ONE FOR THE MEN

Nothing speaks fashion as much as the traditional panjabi during Eid. Whether you opt for a simple design for the Eid mornings or something fancier for the invites at night, they will always ooze an aura of class, sophistication and tradition. With Eid ul Adha right around the corner, you are probably too busy haggling for the best buy in the cattle market to really spend time on clothes. And that is why the panjabi accessories will take things up a notch for you, giving your style that flawless finish.

TUPI

An Eid essential, tupis (head caps) are a must for Eid mornings. Available in a variety of materials such as cotton, silk or even rayon, the cost usually depends on its designs. From embroidery to sequins, you can find them almost anywhere in the city, with simple ones being available for as low as Tk 80 to more sophisticated ones costing around Tk 400.

TURBAN

For the fashion-conscious men, why not get in the hype of the biggest sensation right now and go for a turban? Perfect for the evening Eid invites, these will really make you stand out, especially if they match the shade of your panjabi and fit you well. If you are adept at turban tying, you could start from scratch, but for beginners, there are plenty of ready-made turbans available at Elephant Road. UTTORIO

One of the most popular accessories, nothing works as well as an 'uttorio' when it comes to panjabis. With a huge collection

While a flamboyant red will complement your cream panjabi, you might need something black for your maroon outfit. It's a trial and error method to find the perfect combo.

WAISTCOAT

Available in a variety of colours in different types of fabrics, the waistcoat is practically the panjabi's best friend. You could opt for striped or checkered ones in mixed fabric or endi-silk for as low as Tk 1100 at Aarong or Kay Kraft, which add a sense of traditional boldness to your look. Or you could go for machine-embroidered ones with velvet linings.

Varying in designs of buttons and pockets, you can also find cotton or linen ones at Sailor or Noir, in mostly bold monochromes of red, blue or turquoise.

BROOCH / GOLD BUTTONS

A hot favourite for the trendsetter, these simplistic icons can be the make or break for your outfit. A classic accessory with a rotating pin clasp, you can find brooches in different shapes and sizes costing from Tk 2000 to around Tk 4000. Be it the fancy

pearls, gold and silver or its less expensive counterparts, they are perfect to add a bit of modern aesthetics to the traditional panjabi. Opt for a broach that contrasts the colour of the panjabi, going for dark ones if you are wearing a bright panjabi, or a silver one if you are wearing dark colours like black or navy blue.

with silk panjabis. This has been the quintessential accessory to go along with panjabis and its appeal has transcended time.
