

Para-cyclist dies following crash

An Iranian Paralympic cyclist died Saturday after an accident in the road race on the penultimate day of the Rio Games, officials said.

Bahman Golbarnezhad, 48, fell during the event and died of his injuries despite an attempt to take him to the hospital for treatment, officials said.

"He unfortunately passed away," International Paralympic Committee (IPC) spokesman Craig Spence told AFP.

Golbarnezhad's accident occurred during the more than two-hour C4-5 road race for athletes with varying disabilities but still able to bicycle.

He was in the first section of a mountainous descent when he fell.

"The athlete received treatment at the scene and was in the process of being taken to the athlete hospital when he suffered a cardiac arrest," the IPC said in a statement.

"The ambulance then diverted to the nearby Unimed Rio Hospital in Barra where he passed away soon after arrival."

President Hassan Rouhani in a tweet in Farsi said "the demise of our dear cyclist Bahman Golbarnezhad immersed us all in deep sorrow. Rest in peace."

Paralympic officials said Golbarnezhad's family in Iran had been informed and the Iranian team was also told the news during a

meeting at the Athletes' Village.

The cyclist, who wore a prosthesis on his left leg, took up the sport in 2002 and competed at the London 2012 Paralympics.

"This is truly heart-breaking news," IPC president Philip Craven said.

"The Paralympic Family is united in grief at this horrendous tragedy, which casts a shadow over what have been great Paralympic Games here in Rio."

Brazil's top official for the Rio Olympics and Paralympics, Carlos Nuzman, called it "very sad news for sport and for the Paralympic movement. Our hearts and prayers are with Bahman's family, his teammates and all the people of Iran."

The Iranian flag was lowered to half-mast in the Paralympic Village, while the Paralympic flag was to be at half-mast during Sunday's sitting volleyball gold-medal match between Iran and Bosnia and Herzegovina.

A minute of silence will be held during Sunday's closing ceremony.

"This is a very difficult situation. We hope we can repatriate his body to his family soon," state television website IRIB quoted the head of Iran's Paralympic committee, Masoud Ashrafi, as saying.

Golbarnezhad is survived by a wife and a son, he added.

The British Paralympic team tweeted: "We are devastated by the news of Bahman Golbarnezhad's passing. Our thoughts are with our friends and colleagues from Iran."

Hertha equal Bayern at top

Hertha Berlin maintained their 100 percent Bundesliga record with a 2-0 win over Schalke 04 to set up a top-of-the-table clash on Wednesday against Bayern Munich.

Hertha's victory on Sunday means they are only second in the German league table on goal difference with the only teams boasting a perfect three wins from three in Germany's top flight poised to meet at Munich's Allianz Arena in midweek.

Superb second-half goals from ex-Bayern midfielder Mitchell Weiser and Swiss midfielder Valentin Stocker at the Olympic Stadium gave Hertha three more points.

It means Berlin will head to Munich for a mouthwatering clash and another test for Carlo Ancelotti's Bayern.

The result in Berlin was a third-straight defeat for Schalke.

Watford thump listless Man Utd

Misfiring Manchester United crashed to a third consecutive defeat on Sunday as manager Jose Mourinho saw his side deservedly beaten 3-1 at Watford in the Premier League.

It is the first time Mourinho has lost three straight games within the same season since he was at Porto in 2002 and it left United six points behind early pace-setters Manchester City.

Tottenham Hotspur went third after beating Sunderland 1-0 with a goal from Harry Kane, who later limped off. Crystal Palace crushed Stoke City 4-1 and Southampton edged Swansea City 1-0.

"We started the season very well and had good results," said Mourinho. "I feel the first moment we had a defeat, some of the boys are having a bit of difficulty coping with the negativity."

Marcus Rashford cancelled out Etienne Capoue's opener for Watford, but a late goal by Juan Camilo Zuniga and a stoppage-time Troy Deeney penalty gave Walter Mazzarri's side three points.

United were beaten 2-1 by Manchester City in their previous league game and then went down 1-0 to Feyenoord in the Europa League on Thursday.

United once again made a sluggish start and they were given a big let-off when Odion Ighalo somehow curled wide of an open goal after visiting goalkeeper David de Gea dropped a high ball.

Paul Pogba cracked a dipping shot against the bar moments later, but United fell behind in the

34th minute when Daryl Janmaat cut the ball back for Capoue to sweep home his fourth goal of the campaign.

Mourinho felt that United should have been awarded a free-kick for a foul on Anthony Martial by Miguel Britos in the build-up.

Martial landed heavily, having earlier been hurt in a clash of heads with Janmaat, and he left the pitch shortly after, with Ashley Young coming on.

Rashford, making his first league start of the season, equalised just after the hour, slamming in from close range after Ibrahimovic's cross from the left bounced into his path.

But United were undone in the 83rd minute when Roberto Pereyra cut the ball back for substitute Zuniga, who exploited acres of space to curl a shot past De Gea with his first touch after coming on.

Deeney sealed victory in the fifth minute of stoppage time, drilling a penalty into the net after Fellaini had caught Zuniga.

It was Watford's first victory over United in 30

years and saw them climb to ninth place.

"It is a very important three points to give my players the confidence to go ahead," said Mazzarri, via an interpreter.

"We were playing well, we conceded a goal and we stopped playing and we were afraid. But then we made the changes and everything went the right way."

Tottenham leapt up to third place, four points below leaders City, after bouncing back from their opening Champions League loss to Monaco by sinking Sunderland at White Hart Lane.

Kane settled the game in the 59th minute, slotting in from close range after Papy Djilobodji miscued an attempted clearance.

But there was bad news for manager Mauricio Pochettino as Mousa Dembele and Eric Dier were forced off with apparent hamstring injuries before Kane hobbled off after seeming to roll his right ankle.

Sunderland winger Adnan Januzaj was sent off in the last minute after picking up a second yellow card.

Crystal Palace rose to eighth place after a breezy 4-1 win over bottom club Stoke City.

James Tomkins, Scott Dann, James McArthur and Andros Townsend found the net for Palace before Marko Arnautovic claimed a consolation in stoppage time.

Elsewhere, Southampton moved out of the bottom three after Charlie Austin's second-half volley secured a 1-0 win over Swansea.

De Bruyne only behind Messi: Pep

After Manchester City were inspired to their 4-0 demolition of Bournemouth by Kevin de Bruyne, who scored the opening goal and played a part in each of the next three goals, manager Pep Guardiola has lavished praise on the midfielder, saying he is the best player in the world after Barcelona's Lionel Messi.

The victory took City five points clear at the top of the Premier League with a seventh successive win in all competitions, making it the club's best start to a season.

"Maybe Messi sits alone at the table. But that table aside, Kevin can stay there," said Guardiola, who had many memorable moments with Messi at Barcelona.

"I think he's a special player -- an outstanding player. He makes everything. Without the ball he is the first fighter and with the ball he's clear. He sees absolutely everything. He decides what you have to do at the right moment every time.

"Every time he makes the right decision. That's why he is a player at another level. I am lucky and we are lucky to have him. We will take care of him and I hope he will enjoy it with us to play his amazing football."

Late Perisic strike sinks Juventus

A second-half winner by Ivan Perisic boosted Frank de Boer's survival prospects as Inter Milan fought to a deserved 2-1 'Derby d'Italia' win over Juventus in Serie A on Sunday.

De Boer was rumoured to be facing the sack after a midweek defeat to Hapoel Beer Sheva followed a run of poor results in the league. But the former Ajax handler's job looks safe, for the meantime, after Inter put their Europa League shocker behind them with a battling performance at a packed San Siro to hand the champions their first defeat of the season.

Stephan Lichesteiner opened the scoring for Massimiliano Allegri's visitors against the run of play on 66 minutes, but Mauro Icardi continued his impressive form against Gianluigi Buffon by hitting the leveller just two minutes later.

Perisic then came off the bench to nod the winner from Icardi's deft cross 12 minutes from time to send Inter up to seventh place in the table.

Inter are now three points behind Napoli, who, on 10 points, hold a one-point lead on Juventus.

Roma, who face Fiorentina away, can also climb to 10 points with a win in Florence later Sunday.

Juve coach Massimiliano Allegri kept star striker Gonzalo Higuain on the bench, with Mario Mandzukic partnering Paulo Dybala, although the Argentine striker was visibly frustrated as he sat on the touchlines.

Rosberg wins in Singapore

Nico Rosberg won the Singapore Grand Prix from pole position on Sunday to seize the drivers' world championship lead from Mercedes team-mate Lewis Hamilton, who finished third.

The German held off Red Bull's Daniel Ricciardo by just 0.4sec to win his third straight race and establish an eight-point lead over title-holder Hamilton in the standings.

It proved a tense finish as traffic prevented Rosberg pitting for new tyres near the end and Ricciardo, after his stop, closed the gap from more than 20 seconds to fractions over the final 14 laps.

"It's been an awesome weekend," said Rosberg, as he celebrated victory in what was his 200th race.

"Today, great start, I had a good car in the race. Of course, Daniel tried to pull one up on me with the pitstop at the end there, but it worked out."

Ricciardo was still happy despite not quite being able to secure a first

victory of the season.

"We've come very close this year on numerous occasions, but I'm not going to be disappointed," said the Australian.

"I'm not going to stand here disap-

pointed, we gave it a good shot and got within half-a-second."

A disappointed Hamilton said: "A really tough weekend for me but huge congratulations to Nico. His win was fully deserved."

Drone halts match

An English lower-league game was temporarily suspended on Saturday after a drone was flown over the stadium and began circling the pitch.

The third-tier match between Bradford City and Bristol Rovers at Valley Parade was halted in the 65th minute when referee Andy Haines spotted the flying object and led the players off the pitch.

"The game has been paused for the time being. A drone has been spotted hovering in the air above the pitch," Bradford City wrote on their Twitter account to explain the sudden stoppage in play.

After a delay of three minutes, play resumed and the game finished 1-1.
