And that is because of the sheer amount of flight which he had bowled with. He provided the likes of Gayle, Shoaib Malik and Mohammad Nabi juicy, loopy deliveries in a T20 game and that is something that perhaps no bowler in the competition has had the guts to do on such a consistent basis so far.

Speak to Nazmul Abedhin Fahim, the national manager of the Bangladesh Cricket Board's (BCB's) Game Development under whom the Under-19 team, including Afif, recently completed a camp and he will surprise you by saying: "He is actually a better batsman than a bowler."

was a fluke. He has bowled well on a regular basis but I thought he was fantastic in this game," he added.

Afif and co will be leaving for Sri Lanka on December 13 to take part in the Youth Asia Cup and he was given a chance to play for a franchise so that he could earn some valuable experience in high-pressure situations.

### Shahzad surprise

Spectators at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur were slightly taken aback when Afghanistan's Mohammad Shahzad came out to open the innings for the Rangpur Riders yesterday.

As per the press release, the BPL governing council reduced Shahzad's ban to one match 'for the greater interest of the tournament' and he was subsequently available for selection yesterday.

### CA fines Maxwell

## Riders saddle Bulls

Amidst all the permutations and combinations in the ongoing

Bangladesh Premier League (BPL), Rangpur Riders's 29-run win yesterday against the Barisal Bulls confirmed one thing: Mushfigur Rahim's Bulls and Mashrafe Bin Mortaza's Comilla Victorians are officially out of this season's league.

While the Bulls and the Victorians struggled throughout the competition, they still had a ray of light prior to yesterday. However, that hope ended after an all-round performance from Rangpur at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur.

Batting first, the Riders rode on a 76-run stand off 63 balls between Mohammad Shahzad and Mohammad Mithun to post 154.

While Shahzad scored a 40-ball 48, with four fours and a six, Mithun finished on 38 off 41 with one six and a four after Rangpur lost the outof-form Soumya Sarkar early in the game when Kamrul Islam Rabbi dismissed him in the fourth over for a 12-ball 17.

Ziaur Rahman posted a 17-ball 23 towards the end, with two fours and a six, to help the Riders cross the 150-run mark.

Thisara Perera, who dismissed Mithun and Anwar Ali, was Barisal's best performer and finished with figures of 2 for 26.

In reply, the Bulls, who were looking to play very aggressively and seemingly wanted to finish the game with a number of overs in hand in order to boost their run-rate, were dismissed for 125 in 18.2 overs.

They began the chase well with a

Rangpur's bowling attack did

well despite the absence of Arafat Sunny, who has been reported for his bowling action. Shohag Gazi, Liam Dawson, Rubel Hossain and Shahid Afridi took two wickets each while Anwar Ali and Naeem Islam took a scalp each.

In order to confirm Rangpur's place in the last four, they will need to win their last game against the Comilla Victorians.

Barisal opener Dawid Malan blamed the lack of collective team performance behind their early exit in the competition.

"It is disappointing, especially as we won three out of four in Dhaka in the first leg. We didn't have enough people chipping in for the rest of the team. It wasn't a collective team performance. If we had played well as a team we could have made the top four," said Malan.

He described the tournament as a mixed bag personally, but on a general note he said that the BPL could be one of the better franchisee tournaments in the near future if organised better.

### Tigresses hit the lowest ebb

Bangladesh Women's team ended a forgettable Women's T20 Asia Cup campaign with a punishing seven-wicket defeat against their Sri Lankan counterparts in Bangkok yesterday.

Sent into bat, the Tigresses scored a below-par 93-3 in their share of 20 overs at the Asian Institute of Technology ground. Sanjida Islam scored the highest, 35 while Shaila Sharmin chipped in with an unbeaten 25. But a run-rate of just over 4.5 has never been defendable in the slam-bang T20 format and so the Lankans raced to 97-3 with six balls to spare with Chamira Jayangani finishing the chase in style, hitting an unbeaten 39 off 25 balls that contained three fours and two sixes.

Interestingly, it was Bangladesh's first defeat against the Islanders after two identical wins by three runs - the first one in the 2012 Asia Cup and the second in the Women's World T20 in

The defeat completed a listless showing by the Tigresses in an international T20 competition despite the fact that they are more experienced and have more resources at hand with all the facilities available to them. It was in this tournament their batting never came up to the mark. They were embarrassingly bowled out for 45 against Pakistan, which was their lowest T20 score, and crashed out to India for 54 runs a few days later.

They however won their two insignificant matches against lowly Nepal and hosts Thailand. But the revamped set up that included a high-profile English coach and a new captain even failed to match the standard set by a team that was not even in the board's payroll a couple of years ago.

The Bangladesh women's team, who are in their fourth year since making their T20 debut with a spectacular victory against Ireland in 2012, can easily consider this Asia Cup as their worst in every aspect.


