Two JMB men jailed in N'ganj

A Narayanganj court yesterday sent two operatives of the banned militant outfit Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) to 20 years' imprisonment in a case filed with Bandar Police Station under the

Explosive Substances Act. They are Saiful Islam and Mahabub.

The court also fined each of them Tk 20,000, in default of which they will have to suffer six more months' rigorous imprisonment.

Additional District and Sessions Judge Kamrun Nahar of Special Tribunal Court-7 gave the verdict in the presence of the convicts.

On January 7, 2007, a Rapid Action Battalion team arrested Saiful in Tangail for his link with JMB. Gleaning information from him, the team arrested Mahabub after raiding Farazikanda village of Bandar area of Narayanganj the same day.

Abu Dhabi offers funds to Dhaka

The United Arab Emirates (UAE) has offered Bangladesh to take advantage of the Abu Dhabi Fund for climate change and renewable energy for introducing new technologies for solar and other forms of renewable energy to strengthen its green energy portfolio.

The offer came during a bilateral meeting between State Minister for Foreign Affairs M Shahriar Alam and the Head of the UAE delegation to the Asia Cooperation Dialogue (ACD) Summit, Cabinet Member and Minster of Climate Change and Environment of the UAE Dr Thani bin Ahmed Al-Zayudi in Bangkok.

The second Asia Cooperation Dialogue (ACD) Summit was held in Bangkok on October 9 and 10, said the foreign ministry of Bangladesh yesterday.

Bangladesh Ambassador to Thailand Saida Muna Tasneem was present during the bilateral meeting on Sunday.

Both ministers discussed a wide range of issues of mutua interest, including technical cooperation with the UAE in climate change and renewable and sustainable energy technologies, mutual support at international level and reopening of UAE's labour marker for Bangladeshis and the welfare SEE PAGE 4 COL 5

Girl dies as sawed-off tree falls on her

An eight-year-old girl was killed after a tree collapsed on her in the capital's Mirpur yesterday.

Tania Akter, 8, daughter o Alfu Mia from Kishoreganj had migrated to their Uttar Pirerbagh residence in Mirpur three months ago.

Some men were felling a mango tree in the neighbourhood around 1:30pm, and it abruptly tumbled on her, said local people.

Tania was rushed to the National Institute of Traumatology and Orthopaedic Rehabilitation (Nitor) and later shifted her to Dhaka Medical College Hospital where she died around 5:30pm, said police.

TWO YEARS PAST KALSHI BIHARI CAMP FIRE

Girl battling trauma, burn complications

Farzana Akter, who had survived a deadly blaze that killed eight of her family members in 2014, has been admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital with various ailments.

Quoting doctors, her relatives said she was suffering from kidney related problems and her body and hands which were burnt in the fire got swollen.

Zaheda Begum, wife of one of her maternal DMCH.

Zaheda said they had admitted her to a local hospital a few days earlier but shifted her to DMCH as her condition deteriorated.

Following the fire that engulfed their tin-roof single-room house at Kalshi, Farzana, now 18, was staying with the family of her maternal aunt

in Mohammadpur Bihari camp.

Nine people including eight members of her family were burnt dead as locals allegedly set several houses on fire at Kalshi Bihari camp in Mirpur after a series of clashes with Bihari people over firecracker explosions on June 14, 2014.

Another Bihari man died after being hit by bullets during the attack.

Farzana's father Yasin Ali was killed in a road accident in the capital's Mirpur in September that year. Along with other Bihari people, he had been demanding justice for what he said "an arson attack", killing almost all

her family members. Farzana herself had suffered 17 percent burns to her body, from which she later developed various complications. However, defying all this, she enrolled in class VII at


Dhaka Presidency High School in Mohammadpur early this year to continue her

"I want to be a teacher," she told The Daily Star yesterday.

Farzana now lives with the family of Aslam Khan, the husband of her mother's sister.
