Brazil going after gold

Coach says ahead of Honduras semifinal

The only major silverware missing from Brazil's glittering cabinet is an Olympic gold. The five-time world champions came close to winning it last time around, but in the end they had to be satisfied with a silver medal after losing to Mexico in the final.

This time around, following the senior team's humiliating World Cup elimination and failure in back-to-back Copa Americas, there were those who doubted the team's prospects in these games, even with Neymar as team captain and rising stars like Gabriel Jesus, Gabriel Barbosa, Marquinhos, Rafinha and Felipe Anderson in the side.

Those doubts only became stronger after the hosts' goalless draws in their first two games against South Africa and Iraq. The team was jeered off the pitch and Neymar was subject to heavy criticism, as crowds taunted him with the chant: "Ole, Ole. Marta, Marta."

However the Selecao have turned things around since then, putting four past Denmark in their last group match before getting the better of Colombia with a 2-0 victory in the quarterfinal.

The team's coach, Rogerio Micale, believes his team has proven the doubters wrong.

"Unfortunately football is about immediate results. Since those criticisms, we have had two good results and now we are in the semis. I think most of the criticism was ridiculous," Micale said at a press conference on Monday.

Now with Honduras to face in the semifinal, which will take place at the Maracana

today at 10:00pm (Bangladesh time) before the second semifinal between Germany and Nigeria, the bets will surely be on Brazil to make it to the final, if not win the title.

Bangladesh Premier

"We are going after gold. We have been building the strength that we have and we are arriving at our goal," the 47-year-old coach, who has a vast experience of working with youth teams across Brazil, said ahead of the semifinal.

After some lackluster performances in the first few matches, Neymar came into his own, scoring against Colombia in the quarterfinal. The coach believes Neymar has come of age off the pitch too.

"Neymar a very young athlete and he has a big responsibility because of his quality. He has shown a lot of maturity, and he is learning from his mistakes. He is doing things the right way," said the coach, who also reserved high praise for young Palmeiras forward Gabriel Jesus, earmarking him as one for the future.

The Brazil under-23 coach, who is open to working with senior team coach Tite, feels that no matter what they achieve in these Olympics, the team needs to be given time to rebuild.

"Brazil football is going through a rebuilding process. If we win, everything is fine but if we lose, people will start building everything from the scratch again. It's like you're building a house and in the middle of the process, you destroy it and start rebuilding again. Germany spent 12 years building it and they are reaping the benefits. That's how to do it," the coach opined.

Braz steals the show Former FIFA

David Rudisha sealed a historic Olympic 800m double as Shaunae Miller's audacious dive and Thiago Braz's pole vault gold for Brazil lit up a wet Monday night in Rio.

Kenya's Rudisha was all class in a smooth 800m victory which made him the first man since New Zealand's Peter Snell in 1964 to win the event at consecutive Olympics.

But Rudisha was soon upstaged by the Bahamas' Miller, who threw herself head-first across the line to snatch victory from flummoxed American favourite Allyson Felix.

More was to come when Braz stunned French defending champion and world recordholder Renaud Lavillenie to win the pole vault, grabbing Brazil's second gold of the Games and bringing the sparse crowd to its feet.

Earlier, a wobble on the balance beam ended Simone Biles' bid for a record five gymnastics gold medals, and Rio had its latest safety scare when a giant suspended TV camera plunged to the ground, slightly injuring seven.

Miller remained lying on the track for some time after her unconventional dive, which followed a similar lunge across the line by Brazil's Joao Vitor de Oliveira to

qualify from his 110m hurdles heats. Her last-ditch plunge meant disappointment for America's Felix, who has Olympic gold medals over 200m, 4x100m and 4x400m but who switched to focus on the longer distance.

The desperate dives came on a treacherously wet night when runners clattered into hurdles and the discus slipped from hands before officials called a 20-minute suspension.

Conditions were so bad that an extra 110m hurdles heat was arranged for competitors who didn't qualify from the first two races, when the rain was torrential.

As the rain eased, Kenyan middledistance star Rudisha emerged to stamp his class on the 800m. The world champion and world record-

holder hit the front in the final 300m and had one more gear than his rivals as he swept to the line in 1 min 42.15sec. In the pole vault, Lavillenie was the hot

favourite but he was undone by Braz's Olympic record of 6.03m and had to settle for silver in front of the partisan crowd. Gymnast Biles was confident of claiming

her fourth Rio win and move into position for an unprecedented fifth on the last day of the competition on Tuesday.

But the tiny Texan wobbled badly on the balance beam when landing a forward somersault and had to put both hands down for support.

Joao Havelange, Brazil's corruption-tainted former FIFA president who helped bring the Olympic Games to Rio, has died at the age of 100, a hospital spokeswoman told AFP Tuesday.

The news, first given by Brazilian media, was confirmed by Andresa Feijo, spokeswoman for the Samaritano Hospital in Rio de Janeiro.

Havelange is credited with helping transform football into a global success story, but his legacy has been tarnished by serious corruption allegations. He resigned as honorary president of FIFA in 2013.




