

and individuals who have friends that tag them on weird posts. When you enable this feature, if anyone tags you it won't appear on your timeline. Instead you'll get an approval notification asking you whether you want it on your timeline or not. Note: this does not remove the tag itself. You can do that separately if you want to.

text will be sent to your phone with a code, enter that in and you'll get access. Now, unless you give your phone to other people too, only you'll be able to access your account, even if anyone manages to get your password.

To set up, first enter your phone number on your account. Then go to Settings>Security and turn it on.



To activate the feature, go to your activity log, you'll see the option for timeline review on the left hand side. Press the gear icon and enable it.

Saving: Wouldn't it be great if you could save those scandalous posts to share with your friends and gossip about them? Well, you can just bookmark the pages I guess. Okay, not as useful as the other ones but still pretty neat, you can save posts/links/videos on Facebook to view later. Facebook organises it neatly in different categories, so it's better than just bookmarking.
