Sylhet BCL 'attacks' cops, injure six

Following bid to ride motorbike over road made off-limits to vehicles

Six policemen were injured on Monday night in an alleged attack by Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activists after three of the latter were stopped from riding a motorcycle over a Sylhet city road temporarily made off-limits to vehicles for an Urs (religious gathering).

Police said to have caught 10 "attackers", including a former BCL central committee joint secretary, Masud Kamal Sufi, some from the spot and others from Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital, where they were seeking treatment. They were shown arrested in an assault case injured Sub-

inspector (SI) Shahin Miah filed with Kotwali Police Station that night against Masud and 34 unnamed BCL activists, and produced before a court which sent them to jail. Shahin, assistant SIs Abdul Aziz, Farhad and Alfaz and constables Moslem and Faizul are being treated at the hos-

pital for cuts and bruises, Officer-in-Charge (OC) Sohel Ahmed told The Daily Star. Four or five cocktails exploded during the "attack"

while police fired 36 bullets in the air and backup arrived from nearby posts, said SI Fazle Azim Patwary, the case's investigation officer. The "attackers" damaged two trucks and some grocery

Demo for dorms paralyses JnU academic activities

To protest, they brought a fake dead body wrapped with shrouds and blocked a major road at Old Dhaka's Rai Shaheb Bazar intersection, symbolising that they were ready to die.

DU publishing 15 volumes FACULTY SEARCH of foreign 'Policypaedia'

In a rare initiative, the Dhaka University is going to publish 15 volumes of "Bangladesh Foreign Policypaedia", which will help scholars, researchers, policymakers and make all better informed.

Led by Prof Imtiaz Ahmed of Department of International Relations and Centre for Genocide Studies, DU has already completed two volumes containing chronology of events from 1972-1979, which will be formally published soon.

Speaking at a pre-publication announcement of the two forthcoming volumes of the Policypaedia, Prof Imtiaz informed they are going to publish the 15 volumes in the next three years. The University Press Limited (UPL) will publish the volumes.

He said volumes 1-6 will have chronol-

ogy of events from 1972-2018 and the other volumes will focus on treaties and agreements; trade, finance and marketing; critical reflections; en-gendering foreign policy; perspectives from abroad, cultural diplomacy, and foreign policy speeches by all the heads of state and government.

Nearly 100 students worked relentlessly to prepare the first two volumes, Prof Imtiaz said, adding, another hundred or more would be required to finish the project.

Held in the Muzaffar Ahmed Chowdhury auditorium of the social science faculty building, Prime Minister's International Affairs Adviser Dr Gowher Rizvi addressed the function as the chief guest, where DU Pro-VC Prof Md Akhteruzzaman and Director of UPL Mahrukh Mohiuddin, also spoke.

Gowher Rizvi lauded the initiative and SEE PAGE 4 COL 5


