

Donald Trump's key picks draw mixed reaction

Donald Trump named two top advisers to his administration Sunday, tapping Republican Party Chairman Reince Priebus to be his new chief of staff and Steve Bannon, the Trump campaign CEO and

executive chairman of Breitbart News, as chief strategist and

"Steve and Reince are highly qualified leaders who worked well together on our campaign and led us to a historic victory. Now I will have them both with me in the White House as we work to make America great again," Trump said in the release.

It's an unusual arrangement that could create two power centres in the new White House, one around the Republican establishment and one connected to the far right and more controversial wing of conservatism. The campaign statement, which listed Bannon's role first, referred to the two men as "equal partners."

Navy gets two submarines from China

Bangladesh Navy has added two submarines to its fleet for the first time in its history with a view to further intensifying monitoring in the Bay and enhancing the force's combat capability.

"With the inclusion of the submarines, Bangladesh Navy has started its journey as a three dimensional force," Chief of Naval Staff Admiral Mohammad Nizamuddin Ahmed said at the submarines' handover ceremony at Liaonan shipyard Dalian state, China.

Rear Admiral Liu Zizhu on behalf of the Chinese government handed over the submarines to Admiral Ahmed in presence of senior naval officials of both sides. PHOTO ON PAGE 3

President to hold dialogue with all

Hopes AL leader Razzak

Ruling Awami League presidium member Abdur Razzak hopes that President Abdul Hamid will hold dialogue with all stakeholders, including civil societies, to seek their opinion about the reconstitution of the Election Commission.

"We urge all to have faith in him [president]. I firmly believe he will take steps in the light of the constitution so that everybody has confidence in the next Election Commission," Razzak said at a roundtable at the capital's Cirdap auditorium yesterday.

Contacted, BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir told The Daily Star that party chief Khaleda Zia would come up with a specific proposal for the reconstitution of the EC at a press conference at a city hotel on Friday.

Accused of Risha murder charged

Police yesterday pressed charges against Obaidul Khan, lone accused in a case filed for killing Suraiya Akter Risha, a student of Willes Little Flower School in the capital.

Ali Hossain, inspector of Ramna Police Station, who investigated the case, submitted the charge sheet to the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court of Dhaka.

In the charge sheet, he said the investigation found proof of the murder charge brought against Obaidul and so he should be brought under trial.

Twenty-six people were shown as prosecution witnesses in the charge sheet. The court set November 27 to decide whether to accept the charge or not. Risha, a student of class-

VIII, was stabbed near the school at Kakrail on August 24. She succumbed to her injuries at Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

Obaidul, who used to work at a tailoring shop in the city, hails from Miradangi village in Birganj upazila of Dinajpur. He was arrested in Domar upazila of Nilphamari district with the help of locals a week after Risha was stabbed.
