# Mir Quasem's fate sealed

SC rejects the condemned Jamaat leader's plea for review of verdict upholding his death penalty for war crimes; full verdict released, sent to jail

Bringing a six-year legal battle to a close, the Supreme Court yesterday dismissed war criminal Mir Quasem Ali's petition for reviewing its judgment that upheld his death penalty for committing crimes against humanity in 1971.

Around 10 hours after the dismissal of the plea, a copy of the full verdict was sent to Dhaka Central Jail around 7:00pm.

Jahangir Kabir, senior jail superintendent of the prison, told The Daily Star at 9:25pm that they received a copy of the verdict at 9:00pm. SEE PAGE 11 COL 1

## Saudi job for Tk 1.65 lakh

Govt fixes migration cost for each Bangladeshi worker

The government has fixed the cost at Tk 1.65 lakh, including airfare, passport and welfare fee, for each Bangladeshi worker willing to migrate to Saudi Arabia.

Employment and Training (BMET) issued a circular in this regard yesterday, a day after discussing the costs with Bangladesh Association of International Recruiting Agencies (Baira).

The Bureau of Manpower, BMET, said if a particular Saudi employer bore the airfare, the cost would be even lower.
