Cylinder blast kills balloon vendor in city

A balloon vendor was killed after a gas cylinder used for inflating balloons exploded in the capital's Banani area yesterday afternoon.

The deceased was identified as Lal Mia, 45, from Kalmakanda Upazila in Netrokona district.

As the vendor was inflating balloons on Road 25/A at Banani, the gas cylinder blew up around 3:00pm with a loud bang, leaving him injured critically, said BM Farman Ali, officer-in-charge of Banani Police Station.

The victim was pronounced

dead after he was taken to Dhaka Medical College Hospital around 4:30pm. The incident took place when Lal Mia was delivering balloons at a birthday party thrown for a boy

Shahjahan Mia. Once a rickshaw puller, Lal Mia started his balloon business a year back. His wife and four children live in Netrokona.

hazard, but most importantly, they were taking up a large chunk of prime real-estate, so in 1902, the City and the County Board of Supervisors banned further burials in the city and forced larger cemeteries like Laurel Hill and Calvary Cemetry to move their residents outside the city. The fight to keep the dead in their original resting places lasted a few decades, but by 1942, only two cemeteries remained in San Francisco - The San Francisco National Cemetery

and the Mission Dolores Cemetery. They are still around today, but neither is accepting new burials. Over 150,000 dead bodies were moved from San Francisco to the

small town of Colma, a small community established in 1892, when Archbishop Patrick Riordan decided to create a new necropolis in a valley five miles south of The City. The small field of potatoes that he blessed as the site of the new Catholic Cemetery would go on to become the world's only incorporated town where the dead outnumber the living.

Throughout its entire history, Colma has never had more living residents than dead. Today, it is home to around 1,800 living people and over 1.5 million dead sleeping the eternal slumber in one of its 17 massive cemeteries, fondly referred to by the locals as parks. Colma still serves as the burial ground of San Francisco so the number of "subterranean residents" is still growing at a rapid pace. It is estimated that around 75 dead bodies arrive in

Colma every single day. The extreme living-to-dead ratio has earned Colma a number of morbid nicknames, like "the City of the Silent", "the City of Souls", or "the City of the Dead", but the vastly outnumbered living population never let that bother them. They know that it's the dead that make their home unique, and even used a bit of graveyard humor when creating their official town

Colma". Colma is an eternal home to many historical figures, from the legendary Wild West gambler and lawman Wyat Earp, to denim pioneer Levi Strauss or baseball icon Joe DiMaggio.

China blocks tributary of Brahmaputra to build dam

The move comes after India hints at scrapping Indus Water Treaty

China has blocked a tributary of the Brahmaputra river in Tibet as part of the construction of its "most expensive" hydro project, which could cause concern in India as it may impact water flows into the lower riparian countries.

The Lalho project on the Xiabuqu river, a tributary of the Yarlung Zangbo (the Tibetan name for Brahmaputra), in Xigaze in Tibet involves an investment of 4.95 billion yuan (\$740 million), Zhang Yunbao, head of the project's administration bureau was quoted as saying by Chinese state-run Xinhua news agency yesterday.

Xigaze also known as Shigatse is closely located to Sikkim. From Xigaze, the Brahmaputra flows into Arunachal Pradesh.

the flow of water from the Brahmaputra into the lower riparian countries like India and Bangladesh as a result, it said. Last year, China had

operationalised the \$1.5 billion Zam Hydropower Station, the largest in Tibet, built on the Brahmaputra river, which has raised concerns in India.

But China has been maintaining that it has taken into consideration India's concerns and allays apprehensions of restricting the flow of water, saying its dams are not designed to hold water.

The outline of China's 12th Five Year Plan indicates that three more hydropower projects on the mainstream of the Brahmaputra river in Tibet Autonomous Region have been approved for implementation

In March, Union minister of state for water resources Sanwar Lal Jat said in a statement that India had expressed its concerns to China about the likely impact of the dams.

While there is no water treaty between the countries, India and China established an Expert Level Mechanism (ELM) on trans-border rivers and in October 2013 the two governments signed a memorandum of understanding on strengthening cooperation on trans-border rivers under which Beijing provides data to India on the water flows.

The blockade of the It is not clear yet what impact the Brahmaputra river tributary comes at a time when India's reported decision to suspend talks with Pakistan under Indus Water Treaty as part of its efforts to hit back at Pakistan in the aftermath of the Uri attack.

Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Geng Shuang gave a guarded reply when asked on September 27 about India's reported move.

However, the home team simply outclassed their opponents, who will be ruing their efforts in the fielding department, as an aggressive display from both Tamim and Sabbir Rahman -- who was the new man to be handed the bat in the number three position -- was brilliantly assisted by the bowling, especially left-arm spinner Mosharraf

Hossain's, who celebrated his return to international cricket after eight years by taking three wickets for 24 in his eight overs. However the game was built upon

Bangladesh's batting, which found its feet despite an early hiccup before the middle-order stuttered to deny the side from crossing the 300-mark. After Soumya Sarker continued

his poor form -- giving his wicket away to a bad shot -- Tamim and Sabbir took charge as they put on a 140-run partnership to give the team a good platform. Mahmudullah Riyad came to their

rescue at the death with a cameo of 32 off 22, ensuring that Afghanistan would have to chase their highest-ever ODI total to secure a win. Tamim was lucky to still be at the

crease as he was dropped while batting on one by Afghan skipper Stanikzai. That second life proved to be vital as the southpaw made the most of his reprieve, hitting shots all over the field on his way to a run-aball 118. The seventh ton from Tamim also sets him apart as the Bangladesh batsman with the highest number of centuries.

A win always acts as a tonic, and if that win is a convincing one like yesterday's the impact is all the more telling. However, this series has shown that there is scope for improvement and the Tigers will need to be more consistent to repeat the result against England.

of Engineering and Technology (BUET), has invented the floating latrine system that since August is being trialled in Ghagatia. "For haor-dwellers, one of life's biggest challenges is sanitation," he says. "I was thinking how to solve the problem when I came upon the idea of developing floating latrines."

"As I considered the idea further, I realised that we had most required materials at hand," he continues. "In this area, we regularly take mobile court action against illegal stone and sand quarries. Those operations use dredgers locally known as Boma machines, pumps and oil barrels, and other supplies like bamboo and rope. We used to confiscate and destroy this equipment until I realised it could be recycled into floating latrines."

Talut who moved to Sussex University in UK to study sustainable energy policy, sketched a basic design using three to five empty fuel barrels, a basic sanitary pan and bamboo. He wanted a latrine that could operate year-round but was especially adapted to rainy season. "The barrels, which in quarry operations keep heavyweight pumps afloat in a river, offer good flotation. The middle barrel is designed with a gooseneck plastic pan and serves as

gooseneck pan, the 200-litre barrel is reduced in capacity to 160 litres, which can provide for a threemember family for up to fifteen days. "Then we use the seized pumps to transfer the waste to per-

manent safety tanks," he says.

waste storage."

Subsequently, 48 floating latrines have been installed in Ghagatia, in a pilot project implemented by the upazila and unionlevel administrations.

Naturally, the almost one hundred families that call Ghagatia home are thrilled. "The floating latrines can help us to live hygienically for the first time," says Makbul Miah. Speaking with locals, The Daily Star heard how most adults and children are using the new latrines, though some children still choose open spaces.

To encourage full utilisation, Talut plans to follow up with an awareness campaign, with the help of the union council, says Ranajit Chowdhury, Fatehpur Union's chairman.

The local assistant engineer of Public Health Engineering Department Md. Abul Kashem, is upbeat about the floating latrine's potential. "We have struggled to solve the sanitation problem over the years," he says, "Projects like the construction of 407 washroom blocks in the district's primary school have offered some success. But the floating latrine is a valuable initiative to combat the problem yet further, and we are considering rolling out the plan to other areas."

The deputy commissioner of Sunamganj Sheikh Rafiqul Islam is Talut notes that with the similarly supportive. "The floating latrine is a splendid innovation by a local administrator," he says, "We are hoping to submit the project to an innovation fund which can help us eradicate unhygienic sanitation in haor areas right across the district."

London's Tower Bridge closes until New Year

London's iconic Tower Bridge closed to vehicles for three months on Saturday for its first major maintenance works in nearly half a century. The 122-year-old drawbridge by

the Tower of London -- whose roadway leaves are lifted to allow tall ships on the River Thames to pass through -- carries 21,000 vehicles and some 40,000 people per day. "This heavy use has had an

effect on timber decking of the bridge, which was last refurbished in 1970," said a statement from the City of London Corporation, which owns the Victorian Gothic landmark.

"To ensure that the bridge continues to serve as a vital river crossing we need to undertake the essential maintenance works."

It will be closed to road traffic until December 30.

The bridge's leaves will continue to operate as normal for river traffic. It lifts on average 800 to 900 times a year, a major tourist attraction that can be viewed from a glass walkway above.

Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology.

A total of 155 tanneries have been allocated plots on 199.40 acres of land in Savar. Besides, the CETP has been set up on 17 acres. According to the expert, only 10 factories are now tanning leather at the industrial estate.

Speaking at the programme as the chief guest, Environment Minister Anwar Hossain Manju said he had the power to shut the tanneries in Hazaribagh as they pollute the environment.

"However, I've some limitations. I've been asked by the prime minister to go slow on the issue and not to shut the tanneries, he told the function.

The shifting of factories is a job of the industries ministry, the minister added.

He expressed frustration that he needs to consult foreign experts about different issues instead of local experts. About saving rivers, Manju said: "We all

have been fighting for saving the Buriganga, the Turag, the Balu and the Shitalakkhya, but many of us don't know how many other rivers are dying across the country. We should also look at those small rivers." He blasted bureaucracy for causing prob-

lems to people. For example, he said, the Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha has been "breaking the necks of people".

"One day the common people will start a

war against the bureaucracy," the minister

warned. Sanjay Kumar Talukdar, technical expert and consultant of Bangladesh Tanners Association, claimed not all the information provided by the CETP consultant was correct.

Both the CETP modules were not ready

for operation, he said, adding that the plant was not ready to treat the salt used in tanneries. Besides, the sludge power generation system was not fully functional yet. There were many errors in the layout design

of the CETP. The pipes used in the plant were not strong enough to withstand the load of effluent and water, Sanjay claimed. However, his claims were denied by CETP

consultant Delwar. Raisul Alam Mandal, director general of the

Department of Environment, said it was high time now that the tanners shifted to Savar as the process had already taken long time. "Please collect your [tanners] certificates

from the Department of Environment soon and start operations in Savar," Raisul called upon factory owners. Abul Kalam Azad, president of

Bangladesh Tannery Workers Association, urged the project authorities to build dormitories and hospitals for tannery workers inside the industrial estate. The discussion was moderated by Syeda
