# 'I AM THE GREATEST'

"There you go, I am the greatest," announced Usain Bolt emphatically as the Jamaican drew the curtains on his incredible Olympic career with a record ninth gold medal in nine finals, after anchoring his team to a third consecutive title in the men's 4X100m relay at the Olympic Stadium in Rio de Janeiro on Friday night.

It was the culmination of eight years of sprint dominance and many years of hard work and sacrifice reaching its climax. The now nine-time Olympic champion and the world record holder in 100m, 200m and 4X100m relays was racing for one last time in the Olympics, and he made it a memorable night with a show of his brilliant best, helping himself to become only the third athlete after Paavo Nurmi and Carl Lewis to win nine Olympic gold medals in track and field and the first one to do so in sprint events.

When the baton was passed onto Bolt for the final leg of the 4X100m relay, Jamaica was slightly ahead of the rest of the field, and there was hardly any doubt about who was going to win gold. With his weakest point -- the start from a crouching position taken out of the equation -- there was always going to be only one winner, Bolt, and Jamaica in this case. The Kingston native applied the after-

burners and pulled away to the finish line way ahead of the chasing pack. Bolt was happy that he was left with a rather easy job by his teammates.

"I told the guys, 'Don't give me too much work to do, please,' and they did exactly that. I had no work to do but to just run to the line," the Jamaican told reporters at the



press conference after wrapping up the victory and the elaborate celebrations. "As soon as I got the baton, I knew I was going to win this one, because there's no one on the

anchor leg that can outrun me." He was relieved and sad at the same time. Relieved

because he had a mission and that mission was accom-

plished; sad because this was the last time he was racing in the Olympics.

"It's mixed feelings," Bolt said. "It's relief because it's really stressful -- the years that I've gone through injury problems. It's been so much. It's a relief but I'm also sad I have to leave and this is my last one. I'm going to miss the competition and it's just so many different feelings I'm feeling."

The final act of the Jamaican's storied career came just about 25 hours before his 30th birthday, and he couldn't have had himself a better birthday present than achieving the rare feat of a 'triple, triple' to celebrate. The trailblazer certainly thought so. "I don't know how I'm going to celebrate but it's a great birthday present so far, so I'm happy."

But with sprinters like Justin Gatlin still doing fine at the age of 35, isn't it be a bit too early for Bolt to hang up his racing boots in a year's time? Bolt seemed pretty determined to stick to his decision even if his teammates would love to have him back in four years' time.

"We wanted to win to make Usain immortal and he is immortal. I've told him he should come back for 2020!" Bolt's teammate and training partner Yohan Blake said.

Indeed billions of fans around the world will be praying that the sprint king returns to grab three more gold medals and raise the bar even higher come Tokyo 2020.

# Taskin, Sunny's test on Sep 8

Bangladesh bowlers Taskin Ahmed and Arafat Sunny are scheduled to test their respective bowling actions in an ICCaccredited centre in Brisbane on September 8. They are scheduled to leave for Australia on September 6.

Both the bowlers were flagged for suspect bowling actions during the ICC World twenty20 this year. They were eventually suspended from bowling in international cricket following a test at an ICC lab.

Ever since then, Taskin and Arafat have worked on modifying their respective actions and have even been tested by the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB). With the England series due in a month's time, the board is confident that both these bowlers will be available in time for the competition.

"Taskin will give the test on the eighth of September in Brisbane. We are very positive about his case. Arafat Sunny has been working with our head coach Chandika Hathurusingha and (Venkatapathy) Raju and they are both relatively satisfied with his action. He has to go through some more work. But overall the management feels that his action will be good enough by next month and that he too can go along with Taskin in the first week of next month," BCB director Jalal Yunus told reporters yesterday.

The Bangladesh Cricket Board has said that the ECB's (England and Wales Cricket Board) three-member security delegation left the country 'happy and satisfied'.

The delegation, which had meetings with the home ministry, various security agencies and also visited the venues where England are scheduled to play Bangladesh, left Dhaka yesterday night. Whether

England's tour of Bangladesh, due to begin in October, will take place as scheduled will depend upon the report that the delegation provides to the ECB. "We think they are very much convinced, but we obviously won't get the result now. They will have a meeting with the ECB after going back and we will know the result

only after that. There is no time frame as to when they will let us know," BCB director Jalal Yunus informed reporters at Mirpur yesterday. "They spoke to the home ministry from where they received a very comprehensive security plan. The BCB's

security consultant also provided them with a presentation today. So I think they are definitely happy and satisfied. But again, we can't predict the result as of now," he added. England are scheduled to play three ODIs and two Tests

in Bangladesh this October.

### Eight new faces in Saintfiet's long list

Belgian coach Tom Saintfiet yesterday declared a 33-member preliminary squad for the Asia Cup Qualifiers play-off against Bhutan and a friendly against Maldives, including eight new players from lightweight outfits.

The Bangladesh national football team are scheduled to play a practice match against Maldives on September 1 in Male before hosting Bhutan on September 6 in Dhaka.

The new players who have broken into the side are Arambagh's Mohammad Abdullah, Jafar Iqbal and Mansur Amin, Mehbub Hasan Nayan and Didarul Alam of Rahmatganj, Sentu Chandra Sen of Uttar Baridhara, Sohel Rana of Team BJMC and

Rumman Hossain of Sheikh Russel KC. "The selection was made with the young players who played well in the league and also experienced players, players who have experience in the national team and players who have no experience. So it's a very diverse selection. We are going to create a team which is going to win against Bhutan and Maldives," Saintfiet said, explaining his selection.

Player like goalkeepers Maksudur Rahman Mustaque and Mohammad Nehal, striker Mehdi Hasan Tapu and midfielder Anamul Haque Sharif staged a comeback to the preliminary fold after a long period.
