"Bou Tumi Kar is a comedy meant to entertain viewers during the Eid vacations," stated the director. The TV play will be telecast on Rtv.



148th birth anniversary of Promoth Chowdhury

Promoth Chowdhury, one of the leading writers of the early 19th century had his roots in Haripur village of Chatmohar upazila in Pabna. However, he is barely remembered in his home district. No steps have been taken to keep alive his memory, while his village ancestral home has fallen prey to encroachers.

A discussion was held to mark the 148th birth anniversary of Promoth Chowdhury. The event was organised by Promoth Chowdhury



Smrity Shangrakhhan Parishad at the Onabil News Portal office premises in Chatmohar upazila recently. The speakers stressed on the need to preserve the memory of Chowdhury in his home district.

Educationalist Taposh Ranjan Tolapatra chaired the discussion while those who spoke on the life and work of the author were Sharif Mahamud Shanju, principal Abdur Rahim Kalu, principal Saradar Ali Hyder, advocate Abdul Momin and poet Isharat Ali.

The speakers said that Chowdhury played a prime role in the flowering of Bangla prose in the early 19th century. His writing technique was emulated by other Bengali prose writers.

Chowdhury's family left their native village after Partition in1947, leaving behind substantial assets. Later, his ancestral house and property were ransacked by nefarious elements.

Among Chowdhury's notable books are Tel-Noon-Lakri (1906) Beerboler Halkhata (1916), Nana Kotha (1919) and Probhondo Sangraha (1952-53). He was also a talented poet. Panchashat (1913) and Podacharn (1919) are his sonnet books.

Towards end of his life Chowdhury immersed himself in editing Bishwa Bharati. He passed away on September 2, 1946 in Kolkata.


Nasima Khanam Queenie is a passionate artist, curator and art organiser. In 2011 she undertook a unique initiative with the launching of Queenies Art, an endeavour to promote art and young artists in Bangladesh and has organised several group art exhibition and workshops. She was the curator of a recently held group painting exhibition titled "Sublime Beauty of Lands and Rivers" at La Galerie, Alliance Française de Dhaka (AFD). The exhibition was the outcome of a three-day art camp titled "Banglar Mati, Banglar Jol," held last year at Bishwo Shahitto Kendro, Dhaka. Sponsored by Queenies Art, noted artist Nasima Khanam Queenie organised the art camp.

She completed her BFA from the Department of Oriental Art, University of Dhaka and did her MFA from the University of Development Alternative. She completed a course in basic drawing from the School of Visual Art, New York, USA under eminent artist Professor John Foote.

She has to her credit six solo art exhibitions held from 1991 to 2014, as well as numerous group art exhibitions from



1979 to 2016. The spectrum of her involvement includes Young Artist Exhibition, National Art Exhibition, Asian Art Biennale, and exhibitions sponsored and organised by many local galleries and organisations -- UNDP, GTZ, SIDA, Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy (BSA), Bangladesh National Museum and



Alliance Française de Dhaka.

A notable exposition of the artist was the slide show exhibition on her artworks at Hawthorne School, in Madison, Wisconsin, USA.

She has several awards to her credit such as the Class Best Award in Oriental Painting in 1984, the grand award in a

nationwide art competition on the theme "Right to Health," organised by Ministry of Health, GTZ and SIDA. She was conferred the honourable mention awards by Shadhinata Sangsad and Patua Quamrul Hassan Award by Bangladesh Shilpo O Sahitya Saangsad for her contributions to fine art in Bangladesh.
