

Stalkers roam free after maiming man

HC orders police to arrest the accused, submit report by Nov 27

Stalkers, who beat up a father of two daughters severely leading to amputation of both of his legs, often show up at the Jhenidah home of the girls at night and threaten to burn younger girl's face with acid if the cases filed against them were not withdrawn, alleged the girl.

This went on while police kept claiming that they were yet to find the stalkers. In this situation, the High Court yesterday directed Jhenidah police to arrest the accused in two cases filed in connection with stalking two girls and injuring their father, Shahanur Alam, 52.

It also asked Jhenidah superintendent of police and the officer-in-charge of Kaliganj Police Station to submit a report about the arrest before the court by November 27.

The HC bench of Justice Quazi Reza-Ul Hoque and Justice Mohammad Ullah passed the order in a suo moto move after a report was published by Bangla daily Prothom Alo yesterday under the headline -- Dui pa gechhe, ekhon bhitechhara howar bhoy (two legs have gone, now in fear of being evicted from home).

"They come [to our home] at night and tell me to ask my parents to withdraw the case filed against them or else suffer acid burns on my face," the terrified girl, a student of class-VII, told our Jhenidah correspondent yesterday.

The girl, frightened by the threat, have stopped going to school while her older brother left home in fear.

ASHULIA FACTORY FIRE

26 female workers suffer burns

At least 26 female workers sustained burn injuries, many of them critically, after a fire broke out at a gas lighter factory in Ashulia, on the outskirts of Dhaka yesterday.

"The fire broke out at Colour Match BD Ltd in the Girabo area around 4:25pm," Abdul Hamid, senior station officer of DEPZ fire station, told The Daily Star.

However, he could not confirm how the fire originated. On information, fire fighters with nine fire trucks from different fire stations doused the blaze after two hours of frantic effort, a correspondent from Savar reported, quoting Hamid.

Twenty one of the injured women, aged between 15 and 40, were admitted to Burn Unit of Dhaka Medical College Hospital, Bachchu Mia, sub-inspector of DMCH police SEE PAGE 10 COL 1

The head teacher of a high school is in a critical state after he was assaulted allegedly by a local union parishad member and his goons yesterday in Boraigram upazila.

Mizanur Rahman, 50, head teacher of Panchbaria High School at Nagar union, was on way to the school on an auto rickshaw when the incident took place. UP member Bachchu

Pramanik along with his cohorts waylaid the head teacher around 11:30am, said Jahangir Alam, driver of the auto rickshaw. They dragged him out of

the vehicle, clubbed him violently with sticks until he fell unconscious,
