# Fire at mega mall again

No casualties; extent of damage at Bashundhara City unclear

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Firefighters were struggling till early hours today to fully douse the flames at the capital's Bashundhara City Shopping Complex, even some 14 hours after the fire broke

Plumes of smoke continued to spiral out of the eightstorey shopping mall at Panthapath around 1:30am today. The cause of the blaze, which started on level-6 around

11:00am, remains unknown. This is the fifth fire incident at the market and the adja-

cent 20-storey building which is used as Bashundhara's office since 2009, according to shop owners and and employees. Yesterday's fire had initially threatened to cause heavy

damage to life and property in the the busy marketplace, though only two people suffered suffocation and several shops were gutted in the end. Some 100 more may have been partially damaged. The toxic smoke virtually shrouded the adjacent areas up

until late night, making it difficult for the people living SEE PAGE 11 COL 1
