Payra rail link to bring \$7.5b FDI

Govt weighing proposal to build 280km line to connect Dhaka, Joydevpur with new seaport



A British company has proposed to invest \$7.5 billion in the Dhaka-Payra seaport rail link project, whose implementation is vital for the government's ambitious economic development plan.

An official of the railways ministry said the UK firm -- DP Rail -- has submitted the proposal, and the decision about it would be made by the end of this month at a toplevel meeting at the Prime Minister's Office.

The proposal came in response to shipping ministry's invitation for Expression of Interest for investment in various components of the Payra seaport in Kuakata of Patuakhali. Five companies, including DP Rail, had submitted proposals for the 280km rail link project.

Locals said Milon Mondal, 20, a third-year BBA student of Syed Abul Hossain College in Kalkini, stabbed Nitu on her way to school from her house around 8:45am, and the girl died when she was

Militants kill 17 Indian soldiers in Kashmir

Attack bears hallmarks of Pak-based Jaish-e-Mohammed, says Delhi; Islamabad denies any links

India accused Pakistan of being behind yesterday's separatist attack on an army base near their disputed frontier that killed 17 soldiers, in one of the most deadly attacks in Kashmir in a quarter-century-old insurgency.

Four commando-style gunmen, armed with AK-47 assault rifles and grenades, burst into the brigade head-

quarters in Uri at 5:30am and were killed after a three-hour gunfight, a senior Indian army officer said.

The incident sharply increased tensions between the bitter, nucleararmed rivals and will raise fears of a potential military escalation. Indian and Pakistani troops are in close proximity in many places along one of the world's most heavily militarised frontiers, and exchanges of fire are not

uncommon.

Lieutenant General Ranbir Singh told reporters in New Delhi that yesterday's attack bore the hallmarks of Pakistan-based militant group Jaish-e-Mohammed. Evidence gathered at the scene indicated the attackers were foreign and their equipment bore Pakistani markings, he added.
