Atrocities on Rohingyas protested

Different political, religious and ethnic minority organisations in Bangladesh yesterday condemned the ongoing repression against the Rohingya Muslims in Myanmar's Rakhine state that erupted recently with a series of army raids leaving many dead and seeing hundreds arrested.

In Chittagong city, leaders of Islamist organisation Hefazat-e-Islam Bangladesh at a gathering at Anderkillah intersection following the Jumma prayers, announced to rally in Cox's Bazar on December 2 to denounce the repression, reports our staff correspondent in Chittagong.

The organisation's Secretary General Junaid Babu Nagari urged the government to put diplomatic pressure on the Myanmarese government to immediately stop the assaults. He also urged the government to open up borders to let in the repressed Muslims for shelter and rights organisa-

The organisation will submit a memorandum to the Myanmer embassy in Dhaka on December 1.

tions to come forward to protect the victims.

Following the rally, several hundred Hefazat activists marched towards Jamalkhan intersection.

In the same city, Muktijuddher Bijay Mela Parishad brought out a procession at Laldighi Maidan, while Sammilito Bauddha Nagorik Committee formed a human chain in front of the press club, protesting the attacks and urging to ensure peaceful coexistence of all people in Myanmar.

The Parishad demanded an end to the repression and drew the international community's attention to this issue.

Among others, its chairman ABM Mohiuddin Chowdhury joined the procession that paraded through main thoroughfares and ended near Central Shaheed Minar in the city. In Khulna, holding placards that read "stop genocide of

Reckless driving kills 5 near Natore road safety event

Concerned people were forming a human chain demanding safe roads at Lalpur upazila in Natore yesterday morning.

Little did they know, as they were seeking safer roads for all, reckless driving claimed five lives just

750 meters away from the human chain. A speeding mini-truck hit a battery-run auto-rickshaw from behind while it was trying to overtake it in Dakkhin Lalpur area around 11:30am leaving two people dead on the spot, said Abu Obayed, officer-in-

charge of Lalpur Police Station. Six injured were rushed to Lalpur Upazila Health Complex, where two of them died, he said, adding, the fifth victim died at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital, where

ENROLMENT TEST

Absentee on DU IER merit list!

An applicant's name was listed on a merit list of a November 18 enrolment test for the Master of Education programme (evening) under the Institute of Education and Research (IER) at Dhaka University even though she did not sit for the test.

The results, published on Tuesday, showed her admit card number against the merit position 41st.

Applicant Pallabi, a teacher of political science at Dhaka College, herself admitted that she applied, but did not appear in the exam because of her illness.

The university authorities, however, termed it a printing mistake, while Pallabi's friends, who attended the test, claimed to have seen another applicant in the seat allocated for Pallabi at the test centre. Invigilators did not take heed of the "anomaly" it despite being informed, Pallabi's brother Bivash Barai quoted her friends as saying.

There might have been fraudulence, Bivash suspected

who informed the authorities of the issue. IER Director Hosne Ara Begum said, "There was no fraudu-

lence. It was a mistake made by a computer operator."

BMP urges govt to review draft law allowing girls to tie knot before 18

Bangladesh Mahila Parishad (BMP) yesterday urged the government to review a draft law on child marriage that fixed 18 years as the minimum age for girls to get married but kept a provision for special circumstances under which girls below the age could tie the knot.

BMP raised the demand at a human chain before Jatiya Press Club as part of a 15-day programme on the prevention of violence against women.

BMP president Ayesha Khanam said women rights bodies on several occasions urged the government not to keep the special circumstance provision, but the government has not taken heed of it.

At the human chain, Ayesha said the intensity of violence and brutality against women went up alarmingly

in the last one year. She added that culture of impunity and delay in the process of trial are the main reasons for violence

against women and girls. According to different media reports published this year, a total of 4,144 women, while 875 were raped. Among the raped, 134 faced gang-rape, says a BMP statement, adding that 31 were killed following rape and 140 faced rape attempts.
