The artiste spoke to The Daily Star about her return to the media. Excerpts:

Sarika: I will stay at home on the day and spend time with my family for the next ten days, as I have busy shooting schedule until the last day before Eid.



CPJA holds photo exhibition

Fostering friendship between India and Bangladesh

Aiming at enhancing social immediacy between India and Bangladesh, a three-day photo exhibition of photojournalists from the two countries ended at Zainul Abedin Art Gallery of Chittagong District Shilpakala Academy in the port city on Saturday.

A total of 41 photojournalists from India and Bangladesh took part at the exhibition. To mark its 30th founding anniversary,

Chittagong Photo Journalist Association (CPJA) jointly with Agartala Press Club of India organised the exhibition, titled "Motree".

Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) Mayor AJM Nasir Uddin inaugurated the exhibition as the chief guest.

A total of 42 images of 22 photojournalists from Chittagong and 19 from India were on display at the exhibition. The photographs depicted the tribal life and culture in the region, different

kinds of festivals including the religious ones, while heritage and historical places of Agartala also got room in the exhibition.

Chaired by CPJA's President Masiur Rahman Badal, the inauguration was addressed by AJM Nasir; Mesbah Uddin, Deputy Commissioner (DC) of Chittagong and Chitra Roy, vice-president of Agartala Press Club, CPJA general secretary Rashed Mahmud and Agartala Press Club Assistant General Secretary Pranab Chakraborty.

A year after revealing her lupus diagnosis, Selena Gomez has decided to take some time off to deal with side effects of the illness, including "anxiety, panic attacks and depression". The singer and actress recently wrapped up her Revival World Tour in support of her 2015 album "Revival".

"I want to be proactive and focus on maintaining my health and happiness and have decided that the best way forward is to take some time off," she told People about her decision. "I need to face this head on to ensure I am doing everything possible to be my best. I know I am not alone by sharing this, I hope others will be encouraged to address

their own issues." Gomez revealed that she was diagnosed with the autoimmune disease before releasing "Revival". She had taken some time off before unveiling the album to undergo

chemotherapy. She recently appeared in the films "Neighbors 2: Sorority Rising" and "The Fundamentals of Caring". She will star in the upcoming James Franco-helmed drama "In Dubious Battle" alongside Franco, Nat Wolff, Robert Duvall and Bryan Cranston.

Directed by Damien Chazelle and starring Ryan Gosling and Emma Stone, "La La Land" received two mid-movie ovations and a 20second one at the end as it opened the 43rd Telluride Film Festival.

Every best picture Oscar winner since 2008's "Slumdog Millionaire", save for one, has played at Telluride, the annual Labor Day weekend gathering in Colorado, USA.


The film was selected for the coveted Friday afternoon Patron Preview slot, having already opened the Venice Film Festival earlier in the week. And the crowd that packed the Chuck Jones Cinema was not disappointed. They accorded the LA-set film two mid-movie ovations — one following its instant-classic opening sequence on a freeway and another following a heartwarming sequence at Griffith Park and another 20-second one at the end.


La La Land sympathetically showcases the struggles and sacrifices of people who pursue

same prodigy - 31-year-old Chazelle - who made his name with another music-centric film, 2014's best picture-nominated "Whiplash", and who has great reverence for film history.

Additionally, it stars two of the most likable people imaginable, on screen and off, taking a major artistic risk together and displaying magical chemistry five years after first doing so in "Crazy Stupid Love". Gosling's performance may be undervalued because his character is a bumbling charmer, not entirely unlike himself — but, even so, he sings and dances winningly. As for Stone, her best actress nomination maybe even a win - is sewn up with her emotional rendition of "Here's to the Ones Who Dream", not unlike Anne Hathaway's was with her "I Dreamed a Dream" in 2012's "Les Miserables".
