Protest in India too

"We are not against development but it should be shifted from the proposed site," said Ashok Chowdhury, a member of All India Union of Forest Working People.

Social activists from Bangladesh wanted to go to India and "we wanted to organise a big protest against the proposed power plant", he said, but getting visa was a problem.

Strong anti-India sentiment was seen among the participants of an anti-Rampal procession held in March in Bangladesh, Madhuresh said.

"Fundamentalist groups can exploit

The public sector companies in India and Bangladesh in the case of the Rampal plant have been "behaving in the manner in which the private sector companies do," Madhuresh said.

Asked about the BNP's stance on the issue, he said, "They are not openly supporting us or the project. But ultimately, they will use the issue to their political advantage." The "open letter" to Modi written by

in India and any damage to that will have devastating impacts on thousands of fishermen and forest dwellers depending on it, apart from harming the natural protection from calamities like tsunami and cyclones, they said in the letter, a copy of which was released at the press conference.

"We urge you [PM Modi] to look at the colossal damage this project will

cause to people and environment in India and Bangladesh and withdraw India's support to the project," reads the letter.

The letter condemns death threats to Prof Anu Muhammad and requested Modi to urge the Bangladesh government "to ensure the safety of political activists there."

During Kerry's visit, Raushan could only manage to give her visiting card to Kerry after a programme in the city where she attended as an audience.

JP insiders said apart from the party's designated leaders' hectic efforts, the government also usually proposed the visiting world leaders for holding meetings with the main opposition leader.

They added that like many of the party leaders, the international comreal opposition due to its "bizarre role' having its share in the cabinet and in the opposition.

JP has one minister and two state ministers in the cabinet. Besides, the party's chief Ershad is a special envoy to the prime minister.

Responding to a query, GM Quader, co-chairman of the JP, said, "Chinese president didn't sit with the Jatiya Party leaders as his country thinks our people lack confidence in our party."

This incident would drift the party "downwards", he said, adding that the refusal of Jinping to meet Raushan might put negative impact on the party.

Sources in the JP said after the formation of the present parliament through the January 5 national polls in 2014, boycotted by top political parties, most world leaders visiting Bangladesh did not hold meetings with Raushan.

Later, the foreign ministry reportedly requested foreign missions in Dhaka so that any visiting delegates or envoys meet Raushan, sources in the JP said.

Following the initiative of the foreign ministry, some visiting world leaders, including Indian PM Narendra Modi and US Assistant Secretary of State for South and Central Asian Affairs Nisha Desai Biswal, met Raushan.

But in recent times, some world leaders, including Kerry and Jinping, "refused" to meet Raushan, party sources said.

Following the inauguration of the scheme, media reported on making of fake lists of recipients, selling of rice allocated for the programme in the black market, nepotism in issuing cards and distribution of less than 30kg to families.

Admitting the irregularities, the minister said, "We have noticed all sorts of irregularities. We are taking action and more action will follow whenever we get any allegation. The programme is aimed at help-

ing ultra poor people, he said, adding that no discrimination based on political affiliation would be allowed in rice distribution.

So far, at least three people have been given jail sentences and six arrested. Dealerships of 44 people have also been scrapped, nine fined and 11 cases filed in connection with various irregularities in the chain of distributing rice.

Eight committees headed by food ministry officials were formed to monitor the programme and a letter was sent to the deputy commissioners to take action against illegal acts, the minister said.

He urged all elected representatives at all tiers, irrespective of political affiliation, not to make the programme controversial.

Quamrul also thanked the media to bring the irregularities to the fore and sought cooperation to make the programme a success.

scheme. Even Food Minister Qamrul Islam at a press briefing yesterday said various irregularities are taking place in the rice distribution programme.

"We want to keep the programme above all controversy. No irregularities by anyone will be tolerated no matter what his or her political affiliation is, he said.

On September 7, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina formally inaugurated "Food-Friendly Programme" at Chilmari upazila in Kurigram.

Under the programme, selected card holders at union level will get 30kg rice every month through ration dealers at Tk 10 per kg during the lean periods of September-November and March-April.

These months have been selected considering non-availability of work for day labourers. The ultra-poor families are supposed to be listed through the local public representatives.

The government's rice procurement price is now Tk 32 per kg and it is selling the Tk 10-per-kg rice from its stock in the public granaries. For every kg of rice sold under the scheme, the government gets Tk 8.50 while dealers have their profit margin of Tk 1.50.

The government is thus providing a subsidy of Tk 23.50 for each kg of rice for the scheme. Food officials told The Daily Star if

the unscrupulous dealers or others can manage to sell rice from the scheme in the open market, they pocket a hefty amount of Tk 23,500 per tonne.

"So, strong vigilance is a necessity here and the government has to ensure it," said an official.

DEAD ON THE LIST

The authorities in Bagha upazila of Rajshahi issued a card to Attab Ali, who died four years ago.

However, his family didn't purchase the rice. Attab's eldest son Ataur Rahman,

resident of Togorpara village in Monigram union, said his father was one of the few solvent men in the village, he and his three other brothers are well-established.

The office of the Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) yesterday identified 15 names of dead people who are on the list of 1,000 people in Monigram union.

The UNO office also found 27 names of solvent people and relatives of local Awami League leaders who were included in the list for Monigram and 107 similar names in Gorgori union.

"Those names were cancelled immediately," UNO Hamidul Islam told The Daily Star.

Abdul Gani, the dealer for large chunk of the rice in black mar-Monigram, said he got the list from the

Upazila Food Controller's Office and it was prepared in 2011.

Upazila Food Controller Almas-ud Doula said the union-level committee prepared the list and the UNO's office would scrutinise it.

In Thakurgaon, Khalilur Rahman, a resident of Shalikosha village in Roypur union of Sadar upazila, was listed for the rice scheme although he

died four years ago. His wife Feroza Begum said the card is now in possession of one Samad,

But many of them did not do that, alleged locals.

For example, Shariful Islam is the dealer at Borundi Bazar of Hatipara union while the supervising officer is Manikganj Sadar's agriculture extension officer, Najim Ur Rauf. But the official hardly went to the spot.

Contacted, Najim admitted this saying it was not possible for him to perform this additional duty since he is too busy with his official work.

Some other supervising officials said they have barely any role to play here as the ruling party men are involved in the programme.
