

DEPARDIEU joins "Bach" cast

Gerard Depardieu has joined the cast of "Bach", an upcoming biopic on the 17th century classic composer Johann Sebastian Bach.



Max Von Sydow, Axel Milberg and Marianne Sagebrecht will co-star in the feature from "That Good Night" director Eric Styles.

The role of Bach in the film, which will chart the beer-fueled rebellion of one of the world's greatest composers, has not yet been cast.

Styles is directing from a script by Jeffrey Freedman who will also produces alongside S J Evans of Dark Art Films.

The \$21 million feature is set to being shooting next year for a late 2017 release.

SUMON YUSUF'S

"November in Paris" at AFD

The second solo photography exhibition by photographer Sumon Yusuf, titled "November in Paris", is now on at La Galerie, Alliance Française de Dhaka.

Sophie Aubert, Ambassador of France to Bangladesh inaugurated the exhibition as chief guest while Matiur Rahman, Editor, Prothom Alo and Abir Abdullah, photojournalist, European Press Photo Agency were present among other distinguished guests at the opening ceremony held on November 4.

Every artistic heart around the world yearns for Paris to imbibe the inspiration it exudes. For an artist residency programme, Sumon Yusuf was in Paris in November 2015. He was mesmerised by the city of love and started photographing the poetic humane side of Paris.

But on November 13, a series of heinous terrorist attacks left 130 innocents dead and over 368 injured. For Yusuf, a city brimming with love and warmth all of a sudden transformed into a place of blood, tears and sadness. In the face of such inhuman

cruelty, Yusuf's photographs became the context he could hold onto: he decided to capture life. Sumon Yusuf graduated in

English Literature and studied Visual Literacy at Asian Centre for Journalism of Ateneo de Manila University from Philippines. He also attended a one-year diploma programme on Photojournalism at South Asian Media Institute, Pathshala. His works have been exhibited in USA, Australia, Japan, Bangladesh and 9th Angkor Photo Festival in Siem Reap, Cambodia and in France.

Yusuf was awarded the first prize

in an International Photo Contest titled "Climate: State of Emergency" organised by Alliance Françiase Foundation in Paris. He is the recipient of numerous awards for his work including Top Prize of IREX Photo Contest in Washington DC, USA; 1st Prize in the "Creation" category of the 1st JP's Prize for Contemporary Photography Competition in Bangladesh; 3rd place of Anti Corruption Youth Photo Contest of Transparency International, Berlin, Germany; Winner of The 73rd International Photographic Salon of Japan, Asahi Simbun; Winner of CGAP Microfinance Photo Contest in USA and Winner of People & Planet Photo Contest in Australia. The exhibition is open from

Monday to Thursday from 3pm to 9pm and from Friday to Saturday from 9am to12 noon and 5pm to 8pm, till November 15.



Registration closes for Folk Fest

Names of foreign performers remain a surprise

Online Registration for the hotly-anticipated second edition of the Dhaka International Folk Fest, (scheduled November 10-12 at the Army Stadium) closed on Saturday, less than five days after opening. Like last year, the event, as announced on October 30, is free to all but a registration is required. Registration opened at 6pm on November 1, and closed shortly after 1pm on November 5, according to the Festival's official Facebook page. The page yesterday posted that their registration capacity was full in the short time, prompting them to close the registration.

Many people responded on the page saying they could not register, or did not get a confirmation. Registration numbers were limited for every day as well; according to the Facebook page, only a definite numbers of registration were allowed per day, and interested people were asked to try the next day if they could not register on their first try.

The organisers, however, did not disclose the number of registered participants, when contacted.

The massive interest in the festival among the general people can be attributed to last year's festival that saw some big names of folk music perform: Farida Parveen, Momtaz, Rob Fakir, Shafi Mondal and Kiron Chandra Roy from

Bangladesh, and Paban Das Baul, Parbathy Baul, Arko Mukherjee, Abida Parveen and Saieen Zahoor from abroad. Bangladeshi artistes performing this year will be Momtaz, Bari Siddiqui, Baul Shafi Mondal, Tuntun Baul, Abdur Rahman Baul, Latif Sarkar, Sunil Karmakar, Islam Uddin Kissakar, Shahnaz Beli, Labik Kamal Gourab, Taposh and Friends and Jalal (flute). However, organisers said they will announce the names of the foreign performers only on the days of the festival.

The Dhaka International Folk Fest is presented by Meril, in association with GP Music, powered by Dhaka Bank and supported by Microsoft. Sun Events is organising the event.

Indira Gandhi Cultural Centre (IGCC) organised an evening of Rabindra Sangeet by singer couple Salma Akbar and Sajed Akbar at Sufia Kamal Auditorium, Bangladesh National Museum (BNM), Dhaka on November 5.

The singers started off the programme with a duet song "Joy Tobo Ananda Bichitra". They performed 24 solo songs at the event. Salma Akbar's repertoire included "Kar Milon Chao Birohi", "Jogotey Anandajoggey", "Adhek Ghum-e Nayon Chum-e", "Anandadhara Bohichhey Bhuboney" and "Ogo Nodi Apon Begey". Sajed Akbar rendered 12 songs, including "Amar Shokol Rosh-er Dhara", "Amar Molin Lagi Tumi", "Oli Barbar Phirey

Jaye", "Tomar Gopon Kothati" and "Apni Obosh Holi". Salma Akbar studied at Chayyanaut and received her initial training in classical music from Ustad Narayan Chandra Basak and Ustad Azad Rahman. She trained in Rabindra Sangeet under legends such as late Karim Sharafi, Sanjida Khatun, Sadi Mohammad, Rezwana Chowdhury Bannya in Bangladesh and under Late Konika

Bandopadyay, Nilima Sen, Sanghamitra Gupta in India. Encouraged by his Freedom Fighter parents -- Syeda Sajeda Chowdhury and Gholam Akbar Chowdhury, Sajed received initial training in Hindustani Classical Vocal Music from Ustad Fazlul Hoque in 1969. Subsequently, he trained in Rabindra Sangeet under late Atikul Islam at the Bulbul Lalitkala Academy, Abdul Ahaad, Kalim

Sharafi, Ajit Roy and Sadi Mohammad. Salma Akbar and Sajed Akbar visited Kolkata, Shanti Niketan and Guwahati in 2013 for musical concerts under ICCR sponsorship. Their musical concerts were appreciated by music lovers of these three Indian cities.
