeting a Yemeni school in air strikes that killed 10 children, instead saying it bombed a camp at which Iran-backed rebels train underage soldiers.

Doctors Without Borders, a Paris-based relief agency also known as MSF, said the children were killed Saturday in coalition air raids on a school in Haydan, a town in rebel-held Saada province.

The coalition of Arab states has been battling the Huthi rebels since 2015 after the insurgents seized Sanaa before expanding to other parts of the country.

Ten days ago it acknowledged "shortcomings" in two out of eight cases it has investigated of strikes on civilian targets in Yemen that the UN has condemned.

Coalition spokesman General Ahmed Assiri said the strikes hit a Huthi training

Two Indian fishing trawlers sink due to rough weather

At least 15 people are feared dead as two Indian fishing trawlers sank in Bangladesh territory of the Bay of Bengal due to inclement weather on Saturday.

Two fishermen were rescued and bodies of five others recovered as of yesterday afternoon.

The two boats -- FV Prasenjit and FV Mahagouri -- were reported to have been carrying 17 fishermen.

Boko Haram shows missing Chibok girls


Releases new video

Boko Haram yesterday released a new video purportedly showing some of the Nigerian schoolgirls kidnapped by the jihadist group from Chibok more than two years ago.

The film was issued just days after embattled Boko Haram head Abubakar Shekau denied claims that he had been replaced as the leader of the Nigeria-based group.

The kidnapping of 276 schoolgirls from Chibok in April 2014 provoked global outrage and brought unprecedented
