UN suspends Syria aid convoys

18 of 31 vehicles destroyed; Red Crescent employee among dead; Russia, regime forces deny role

The United Nations suspended all humanitarian convoys in Syria yesterday following a deadly air strike on aid trucks, as fighting intensified after the regime declared an end to a week-long truce. Both Syria and Russia denied they were behind the raid

on the convoy near northern city Aleppo, which the Red Cross said killed "around 20 civilians" including an employee of the Syrian Red Crescent. Air raids and shelling meanwhile pounded key

battlefronts across the country -- dimming hopes that the fraught ceasefire brokered by Moscow and Washington could be revived. Key players including the United States and Russia were

meeting in New York yesterday in an effort to salvage the peace process, which US Secretary of State John Kerry had warned could be the "last chance" to end Syria's civil war. SEE PAGE 10 COL 2

Chinese president to visit Dhaka in mid-October

Chinese President Xi Jinping is to arrive in Dhaka on a two-day visit in second week of October. Dhaka is expected to

seek financial support for over two dozens large projects.

"I can tell you the visit is taking place,"

a diplomatic source in the Chinese embassy in Dhaka told The Daily Star. The diplomat said Xi Jinping will visit either on October 13 or 14. Officials at the foreign ministry were yet

to officially declare the date. They said they were in discussion with the Chinese about the visit. Chinese embassy officials also said nothing was finalised.

The Chinese president might announce a package for Bangladesh involving several billion dollars in the next couple of years, said the source.

Fakhrul, 73 others face trial on Dec 4

A Dhaka court yesterday framed charges against BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir and 73 others in a case filed for vandalism and preventing police from discharging their duties during a road blockade in December 2012. It also fixed December 4 to begin the trial of the case.

Fakhrul was not in the first information report (FIR), but according to the charge sheet his involvement was found during the investigation. On the other hand, BNP leader Mirza Abbas was named as a mastermind

in the case statement, but since the probe didn't find his link his name is not in the charge sheet. During yesterday's hearing, Fakhrul's lawyer Masud Ahmed Talukder

said his client had been implicated in the case to harass him politically. The charge sheet didn't mention any specific allegation against the BNP

leader, he said, adding that they would challenge the order with the High Court. Fakhrul and 35 others, now on bail, pleaded not guilty and demanded

justice after Second Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Ali Mashud Sheikh read out the charges to them.

The court cancelled bails of 38 others and issued warrants for their arrest as they remained absent from yesterday's hearing.

The Detective Branch (DB) of Police has arrested the alleged JMB chief of Sirajganj, his two sons and another man at Erandah village of Ullapara early Tuesday.

The DB arrested the four men from inside Jamiatul Quran Cadet Madrasa and also seized a large quantity of gunpowder, some crude bombs and books on Jihad.

The arrestees are: Joynal Abedin, 55, his sons Borhan uddin, 28, and Imran Ali, 26, and Abu Bakar Siddique, 55. According to police, they were the local organisers of the banned militant outfit Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB).

Police, acting on a tip off, detained them when

Lone suspect charged with attempted murder
