The government decision turning down foreign diplomats' request for using armed Bangladeshi private security personnel has evoked mixed reactions among several missions of Western and Asian countries as they think the threat from terrorism was still high.

A number of missions, including that of the US, Japan, India and Spain, expressed interest on exploring the option for diplomats, their families and mission officials following killings of bloggers, minorities and foreigners in past several months.

The US, Japan and Italy made the request formally following the murder of their citizens

and a locally hired staff, Xulhaz Mannan. The demand became stronger following

the July 1 attack on Holey Artisan Bakery when 22 people were killed, including 17 foreigners.

Diplomatic sources said the missions sought it as a secondary protective measure as Bangladesh Police provide outstanding and professional service to safeguard diplomats and their facilities.

Most missions and thousands of other establishments in Dhaka employ personnel of Bangladeshi security companies who are unarmed, in line with Bangladeshi laws.

BIWTA chief urges stop to overloading

Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) yesterday directed launch operators to refrain from overloading during Eid rush to ensure safety for holidaymakers.

dents. So, you (launch owners) will have to remain alert...," said Bholanath Dey, acting chairman of BIWTA. He was speaking at a preparatory meeting at Sadarghat launch terminal for ensuring hassle-free journeys, where

government officials, law enforcers, launch owners and workers were present. He also stressed the need for keeping sufficient number of safety equipments on launches. During Eid rush, many attempt to board on vessels at mid river through small boats, which causes accidents, he

said, adding, necessary steps will be taken for its prevention. Mohammed Ibrahim Khan, deputy commissioner of Dhaka Metropolitan Police (Lalbagh division), said adequate number of police will be deployed at the terminal and its adjacent areas to maintain law and order situation during the rush. "BIWTA officials should ensure that all the launches leave the terminal on time. Delay may cause more

gatherings," he viewed. Shahidul Islam Bhuiyan, a launch owner, demanded that the road from Gulistan to Sadarghat be freed from hawkers, so the passengers could reach the terminal smoothly.

Mahbub Uddin Ahmed Bir Bikram, chairman of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport (passenger carriers') Association, urged the launch owners for not operating any unfit vessels during the rush.

The capital's single river port Sadarghat launch terminal witnesses huge rush ahead of the Eid holidays, when around 10 lakh people leave the capital through waterways in the last seven days, according to BIWTA and transport officials.


