Five suspects released

A Kishoreganj court yesterday released five people, who were arrested as suspects over the Eid day attack in Kishoreganj's Sholakia.

They were arrested from different areas of the district town for interrogation soon after the incident, police sources said.

The court of Chief Judicial Magistrate Abdus Salam Khan passed the order based on a police report submitted on Monday. The five were produced before the court.

Mir Mosharraf Hossain, officer-incharge of Kishoreganj Sadar Police Station, said the allegation of the arrestee's involvement in the militant attack could not be proven.

The five are Mamunur Rashid alias Mamun, 28, of Mosharraf Taika area in Karimganj upazila; Sohel Miah, 20, of Sultanpur area in Bajitpur upazila; Ariful Islam Hashib, 32, of Paschim Tarapasha and Mohammad

BSF shoots Bangladeshi dead

A Bangladeshi man was shot dead by Indian Border Security Force (BSF) about 100 metres inside the Indian territory at Bangerbari border of Dahagram in Patgram early yesterday.

BSF took the body of the man, a BGB official said.

The official added that a letter was sent to BSF protesting the killing of the Bangladesh national.

The man Hazrat Ali, 35, was the son of Amir Ali of Bangerbari village of Patgram.

Quoting a BSF message, BGB official sources said patrolling BSF men opened fire on Bangladeshi cattle traders bringing in seven to eight cattle from India through the border around 4:30am.

The other traders managed to return to Bangladesh with their cattle, BGB said.

The victim's father Amir Ali however said his son was going to his aunt's house in Maynaguri of Jalpaiguri district in India when the BSF men shot him.

Earlier in the day, the court rejected 36 petitions submitted to it to free Fakhrul and 35 others from the charges as, it said, there were no cogent grounds to do so.

In August 2014, Abu Zafar, subinspector of Paltan Police Station and investigating officer of the case, submitted the charge sheet to the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court of Dhaka. According to the charge sheet, some

300 leaders and activists of the BNPled alliance brought out a procession at Fakirapool in the capital and paraded towards the party's Nayapaltan central office during December 9, 2012 blockade.

At one point, agitators threw bombs at policemen leaving many of them injured and vandalised vehicles on the streets.

A case was filed with Paltan police the same day against 200 to 300 leaders and activists of the BNP-led alliance. Thirty-seven more cases were filed with different police stations in the capital in this connection.

The case statement mentions that Fakhrul on December 6, 2012 urged all not to drive vehicles on city streets during the opposition's countrywide road blockade three days later.

Meanwhile, charges were framed against Fakhrul in three other cases. Moreover, he faces 83 criminal cases filed with different police stations across the country, his lawyer Masud said.

Sunday's predawn raid in Uri was the worst attack against the Indian army in the restive region in years, prompting Home Minister Rajnath Singh to label Pakistan a terrorist state.
