MEET ON DIST COUNCIL POLLS

AL should support honest aspirants

Urge Governance Advocacy Forum, Manusher Jonno Foundation STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The ruling Awami League (AL) should support efficient and honest chairman aspirants in the upcoming District Council elections to make the local government body more effective and dynamic, said rights activists and election experts yesterday.

As BNP and Jatiya Party have already announced to stay away, the polls have gone under the absolute control of AL So, the party should back such candidates, who have both political and administrative leadership qualities to coordinate overall development activities, they said.

They were speaking at a views-exchange meeting titled "District Council Elections and Relevant Issues", organised by the Governance Advocacy Forum (GAF) with support from Manusher Jonno Foundation (MJF) in the capital's Cirdap auditorium.

The first-ever District Council elections will be held on December 28 in 61 districts.

Presenting a keynote paper, eminent local government expert Dr Tofail Ahmed said a District Council has to interact with 43 government bodies in discharging duties. Besides, the chairman has to coordinate with ministers, MPs, civil administration and other stakeholders, he said.

So, the chairman should have the leadership quality to maintain and meet all the duties and responsibilities properly, Tofail said.

Properties and lands of many District Councils are now illegally occupied by vested quarters. So, it will be one of the major challenges for the future chairmen to recover those properties, he said.

Stay alert to threats

PM asks army while addressing the force's event at Jalalabad Cantonment

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday asked Bangladesh Army to always remain ready to face any threat both from internal or external sources to protect the sacred constitution and sovereignty of the motherland.

The premier was addressing the flagraising ceremony of nine units, including the newly-established headquarters of 11 Infantry Brigade, under 17 Infantry Division of the Bangladesh Army at Jalalabad Cantonment.

She raised the flags of the nine units under the 17 Infantry Division.

Hasina expressed her firm belief that each and every member of this newly formed brigade and units will work shoulder to shoulder to boost the strength of this division imbued with patriotism. "Considering the overall security of the

country, formation of a special force at brigade level is under the active consideration of the government," she said. Hasina termed Bangladesh Army the

asset of the country as well as a symbol of confidence and trust of people. She asked the army personnel to perform their duties sincerely keeping the confi-

dence in higher leadership, mutual trust, empathy, brotherhood, dutifulness, responsibility and above all maintaining discipline. The prime minister said in the current

Bangladesh Army has been upgraded in an unprecedented manner.

She said state of the art modern tanks, cannons, missile systems, anti-tank missiles as well as fighter planes and helicopters in army aviation have added new dimension to the army.

Besides, Hasina said, huge changes have been brought in the organisational structure of the army. A composite brigade has been formed for the construction of related infrastructure of the Padma bridge and its security, she added. Hasina mentioned that work has started

to constitute a riverine brigade in Mithamoin and said the government has given approval in principle to formation of an infantry division at Lebukhali Cantonment near the Payra river between Barisal and Patuakhali districts. She said the government has constructed

Male domestic help found dead

A male domestic help was found dead at the Bailey Road residence of the state minister for youth and sports in the capital yesterday morning.

Milon Tikadar's body, hanging from a ceiling fan, was first seen by another domestic help who shared a room with him, said Ramna Police Station Officer-in-Charge (OC) Moshiur Rahman.

The OC said the body had been brought down by the time police arrived around 7:00am to send it to the Dhaka Medical College morgue for an autopsy.

The 20-year-old's father Bijon Tikadar is a rickshaw-van puller in Poragachi village of Magura, said Sagor Saikat, a resident of the village who later took the body to Magura.

The state minister could not be reached for comment despite repeated attempts.

Bijon told a correspondent that Milon had been taken to doctors in the past for suicidal tendencies.

He said his son was a sentimental man who loved to cross-dress and had been working at the state minister's house for three years.
