Today is the 143rd birthday of AK Fazlul Huq, known as Sher-e-Bangla (Tiger of Bengal).

Sher-e-Bangla Smriti Academy will place wreaths at great leader's grave in Dhaka this morning, said a press release.

A milad mahfil will also be held at his mazar.

In 1873, Huq was born in Satura of erstwhile Bakerganj.

He obtained his BL degree in 1897 from the University Law College.

Huq was elected to the Bengal Legislative Council and was appointed as the education minister under the diarchy scheme in 1924.

In 1943, he was elected prime minister of Bengal during the British rule.

From 1956 to 1958, he was governor of East Pakistan.

Huq died in 1962.

'BCL attacks' anti-Rampal exhibition

Hurts 5 Chhatra Front activists

Five Samajtantrik Chhatra Front activists were injured while their photo exhibition in Madanmohan College, Sylhet protesting the Rampal power plant project was vandalised yesterday around noon allegedly in an attack by Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activists.

The injured took treatment at Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital. The front's unit at the college staged a demonstration in front of Sylhet Central Shaheed Minar around 4:00pm protesting the attack. There is no BCL unit at the college.

Witnesses and the front unit's General Secretary Rubel Miah claimed to The Daily Star that a BCL leader, Rajesh Sarker, led the attack with some 15-20 BCL activists.

Refuting the allegation, Rajesh blamed a faction of the front of carrying out the attack.

Principal Prof Md Abul said he heard the exhibition had been attacked and that he would take punitive measures against the perpetrators.

GONDAMARA POWER PLANT CONSTRUCTION

Joint force at site

To oversee security, takes note of locals' complaints

A joint force has taken over the responsibility of ensuring security of a proposed coal-fired Gondamara power plant financed by China in Banskhali upazila of Chittagong yesterday.

The 1,320MW power plant which is being constructed in 600 acres of land is a Tk 20,000 crore project.

While addressing a gathering of 400 locals of Gondamara in the morning, Director of Naval Intelligence Commodore M Sohael said a contingent of joint force comprising Bangladesh Navy, Coast Guard, police, Rapid Action Battalion, Border Guard Bangladesh would soon be deployed in the project area for the plant's security.

"It is not a personal power plant. The Bangladesh government undertook the project for the people's interest and handed the responsibilities of its security over to the joint force. Latest equipment and technology will be used in the project keeping an eye on the people's safety and environment," said Sohael.

Describing what happened earlier centring its construction as unfortunate, he said the

locals would get proper compensation, and none would be spared.

On April 4, four people were shot dead in a clash between law enforcers and locals in the area during a rally protesting the power plant.

The navy official, however, mentioned that two complaint centres would be set up.

Everybody could submit their complaints to the centres, he said, adding, "After the construction of the plant, infrastructures in the area will rapidly improve."

Khadiza able to call family members

For the last few days, college girl Khadiza had been able to recognise and call her family members by their names, her father Mashuk Miah said yesterday.

"Sometimes she would recognise me or her uncle and call us by names in a faint voice. On occasions, she would just stare blankly at people," he told The Daily Star.

The 23-year-old has been undergoing treatment at Square Hospital. Her uncle Abdul Baset, quoting doctors, said she would often talk to herself at night.

A student of Sylhet Government Women's College, Khadiza Begum Nargis was brutally hacked by Badrul Alam, a Chhatra League leader of Shahjalal University of Science and Technology, with a machete on the campus of MC College on October 3. She went there to sit an examination.

Mashuk, an expatriate in Saudi Arabia, returned home three days later. Her brother Shahin Ahmed, who studies medicine in China, also arrived in Dhaka on the same day.

The victim's father said doctors were hoping to transfer Khadiza to a cabin within next couple of days.

She now can slightly move her left leg in response to pain and is able to take food by mouth. Previously, she was fed by a tube.

The attack on Khadiza left her in coma. As she started regaining consciousness, physicians noticed that she could not move her left limbs.

Doctors operated on her right hand on October 17 and said there were injuries on her left hand which needed surgeries, but they would wait till her overall condition improved further.

Following the attack, Badrul was caught and handed over to police by locals. He confessed to a Sylhet magistrate of trying to kill her after she refused to be in a relationship with him.



Young female house helps get abused most abroad

Says expat welfare ministry official

Young Bangladeshi female house helps became the main victims of physical and sexual abuse at their workplaces abroad, a senior government official said yesterday.

"We have observed that young female domestic workers became victims of sexual abuse abroad while the elderly ones were subjected to torture," said Javed Ahmed, additional secretary at the expatriates welfare

and overseas employment ministry.

He was addressing a seminar on "Ratification of ILO convention 189 for the Protection of Women Domestic Workers" as the chief guest.

WARBE Development Foundation and Bangladesh Civil Society Coordination Committee on Global Forum on Migration and Development-2016 jointly organised the programme at the Jatiya Press Club.

Mentioning that veteran left-leaning politician Ajoy Roy had worked throughout his life towards establishing secularism and getting rid of discrimination, speakers yesterday said he would truly be honoured when these will be ensured in the country.

"He always thought about the country's well-being. His vigor was indomitable and enthusiasm boundless," said Prof Emeritus Dr Anisuzzaman.

They were addressing a mourning rally commemorating him, organised by Sammilita Samajik Andolon (SSA) and a social platform against communalism and militancy at the capital's Liberation War Museum.

Ajoy, SSA president and a coordinator of the platform, died on October 17.

The museum's Trustee Dr Sarwar Ali, Khondkar Ibrahim Khaled, former deputy governor of Bangladesh Bank, Joyonti Roy, wife of Ajoy, and Shawkat Ali, former deputy speaker, also spoke at the event.
