Top brass find it hard to tackle

Corruption in recruitment, political links seen as reasons for recklessness

The suspension of four policemen of Darus Salam Police Station in October over alleged extortion was no one-off.

Since December last year, over a dozen such cases in the DMP area have put the police image in the dock.

Take the example of Shamsuzzoha Farhad and his wife. The couple were totally shocked when two police officers appeared at their door in the city's Rupnagar and demanded a hefty sum if they wanted to avoid landing in jail.

"There are numerous allegations against you. Give us Tk 5 lakh or else you and your family members will be taken to the police station and then to court in five cases," the policemen threatened Farhad, as the couple sat in their apartment on December 8 last year.

Frightened, Farhad allegedly gave Sub-Inspector Firoz Wahid and Assistant Sub-Inspector Mizan Tk 2.85 lakh.

Later, he lodged a complaint with the deputy commissioner of Mirpur division against the two cops and took shelter in a relative's house to avoid harassment. In fear of retribution, however, he withdrew the complaint within a few days, he said.

This incident was not reported in the media, but about a dozen cases of police brutality and bribery that came to light since then have left a deep scar on the image of the force (see chart).

BLOGGER KILLING

Key cyber watch cell militant held

Police say hit list was prepared based on his team's reports

Detectives say they held a militant whose job was to monitor online activities of free-thinking bloggers and secular activists, identify possible targets and report to the military wing commander of Ansar al-Islam.

Khairul Islam alias Jamil alias Rifat alias Fahim alias Jisan, 24, also a key Khairul Islam suspect in the killing of blogger Niladri Chattopadhyay Niloy and publisher Faisal Arefin Dipan, was arrested near Kamalapur Railway Station on Friday night.

He admitted monitoring activities of Niladri and Dipan and passing on the intelligence to sacked army major Syed Ziaul Haque, the military wing commander of the militant outfit. Known in the militant circle as Boro Bhai (big brother),

Zia played a vital role in every targeted killing linked to Ansar al-Islam, said Abdul Baten, joint commissioner of Detective Branch of police. Khairul, who was recruited in 2014 for his expertise in

information technology, admitted meeting Zia for the last time on September 26 this year in some place on the outskirts of Dhaka.

He told investigators that he had four to five men as teammates, and all of them were tasked with monitoring online activities of persons the outfit considered "anti-Islam".
