

CELEBRATING MUSTAFA MONWAR, ARTIST EXTRAORDINAIRE

Director's Guild holds programme at Shilpakala

It was an evening of celebration of life of Mustafa Monwar. The artist extraordinaire poetically portrayed numerous watercolours and artworks, aesthetically developed the standard of TV programmes in Bangladesh, pioneered the art of puppetry, taught a number of students with not only art but also other forms of performing arts as a teacher at the Faculty of Fine Arts, University of Dhaka and mentored many creative minds with his unique artistic ways.

September 1 was the 81st birth anniversary of this eminent artist. Director's Guild, an organisation of Television Drama Directors, befittingly paid homage to the living legend in celebration of his birth anniversary through a programme at the National Theatre Hall auditorium of Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy.

Artistes of Nrityanchal, led by Shamim Ara Nipa and Shibli Mohammad, set off of the celebration programme displaying a medley dance pieces set on Tagore songs. The dancers fascinated the audience with the grace of Kathak and at the end of their presentation; they brought Mustafa Monwar on stage and welcomed the artist.

Saidul Anam Tutul, the convener of the birthday celebration committee, delivered welcome address. 


Veteran singer Ferdausi Rahman unveiled the album as chief guest. Regarding this,

Lindsey Stirling's "Brave Enough" tops album charts

'Hip-hop violinist' Lindsey Stirling has scored her third consecutive No. 1 on Billboard's Top Dance/Electronic Albums chart, as her latest release, "Brave Enough", started atop the list dated Sept. 10.

The album launched on the sales chart with 45,000 copies sold in the week ending Aug. 25, according to Nielsen Music - the largest sales week for a dance/electronic album since Stirling's last album, "Shatter Me", bowed at No. 1 with 56,000 more than two years ago.

"Shatter Me" spent 19 weeks atop the list, and finished 2014 as the year's topselling dance/electronic album. Stirling also led the Top Dance/Electronic Albums chart with her 2012 self-titled album, which ruled for two weeks.

The violinist also hits No. 1 on both the Classical Albums and Classical Crossover Albums charts with "Brave Enough" - she also topped both tallies with her two earlier releases.

Behind Stirling on the new Top Dance/Electronic Albums chart is Crystal Castles, entering at No. 2 with "Amnesty" (2,000 sold).

Stirling, a violinist-dancer-composer



and performing artiste, has a range of genres in her repertoire - from classical to rock and pop, and EDM, and has been known for her covers of famous songs alongside her original work. She came to prominence through her YouTube channel, and has made the

successful transition into a full mainstream musician and performer, largely thanks to her quarterfinal finish on the fifth season of talent show America's Got Talent (2010).
