



WIN #1 V KENYA, MAY 17 1998: Bangladesh's journey to a hundred wins began with a single step some 18 years ago in Hyderabad as the Tigers defeated Kenya by 6 wickets for their first ODI win.

WIN #3 V PAKISTAN, MAY 31 1999:

Akram Khan's 42 and Shahriar Hossain's 39 powered Bangladesh before Khaled Mahmud's 3 wickets led the Tigers to a their second World Cup win, after they had earlier

defeated Scotland in the same event. WIN #6 V INDIA, DEC 26, 2004: Aftab Ahmed hit 64 and Mashrafe Bin Mortaza made a late cameo for an unbeaten 31, before the latter claimed 2 wickets as the Tigers defeated India for the first time in their cricket history.

WIN #10 V AUSTRALIA, JUN 18, 2005: Bangladesh's first and only win against Australia was scripted by a Mohammad Ashraful masterclass. The batsman scored a ton and Habibul Bashar contributed 47. Aftab Ahmed brought Bangladesh level with a six and then sealed a historic five-wicket win.

WIN #34 V INDIA, MAR 17, 2007: In this match against India,

Bangladesh's new generation -consisting of Shakib Al Hasan, Tamim Iqbal and Mushfiqur Rahim -- showed what they were capable of as each of them notched half-centuries. The win also helped Bangladesh qualify for the second round of the World Cup for the

WIN #36 V SOUTH AFRICA, APRIL 7, 2007: Just two games after their win over India, the new generation faltered with the bat, but it was Mohammad Ashraful, who made 87, whose innings led to Bangladesh's first win against South Africa and, more importantly, showed that their qualification was no fluke.

WIN #61 V NEW ZEALAND, OCT 17, 2010:

It seemed that Bangladesh had finally turned a corner as they defeated the Kiwis by 3 runs to claim their first whitewash over a top team in a 5-0 series win.

WIN #88 V ENGLAND, MAR 9, 2015: The most recent and perhaps the most defining win was Bangladesh's win over England in the 2015 World Cup. Showing off the brand of cricket for which they have now become famous, Mashrafe's men, powered by Mahmudullah Riyad's ton

comeback for Jurgen Klopp's team and enabled the Reds to move within two points of Premier League leaders Manchester City, who face Tottenham on Sunday. Liverpool trailed to an early Leroy Fer

goal at the Liberty Stadium and looked second-best before Roberto Firmino took control to inspire his side's fourth successive league victory.

Brazil forward Firmino scored Liverpool's equaliser early in the second half and won the crucial penalty that Milner converted in the final minutes.

Struggling Swansea's fifth defeat in seven league games will increase the pressure on manager Francesco Guidolin, who has had to

deal with speculation he is set to lose his job. Ryan Giggs and Bob Bradley are among the names reported lined up as potential

replacements for Guidolin.

Klopp made one change to the side that thrashed Hull 5-1 at Anfield a week ago, with Dejan Lovren, a rejuvenated presence in the Liverpool defence this season, returned to the starting line-up in place of Ragnar Klavan.

There was a solitary change, too, in the Swansea team following their 3-1 defeat by Manchester City as striker Borja Baston starting a Premier League game for the first time in place of the injured Fernando Llorente.

Former Atletico Madrid forward Borja was in the thick of the action, but wasted an early chance to endear himself to the locals by heading over from Wayne Routledge's fine cross. Liverpool's defence was looking surpris-

ingly fragile despite Lovren's return to action and Fer made the most of the instability to put the home side ahead.

Borja atoned for his earlier lapse when he rose above Joel Matip at the far post to win Gylfi Sigurdsson's corner.

He nodded down into the goalmouth where Mike van der Hoorn nudged the ball towards the target before Fer applied the

Saintfiet starts camp with 12

With the ninth round of the Bangladesh Premier League concluding late last night, the national team's head coach Tom Saintfiet had only 12 players out of the 33-member squad to begin work with yesterday for the brief training camp ahead of the Asian Cup qualifying play-off second leg fixture against Bhutan.

Bangladesh require at least a scoring draw if not a win to advance to the next round of the qualification campaign after being held to a goalless stalemate by Bhutan in the first leg last month.

The second leg will be played in Thimphu on October 10 and so the Bangladesh team are set to leave on October 7.

The Belgian coach, who is desperate to see his side qualify, called back a few experienced players such as Mamunul Islam, Zahid Hasan Emily, Yeasin Khan and some fresh faces like Saad Ahmed to the squad. "The reason for calling some new players is to watch them for 2/3 positions as I want to keep as many options open as possible," the Belgian coach said after a light training session at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

"I will watch the players over the next few days and then decide about the final squad. Our only target is to qualify for the next round and we want to do it in any way, be it through a tie break, draw or win," Saintfiet concluded.
