An eight-year-old boy was hacked to death by his drug addict maternal uncle over a trifling matter at Pashchim Koyra village in Madarganj upazila of the district yesterday.

The deceased is Mohammad Shahin, son of Al-Amin and Banu Begum of Phulbaria area under Sadar municipality. Shahin had been staying with his maternal grandparents since age of one.

Meanwhile, villagers caught the killer Mohammad Shahid, 25, son of Dulal Pramanik, from the spot.

Police quoted the arrestee as saying that Shahid locked in an altercation with his nephew over a trifling matter around 7:00am. At one stage, Shahin slapped Shahid on his face and left the house.

An hour later, after catching fish from a nearby pond Shahin returned to the house. Shahid swooped on the boy with a machete and hacked him indiscriminately, leaving him dead on the spot, said Officer-in-Charge (investigation) Rafiqul Islam of Madarganj Police Station. Being informed, police went to the spot, recovered the

body and sent it to Jamalpur General Hospital morgue for The deceased's mother Banu Begum filed a case

with the police station against her brother Shahid at noon, the OC added.

"The death of my mother has caused an irreparable loss to the whole family and still now we cannot get back to normal life," said Jharna's 12-year-old son Shuvodev Bhowmik.

"But it could be a consolation for us if my mother is honoured as a martyr," he said.

"I lost my mother in 1995 when I was a student of Class VII and my father Gourango Nath Bhowmik married her but she immediately became very close to me and washed away all

> my sorrows with her motherly affection," said a sobbing Basudev, now a teacher of Tejgaon Women's College in Dhaka. "My youngest son

Shuvodev is yet to take sound sleep since her killing. He often bursts into tears after a blank stare at the photograph of Jharna," said Gourango Nath.

Md Sultan Miah, local councillor of Kishoreganj municipality, said they have recently taken a resolution to name roads in memory of Jharna and two policemen who died in the attack.

Rain wreaks havoc on paddy

90,000 hectares of aman land ravaged in Barisal division

Heavy rainfall and wind influenced by the depression in the Bay has caused extensive damage to aman paddy fields in the coastal districts of Patuakhali, Barguna, Bhola and Jhalakathi.

Aman paddy on over 67,000 hectares of land in Patuakhali, Barguna and Bhola has been badly damaged while the total area of damaged aman field in all six districts of Barisal division is 90,000 hectares, reports our Patuakhali correspondent.

Local Met office recorded 108.6 mm rainfall from 6:00am on Friday to 12 noon yesterday.

The damaged paddy fields include 32,000 hectares out of a total 2.10 lakh and 340 hectares in Patuakhali, over 20,000 out of 1.83 lakh and 65

hectares in Bhola and 15,000 out of 99,850 hectares in Barguna, said sources of the Department of Agriculture Extension (DAE). This correspondent yesterday

found a good number of aman fields at Badarpur village under Patuakhali Sadar upazila lying under rain water. The farmers' losses will be considerable as high yield variety of aman

paddy had already ripened while local variety would ripen next month, said Md Nazrul Islam Matubbor, deputy director (DD) of DAE. A total of 90,000 hectares of aman

paddy field has been damaged in all six districts in Barisal division while 7,33,298 hectares of land were brought under aman cultivation in the division, said Tushar Kanti Somoddar, DD of Barisal DAE.

Leave of all the officials and employees under the DAE has been cancelled to deal with the situation due to the depression, he added. Our Jhalakathi Correspondent

"Aman paddy was planted on 22,000 hectares of land in four upazilas under the district of which 10 percent is likely to be damaged," said the DD.

Prof Rezaul was killed on the morning of April 23 when he was walking to catch a university bus at Shalbagan in the

He was a victim of the target killings orchestrated across the country by militants, said the police official.

That morning, Badhan first stabbed Rezaul from behind, and as he fell on the ground, others closed in on him and hacked him with machetes until his death, according to the confessional statement of Sakib, of Shibganj in Bogra.

Nazrul drove two of the killers on a motorcycle to the scene. He was later killed in a "gunfight" in Rajshahi city on July 2. Osman, of Joypurhat, was killed in another "gunfight" on June 7.

The killers of Rezaul used to meet at Govindaganj of Gaibandha.

Sakib went to Govindaganj on April 16 after Osman texted him to go there using an android app called "threema".

By a black coloured Discovery 135mm motorcycle, Sakib and Osman went to Rajshahi with three machetes and met Shariful, Nazrul, and Badhan who took the motorcycle and machetes and asked Sakib to stay at the house of Abdus Sattar and his son Ripon.

The decision of killing Prof Rezaul the next morning was

cancelled around 8:00pm on April 16. Six days later, Shariful asked Sakib to go to Rajshahi again

through a text message. Sakib reached the Bhadra intersection of Rajshahi city by the motorcycle around 6:30am the next day and handed the vehicle over to Nazrul.

Nazrul took along Shariful and Badhan on the motorcycle and told Sakib to go to Shalbagan by an auto-rickshaw.

At Shalbagan, Sakib saw Nazrul standing by the motorcycle while Shariful and Badhan was waiting at the road that goes to the house of Prof Rezaul. Soon Rezaul appeared. He was walking towards them

with a bag slung from his shoulder. Badhan and Shariful walked towards their target and

went past him.

Badhan then pulled out a machete tucked under his clothes and stabbed the professor from behind. The next blow came from his department student Shariful.

Nazrul at the time rebuked Sakib for standing idle. At this, Sakib took a machete from Nazrul and hacked the professor to confirm his death.

Nazrul collected the machetes and went away by the motorbike with Shariful and Badhan.

Sakib, Sattar, Ripon and another RU student Rahmatullah are now in jail.

Grabber's grip on Hajikhali canal

A section of a water body in Hajikhali bazar area under Patuakhali Sadar upazila of the district has allegedly been occupied by a local influential person.

The occupier erected a bamboo fence in the middle of Hajikhali canal on Thursday, claiming that it was his father's property, locals alleged.

They said a closure was built on the canal around 45 years ago to save agricultural land from saline water. Later on, the fisheries department leased out the canal to a local cooperative society named Hajikhali Jubo Unnayan Samobaya Samity after re-excavating the canal covering two acres of land.

The samobaya samity is still cultivating fishes on the canal by taking lease from the fisheries department, said Abu Daud Kazi, president of the samity.

Sultan Payada, a local influential person, went to the canal with his men on Thursday and started erecting a bamboo fence there, though the samity had been cultivating fish on the canal for about 15 years under the lease, he added.

Sultan paid no heed to the samity members when they asked him to stop.

Members of the samity showed a deed of the lease with signatures of three parties. The first

party was the deputy commissioner (DC), the second party was the district fisheries officer and the third party was the samity's president, Daud said. The five-year deed was signed on January 8

in 2013, and is valid till January 7 of 2018, sources said. Sultan built the bamboo fence claiming that it was his father's property, though the deed is still

valid, Daudsaid. "We will submit a complaint against the occupier to the authorities concerned, including the DC's office and the fisheries department, soon," he


Sultan said he had recently learned that it was his father's property, which is why he took the land.

He said he was not an occupier but the owner of the land.

District Fisheries Officer Md Iqbal Hossain said nobody informed them about the matter, adding that if the samity men submitted a complaint he would inform the land office.

Assistant Commissioner (AC land) for Patuakhali Sadar upazila Latifa Jannatee said they would take steps immediately against the occupier.

It is a khas land and nobody can claim it as their property, she added.
