Ctg Abahani back to winning ways

Chittagong Abahani returned to winning ways in the JB Bangladesh Premier League with a 2-0 win over newcomers Uttar Baridhara Club at the MA Aziz Stadium in Chittagong yesterday.

Leonel Saint Preux put Chittagong Abahani ahead early in the match and Chencho Gyeltshen ensured victory in the dying moments to bring the port city outfit back to winning ways after having played a goalless draw against Sheikh Russel KC and having suffered a 1-0 defeat to Sheikh Jamal DC in their previous two matches.

The ninth win helped the Independence Cup champions close the gap with leaders Abahani, who are four points ahead with 35 points having played a match less than their Chittagong namesake's 16.

With 11 defeats in 16 matches, Uttar Baridhara remained second from bottom with 13 points.

Saint Preux opened the scoring in the 10th minute by placing home from close range after a poor clearance from Uttar Baridhara goalkeeper Razib came his way.

The Haitian striker could have in fact

grabbed two more, but luck was not on his side as he rattled the crosspiece twice after the resumption before Chencho, the Bhutanese forward, struck his first goal of the league in the 87th minute by dinking the ball over the goalkeeper.

Meanwhile, Mohammedan SC continued their miserable run with a 2-0 defeat, their sixth overall in the league, against Muktijoddha Sangsad in the first match of the day.

The defeat kept Mohammedan in 10th position with 14 points while Muktijoddha stayed fifth with 23 points.

However, it was Mohammedan who dominated the game and created a lot of scoring chances but Muktijoddha Sangsad had the last laugh as they availed two scoring chances either side of the break.

It seemed the match was played between the Mohammedan forwards and Muktijoddha Sangsad goalkeeper Mamun Khan, who stood tall to foil numerous attempts from Ismail Bangoura, Mashuk Miah Jonny, Shahedul Alam, Aminur Rahman Sajib and Shuvo.

Shohel Rana gave Muktijoddha Sangsad a fourth-minute lead with a 30-yard free-kick while substitute Shafiqul Islam Bipul sealed the fate of the match deep into stoppage time of the second half.

BCCI threatens Champions Trophy pullout

The Indian Cricket Board's relations with the ICC, headed by Shashank Manohar, hit a new low after Indian women's cricket team was docked six points for not playing bilateral series with Pakistan between August 1 to October 31 as per agreement.

There are possibilities that men's team might not play Champions Trophy in protest against the women cricketers being made "soft targets" in the name of rules and regulations.

BCCI has lodged a protest with the global body. "ICC is well aware that in prevailing situation where Indian soldiers are being martyred, the sentiment is dead against playing Pakistan. The chairman is well aware that we need government permission," a furious senior BCCI official told PTI yesterday.

"This is a move with ulterior motive trying to play into the hands of Pakistan. If ICC does not backtrack, the men's team in solidarity with our women's team won't play in Champions Trophy," he added.

SL clinch one-run thriller

West Indian batsman Evin Lewis hit his maiden one-day international hundred but his efforts went in vain as Sri Lanka held their nerve to secure a one-run victory at Queens Sports Club on Wednesday and advance to the triangular series final.

Playing just his fourth ODI, Lewis struck a superb 148 but a series of run-outs ultimately hurt the West Indies as they finished on 329 for nine in response to Sri Lanka's 330 for seven.

Sri Lanka's total was set up by Niroshan Dickwella and Kusal Mendis, who both scored 94 after the West Indies had won the toss and opted to bowl first.

The victory ensured Sri Lanka's passage to Sunday's final, while the West Indies must avoid defeat in their final group game against hosts Zimbabwe on Friday if they are to progress.

Leicester in last 16

Leicester City kept their Champions League dreams aflame Tuesday, cruising into the last 16 with a 2-1 win over Belgium's Club Brugge, where they were joined by Real Madrid -- but not a crestfallen Tottenham.

Joining the hopeful debutants and the holders on the night were Juventus, Bayer Leverkusen and Monaco.

They join last year's runners-up Atletico Madrid, Arsenal, Paris Saint-Germain, Bayern Munich and Borussia Dortmund, who had already booked their tickets to the knockout phase with two group games to spare.

Leicester's success saw the Foxes advance as Group C winners in their maiden season

in the event, giving a major fillip to Claudio Ranieri's side, who are just two points above the domestic drop zone.

Shinji Okazaki netted after just five minutes and a Riyad Mahrez penalty made it 2-0 before Jose Izquierdo notched a second-half consolation for Brugge.

As Leicester celebrated, Tottenham in contrast saw their adventure in Europe's top club competition come to a grinding halt after a 2-1 loss at Monaco, who won Group E in the process.

In the same group Bayer Leverkusen drew 1-1 at CSKA Moscow to take the Germans into the knockout stages following Spurs' loss.

Kevin Volland put Leverkusen ahead after 16 minutes before Israeli international Bibras Natcho levelled.

Holders and 11-times winners Real Madrid joined 1997 champions Borussia Dortmund in qualifying from Group F after a 2-1 win at star man Cristiano Ronaldo's former club Sporting Lisbon.

Raphael Varane gave the 'meringues' the lead before Adrien Silva netted a spot-kick for the Portuguese only for substitute Karim Benzema to pop up with the winner for Real.

The Spaniards suffered a huge injury scare, however, just 11 days before facing Barcelona in La Liga as Welsh star Gareth Bale exited with an ankle injury shortly after half-time.

Two-times champions Juventus are through after defeating previous Group H leaders Sevilla, Europa League champions for the past three seasons, 3-1 in Spain.

Claudio Marchisio with a penalty, Leonardo Bonucci and Mario Mandzukic scored for the 'Old Lady' of Turin after Nicolas Pareja had put Sevilla ahead early on.

Record goal haul in Dortmund's win

Germany winger Marco Reus claimed a hatrick on his comeback as Borussia Dortmund hammered Legia Warsaw 8-4 on Tuesday in a record Champions League result which yielded seven first-half goals.

It was the first time a Champions League game has had a 5-2 half-time scoreline since Monaco ended up beating Deportivo de La Coruna 8-3 in November 2003.

The 12-goal haul in Dortmund bettered the record set in the Monaco-Deportivo game of 11 goals for a Champions League game.

With Dortmund already through to the last 16, the huge win keeps them top of Group F, two points clear of Real Madrid.

Dortmund's Shinji Kagawa and Legia's Aleksandar Prijovic both finished with two goals each thanks to some poor defending by both teams.

Reus, who captained Dortmund, made his return after 185 days out with an adductor injury which ruled him out of June's European championships.

It was his first match since Dortmund lost the German Cup final to Bayern Munich on penalties in Berlin on May 21.

Tuchel made nine changes to his starting line up after admitting his side looked tired mentally and physically from Saturday's 1-0 win over Bayern Munich.

Only defenders Marc Bartra and Matthias Ginter kept their places in Dortmund's starting line-up.

The match got off to an explosive start. Legia took an early lead when Prijovic was given too much space in the area to chip his shot home and stun the Dortmund crowd on 10 minutes.

But Borussia roared back with five goals in 16 minutes.

Their first three goals came in 198 seconds when Kagawa headed home on 17 minutes, then slotted a second just a minute later.

To compound Warsaw's problems a

The Polish champions became the first side to score four goals in a Champions League match and lose.

It is the first time in Champions League history that eight players scored in a single match.

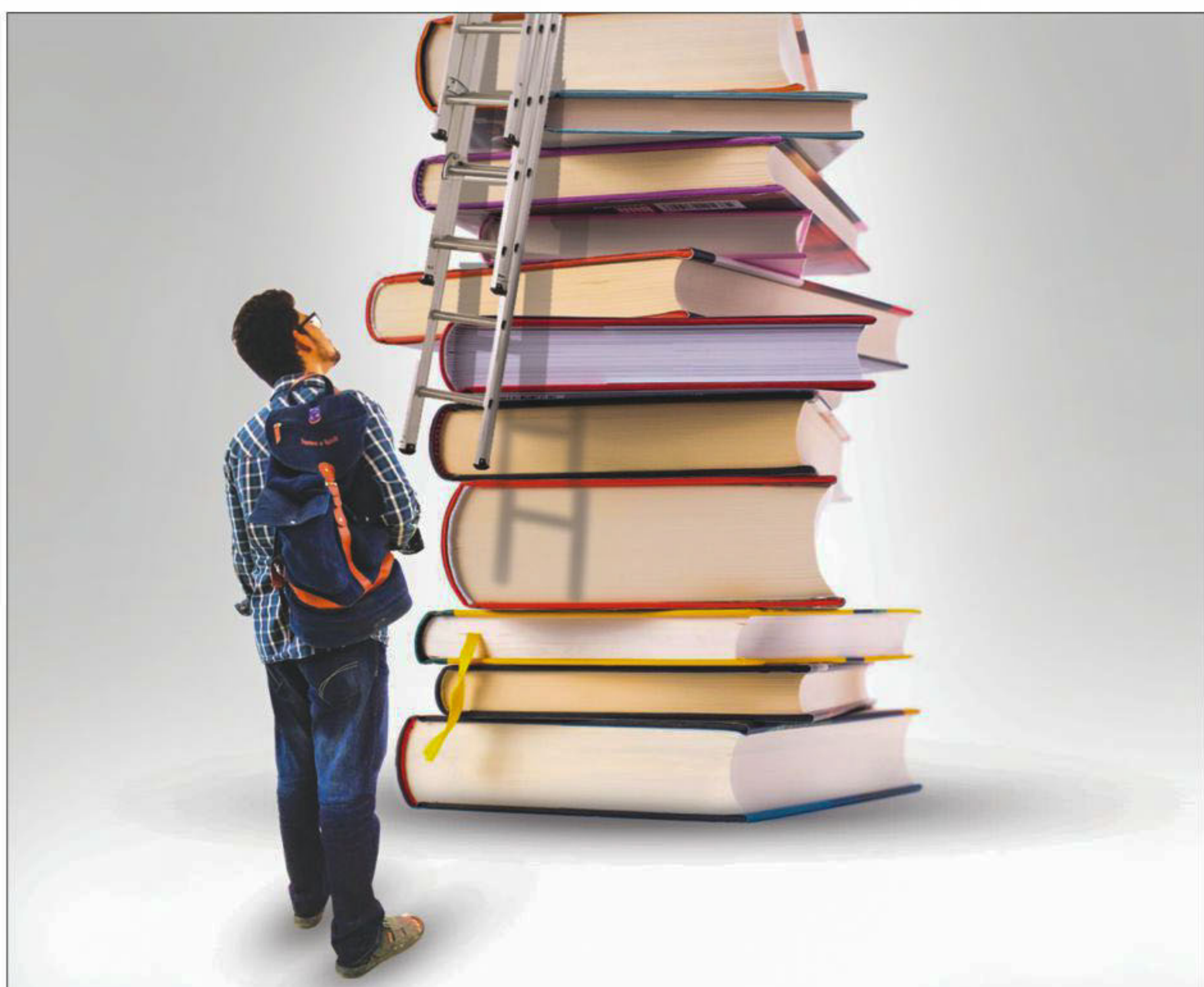
Dortmund became the fourth team after Liverpool, Monaco and Real Madrid to score eight goals in a Champions League fixture.

Only one match in the history of the European Cup and Champions League has had more goals - when Dutch side Feyenoord beat KR of Iceland 12-2 in September 1969.

Dortmund have now scored 14 goals against Legia this season -- the most by any team against a single opponent in one Champions League campaign.

Shinji Kagawa scored two goals in just 76 seconds, the fastest double in Champions League history.
