A youth was hacked to death at Vorari in Savar, outside the capital, on Monday night for Tk 2,000 that he lent to his neigh-

bour. Khursheduzzaman Rubel, 27, son of Sadek Ali, was a taxi driver.

Victim's wife Farjana Begum claimed that Liton, a garment worker, owed Tk 2,000 to Khurshed and on that night Liton's landlord Aslam phoned her husband and called him over to

Liton's place. Aslam during primary interrogation admitted to police that he only called Khurshed but it was Liton who along with four associ-

ates killed him. Hearing a hue and cry, locals rushed Khurshed to Enam Medical College Hospital where he was declared dead. Liton is absconding.

Police sent the body for an autopsy. A murder case was filed.

Fake medicine factory busted in Khulna, two sent to jail

A Khulna court yesterday sent a former Awami League (AL) leader and his employee to jail for manufacturing and selling fake medicines under renowned manufacturers' labels.

Rapid Action Battalion arrested them in Jabusa area of Rupsha upazila in Khulna on Monday night.

Khandoker Rafiqul Islam, additional DIG and captain of Rab-6, said Kazi Shahnawaj, former president of AL Khulna city unit and also of Bangladesh Frozen Food Export Association, used to run the business in collaboration with many hospitals for getting orders of fake medicines.

The factory was being run in the guise of sea food processing factory with the name "Shahnawaj Sea Food". Rab recovered a huge amount of raw materials, including rice powder, and 2.5 lakh empty strips of Fluclox capsules having ACI Pharmaceuticals' name inscribed on it, four sacks SEE PAGE 4 COL 4

Milestone for Sino-Bangla ties

Says Chinese minister ahead of its president's visit to Dhaka Friday

Strategic cooperative partnership between Dhaka and Beijing is set to enter a "new level" during the upcoming visit of Chinese President Xi Jinping, who is scheduled to arrive on Friday for 22-hour visit.

It would be the first time a Chinese president is paying a state visit to Bangladesh in the past 30 years.

President Xi Jinping "Bangladesh is China's important partner in South Asia and the Indian Ocean region, and the visit would be a milestone for China-Bangladesh relationship," Kong Xuanyou, assistant foreign minister, said in Beijing.

According to draft programme schedule, the Chinese president will arrive at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport at 11:40am from Phnom Penh, the capital of Cambodia.

President Abdul Hamid will receive him at the airport. He will hold official talks with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at the Prime Minister's Office at 3:00pm which will be followed by signing of agreements. Ahead of Xi's arrival, an important Chinese delegation led by its commerce minister is expected to arrive in Dhaka

tomorrow to finalise the deals to be signed after the official talks on Friday. The Chinese president will meet Speaker Dr Shirin Sharmin Chaudhury. He will also meet his Bangladesh counterpart at Bangabhaban.

On Saturday morning, the Chinese president will depart for Goa after visiting the National Memorial.

A reliable source told The Daily Starthat the Chinese side agreed to give an opportunity to BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia to meet with the


Chinese president at his hotel suite on Saturday morning. During Xi's visit, China will sign a number of cooperative agreements with Bangladesh to implement the Beijing-proposed "Belt and Road Initiative", which focuses on improving infrastructure and boosting interconnection, Kong said.

So far, more than 70 countries and international organisations have actively participated in the "Belt and Road" construction. In Goa, Xi will meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi and other leaders, including heads of BIMSTEC (Bangladesh, Bhutan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Myanmar and Thailand) countries who have been invited to the Goa summit.

Justice for Khadiza now sought abroad

A section of students from North China University of Science and Technology raised their voices to demand justice for Sylhet college student Khadiza Begum Nargis who was brutally hacked by a Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) man.

Under the banner "Student Union: North China University of Science and Technology", the students, mostly Bangladeshis, formed a human chain on Monday on the university campus, where Khadiza's brother is a student.

Holding placards that read "We want justice", "Pray for Khadiza", "It is the time to prevent people like Badrul," the students urged people not to spread rumours about the victim.

The students emailed a statement to some media outlets including this newspaper and said when Khadiza was battling for life, rumours had been spread against her in the social media.

The 23-year-old college student is undergoing treatment at Neuro Intensive Care Unit of the capital's Square Hospital. On

October 3, she was hacked multiple times by Badrul Alam, a fourth-year student of economics at Shahjalal University of Science and Technology (Sust). Badrul is also the senior assistant secretary

inside MC College where she had gone to sit for an examination. BCL, however, says Badrul has nothing to do with it. Meanwhile, neurosurgeon AM Rezaus Sattar at Square Hospital, who carried out

of the Sust unit of BCL. He attacked Khadiza

surgeries on her, said her condition was improving slowly. He said they hope to withdraw her ventilation support within a few days.

The students in the statement said, when Badrul was hacking her [Khadiza], some people were watching the brutality from the distance.

"A whole college got defeated by the brutality of Badrul," said Faisal Mahmud in the statement on the students' behalf. "We know thousands of Badrul are around you and us and could swoop on your sister."

When Khadiza was battling for life, some people like Badrul were spreading rumours against her by uploading pictures of someone

During that period, Sona Mia, Shafiqul, a day labourer, informed Firingi and two other hearing-impaired man and woman worked at a hotel at Ghoradhap Hat, some 10km from Firingi then left with Sona Mia

where he used to call to know about her whereabouts, he said.

In April, Shafiqul went to Ghoradhap for bringing Firingi home for her vote in the UP elections and saw Sona Mia was living with another
