No question of mid-term election

PM tells briefing in NY

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday ruled out the possibility of mid-term polls, seeking to know why there is a need for

She said this at a press conference at Bangladesh's Permanent Mission to the UN on the outcome of her participation in the ongoing 71st Session of the United Nations General Assembly.

She also demanded to know what situation has arisen that the government should go for interim polls.

Replying to a question, Hasina said there were no relations between the mid-term polls and the upcoming council of Bangladesh Awami League.

Work together to root out terrorism

Hasina urges world community, tells UN about Bangladesh's zero tolerance policy on extremism

UNB, BSS, New York

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has called upon the world community to work together to root out militancy and terrorism, and plug the sources of funds, arms and ammunitions across borders.

"Terrorists have no religion, caste or creed. We must unite in our resolve to defeat and degrade them in all forms and manifestations. We have to identify the root causes of terrorism and violent extremism," she said.

The PM was addressing the 71st session of the UN General Assembly (UNGA) here on Wednesday.

Like the previous years, she delivered her speech in Bangla.

Hasina mentioned that last year she talked about terrorism and violent extremism as one of the two major global challenges of the time.

EXTORTION IN TRANSPORT SECTOR

Home ministry goes for warning first, not action

The home minister and the shipping minister yesterday acknowledged that extortion was rampant in transport sector. But both spoke of warning the extortionists instead of going straight into action against them.

The government has obtained an intelligence report that named those involved in extortion on highways and at bus and ferry terminals. The list contains names of ruling party men, transport workers, government officials, police members and journalists, sources said.

"From intelligence agencies, we have got the names of those engaged in extortion. We

are asking them to refrain from it. Otherwise, the government will take stern action," Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal told reporters at his office after a meeting on extortion in transport sector and ferry terminals.

The meeting was convened on instructions of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to stop extortion in transport sector, added the sources.

"We are giving the last warning to those involved in extortion. If they don't correct themselves, we will go for action," Shipping Minister Shajahan Khan, who attended the meeting, later told The Daily Star.







Death toll 24 in launch capsize

Ten more bodies were recovered from the Sandhya river yesterday, a day after a launch capsized in the river in Barisal's Banaripara upazila.

With the recoveries, the death toll from Wednesday's launch capsize is now 24, according to fire service officials and police.

The authorities recovered the launch around 8:30am yesterday and found bodies of four children inside. Six more bodies were found floating.

Bodies of Safwan, 3, Riad, 6, Rabbi, 9, Maisha, 1, Mafiya, 4, Hamida, 40, Ruhul Amin, a member of Barisal fire service, and Khukumoni, 40, were recovered yesterday. Names of two other victims could not be known.

The district administration called off the search for missing passengers yesterday.
