Brazil host Argentina in 'Titanic' Belo Horizonte

 A resurgent Brazil return to the scene of the most humiliating defeat in their history on Thursday 2018 World Cup qualifier. Two years ago at Belo Horizonte's Estadio Mineirao, Brazil were ripped apart 7-1 by Germany in the World Cup semifinals, a traumatic mauling that sent the football-mad country into a nosedive of despair. But fast-forward to 2016, and Brazil look to be a team firmly on the road to recovery as they prepare for the 107th meeting with Argentina at the 61,800-seat venue.

October -- Brazil's fourth straight qualifying victory -- catapulted Tite's side to the top of Brazil's 10-team round-robin standings, with 21 points from 10 games. "I don't have the adjectives. I'm living the dream of any Brazilian coach," Tite said after naming his squad for this week's clash with Argentina. "I try not to think too much about the history. I'm just focused on the strategy."

A disastrous Copa America Centenario campaign -- which saw Brazil eliminated in the first round of the tournament for the first time since 1987 -- led to the dismissal of coach Dunga in June. Dunga's replacement, Tite, the successful former Corinthians coach, has overseen a renaissance which has left admirers talking about a return of the Selecao's fabled "jogo bonito" ("beautiful game"). Bangabandhu Gold Cup dropped?

 The Bangladesh footballers will be out of international action until the SAFF Championship takes place in December next year, thanks to Bangladesh Football Federation's (BFF) decision to drop the Bangabandhu Gold Cup from its calendar for the next four years. Failing to move into the final phase of Asian Cup Qualifiers means Bangladesh will get no FIFA or AFC sanctioned matches for nearly two and a half years until the qualifying rounds of the 2022 Qatar World Cup and the 2023 Asian Cup starts in 2019. Bangladesh's lone opportunity to play international matches will be in invitation tournaments play FIFA friendly matches, while there is no mention in the draft master about the Bangabandhu Gold Cup, which was in 2015 and 2016. "We have neither dropped it [Bangabandhu Gold Cup] nor included it in the calendar. We are working on which slot can the tournament be accommodated in the calendar," BFF general secretary Abu Nayeem Shohag said.

BFF calendar fails to draw roadmap for grassroots

After the national team's debacle in Bhutan, the country's football fraternity has been immersed in discussions about the palpable state of grassroots football and youth development, which the Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) has ignored over the years. The lack of programmes at the grassroots level and the uninspiring attitude towards youth development has been underscored by the fact that the national team is still made up of those veterans that have been present for over 10 years, with no talented youths making their way into the side. After the Bhutan debacle that dawned on sitting BFF president Kazi Salahuddin, who admitted the shortcomings and said that grassroots and youth development would be addressed in their recently-approved four-year master plan. The person who was charged with scrutinising that four-year plan, FIFA's senior development manager Mike Pfister, also emphasised that the ignorance in those areas would put the future of Bangladesh football in danger. However, the master plan -- which has been developed over the past three months -- still leaves a lot to be desired as it needs to properly synchronize its programmes in order to make them more effective. While the master plan is supposed to breathe new life into those areas, it includes very little which is new. Instead it is the older programmes in the existing structure which have been overlooked in recent years that have been revived. This includes the National School Championship, Sher-e-Bangla National Championship (district teams), Suhrawardi Cup (U-19 teams), Champions Club Cup (district club champions), the District Football League and a proposed U-14 football festival.

that clashes with the Dhaka-based Premier Football League in which most under-16 players participate.

Apart from the Suhrawardi Cup, where 64 district U-19 teams participate, there is one other tournament in the calendar year where youth teams get a chance. That is during the U-14 tournament where the Premier League clubs participate. However, the Suhrawardi Cup has been scheduled for only 13 days, which raises the question of just how serious the BFF is about the tournament involving the youth.

The BFF calendar also includes training programme for national U-14, U-16 and U-19 teams ahead of the SAFF and AFC tournaments, but there are no tournaments for the U-14 or U-16 teams, which are believed to be the pipeline for the U-19 squad. There are further concerns as the game's governing body also dropped the boys' U-15 tournament which was held last year, although Sallor promised to continue their sponsorship.

While the education board is running the Bangabandhu Gold Cup involving 60,000 primary schools across the country each year, it is believed that these students need another platform and an U-14 tournament either across the country or district-wise or upazila-wise tournaments to find a place in their high school team during the National School Championship.

The continuity of those programmes has also not been addressed in the calendar yet, although it has been learned that some regional and divisional training centres would be set up to offer training to primary school teachers and game teachers as well as U-12 and U-14 boys and girls sometime each year. Interestingly when BFF vice-president and development committee chairman Badal Roy was asked whether he was aware of the grassroots and youth programmes, he refused to comment on the issue, saying that he was not fully aware of the details of these programmes, which are being prepared by the BFF technical staff.

BFF general secretary Abu Nayeem Shohag meanwhile said that the finer details of the calendar, such as the timings of the events, were being ironed out.
