



# Mountain Echoes Literary Festival 2016

It is now that time of the year when the breathtakingly beautiful mountains of Bhutan call to a fusion of art, literature, music and culture.

Set in a country known for its environmental conservation, the 7th edition of the Mountain Echoes Literary Festival 2016, to be held from August 26 to 28, an initiative of India-Bhutan Foundation will open with a conversation on the impact of climate change presented by acclaimed Indian novelist Amitav Ghosh, author of "The Great Derangement: Climate Change and the Unthinkable," a non-fiction book that challenges people to confront the most urgent task of the world.

The festival will also include talks featuring a range of themes including women's voices, travel writing and love and relationships, according to the organisers.

This year the Bangladeshi poet, writer, and women's rights activist, Sadaf Saaz will be participating in the festival, as part of a particular focus on opening up conversations on what it means to be a woman in South Asia at a time of intense change. Saaz will be participating in the talk "Present Tense" building on her work exploring Bangladeshi women's experience, through poetry and monologues. Along similar themes, Anjum Hasan and Ira Trivedi will discuss an anthology that examines the Indian woman's experience, in the Women's Voices segment titled "Walking towards Ourselves", in conversation with Namita Gokhale.

Çiler Ilhan, Anjum Hasan, Mridula Koshy and Sonam Wangmo Jhalani will debate the maxim 'write what you know', discussing how they have drawn upon personal experience in their writing.

Critically-acclaimed actress Tabu will speak with Kelly Dorji about asserting her position

EMK Center hosted EMK Moves, 'Isolation', a dance presentation by four contemporary dancers from Dhaka on August 20 at EMK Center for Public Service and Arts.

A group of four young choreographers presented a contemporary dance exposition that was directed collectively to see what four souls unite and produce. The initiator of the performance was dancer Lamia Mela, who had previously worked with most of the dancers. The other fine young dancers were Mahabub Hossain, Mashrur Rahman

and Anandita Khan.

The elements they worked with were tied to the human body through its 'isolation'. A crucial aspect as it is, the human body's inevitable choice of becoming isolated both cognitively and bodily through growth and age is a belief mostly unnoticed. Other themes explored were limitations of bodies, the point which bodies seize to commute, and the overcoming of cultural and social barriers. The dancers wanted to collectively put together their own ideas and renditions of bodily movements and provoking thoughts in a 35 minute presentation.

#### Justin Timberlake, Jessica Biel to host Clinton Fundraiser

Justin Timberlake and Jessica Biel will fill in for Leonardo DiCaprio as hosts of a fundraiser for Hillary Clinton on Tuesday.

A source familiar with the plans said that Timberlake and Biel now will host the event at their home, after DiCaprio was unable to return to Los Angeles before Wednesday because he has to complete a project in time for it to premiere at the Toronto Film Festival on Sept. 9. DiCaprio asked Biel and Timberlake to host the event after he couldn't make it.

DiCaprio is producing a climate change documentary, "Before the Flood," with Brett Ratner, Fisher Stevens and Rick Yorn. The documentary is an account of how society can prevent the demise of endangered species, ecosystems and native communities across the globe.

Those featured in the doc include President Obama, Former President Bill Clinton, Secretary of State John Kerry, United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon and Pope Francis, along with a host of scientists and conservationists.

The lunchtime fundraiser is one of a series of events Clinton is attending in a swing through Southern California.
