Then things started to fall in place as both players picked up their game, but Rishabh seemed to have shaken off the early anxiety more so than his opponent. An Rishabh admitted that people exquisite crosscourt got the sparse crowd, Rishabh's father among them, on their feet as the Indian closed the set 6-4.

> The second set had a slightly different pattern, with the Indian



breaking early only to allow Park back into the game, taking the set to a tie-break. However, some powerful serves and hard-earned rallies saw Rishabh ace the tie-break, culminating into a ferocious chest thump, once again reminding everyone of the 29-year-old Serb.

"It's not as if I follow him [Djokovic] consciously, but since he is my idol and I like his style of play, I guess things look similar," Rishabh admitted gleefully.

While 12-time Grand Slam winner Djokovic comes from a sporting family, with tennis being very much in the blood, Rishabh's foray into tennis happened only by chance. In fact, the Indian preferred skating in school when one day a teacher suggested that he should try tennis as he had excellent footwork. That suggestion proved to be the best advice of his life as the youngster instantly made an impression in tennis before going on to impress his peers and Indian tennis authorities with numerous wins at home, following up with the singles and doubles titles of the Asian U-14 Tournament in Chandigarh three years ago.

Having come to Dhaka as the fourth seed, Rishabh didn't quite expect to win the title in his first overseas appearance, but he says that this victory might be the push he needed to make his dream come true. "I want to play like him [Djokovic] and improve day by day so that one day people will call me the next Djokovic."

England sweep Scots away 'Pogba's game not about the goals'

England shrugged aside the potential ramifications of sanctions over poppy emblems Friday with a 3-0 Wembley win over Scotland to bring a 2018 World Cup berth a step closer.

A trio of headers from Liverpool pair Daniel Sturridge and Adam Lallana and Chelsea's Gary Cahill saw interim coach Gareth Southgate's side cruise home, the win consolidating England's leadership of Group F as they made it 10 points from four games. For Southgate, who replaced news-

paper sting victim Sam Allardyce following an opening away success in Slovakia, the three points were a welcome boost after a nervous draw in their previous outing in Slovenia. Slovenia stayed in touch just two

points behind the leaders after edging Malta 1-0 away while Slovakia are two points further back after whipping 2-1 win over Sweden. Lithuania 4-0. The Scots meanwhile now trail

England by six points, their hopes of snatching a place in the finals in Russia seemingly at an end as coach Gordon Strachan hangs on to his job by his fingernails.

While England and Scotland defied FIFA's opposition to symbols which might be seen as political by wearing armbands featuring poppies to mark Armistice Day, emotions ran high in Paris as France hosted Sweden a year on from terror attacks in the French capital. A capacity crowd of 80,000 at the

Stade de France held a minute's silence to mark Sunday's first anniversary of the attacks which left 130 people dead prior to the hosts' come-from-behind

On the night of the coordinated attacks across Paris, France were playing Germany at the same stadium in a friendly when three suicide bombers blew themselves up immediately outside the ground, killing one man.

French president Francois Hollande attended the Sweden game, as he had the Germany match, Friday's encounter held on a public holiday marking the day that saw the guns fall silent at the end of World War I in 1918.



Pogba's game after the Manchester United star found the net again in his country's 2-1 win over Sweden on Friday.

The world's most expensive player headed in France's equaliser before Dimitri Payet got the winning goal in the World Cup qualifier at the Stade de France on Friday.

It was Pogba's eighth goal for his country and followed his winner

in the 1-0 victory away to the Netherlands last month. The 23-year-old also

scored a superb volley in United's 3-1 win at Swansea City in the English Premier League last weekend but Deschamps said: "He is not a goal-scorer. He can score goals and has done so but I don't especially expect him to do that.

Firework hits Lewandowski

Poland striker Robert Lewandowski was felled by a firework thrown from the crowd in a stormy World Cup clash on Friday but he had the last laugh, scoring twice in a 3-0 win over Romania.

Romanian fans threw the firework at the Bayern Munich star in the 53rd minute.

He needed medical treatment while referee Damir Skomina gathered the players from both sides inside the penalty area.

After play was briefly delayed, Lewandowski recovered to hit two late goals after 84 minutes and a last-gasp penalty.

On the terraces, fans from both countries launched flares at one another. Some thrown by home fans landed on the pitch, causing a delay just before the half-time mark.

Twelve Polish fans had already been arrested before the game after fighting in a city centre bar and clashes with police outside the stadium.

Around 4,000 police were mobilised for the high-risk game.

Mexico win a thriller

Skipper Rafael Marquez scored an 89th minute winner as Mexico stunned the United States 2-1 in a thrilling World Cup qualifying duel between the arch-rivals here Friday.

Marquez, 37, headed home a Miguel Layun corner in the dying minutes of a pulsating battle which saw an ugly scuffle deep into injury time.

Marquez's goal came after the US had clawed their way back into the contest with a Bobby Wood equaliser on 49 minutes after Layun's 20th-minute goal put Mexico 1-0 up. Jurgen Klinsmann's side had looked the likeliest to take

all three points but instead it was Marquez who struck to snatch Mexico's first ever qualifying win over the United States at their Columbus stronghold. The result gives Mexico the early initiative in the

CONCACAF region's six-team final round of qualifying for the 2018 World Cup in Russia. The United States now face a testing trip to Costa Rica on

Tuesday needing to pick themselves up after a shattering loss. Mexico had the better of a frenetic first half, rattling US nerves after only 10 minutes when Jesus Corona cut in from the left and saw his shot tipped against the woodwork after a diving save from Tim Howard. At the other end, the US threatened sporadically but were

unable to find the breakthrough, with Jozy Altidore's 20th minute header easily gathered by Mexico goalkeeper Alfredo Talavera. Moments later Mexico took the lead. Again it was an

attack that began down the left flank, Layun pouncing on a loose ball near the edge of the area and driving a low shot which took a slight deflection as it flew past Howard.

The US were rocking and Mexico almost doubled their tally five minutes later when Corona's cross was met with a glancing header from Carlos Vela which crashed back off the crossbar.
