Internationally reputed Polish

artist Professor Zygmunt Rafal Strent is now on his visit to Bangladesh as international jury member of the 17th Asian Art Biennale. He, along with eminent Bangladeshi artist Professor Rafiqun Nabi (Chairman of the Jury Board), Ms. Dolorosa Sinaga (Indonesia), Yuko Hasegawa (Japan) and Jinsub Yoon (Republic of Korea) selected the nine

awards at this year's biennale, from over 500 artworks. Rafal Strent is a painter and a renowned graphic artist of Poland.

He never thought of coming to Bangladesh, though he did a work on this alluvial land titled "The Bay of Bengal" in 1979. Art is the best way to communicate between cultures and people,

Rafal is thinking of holding exhibitions and workshops participated by Bangladeshi artists in Poland and vice versa. "Of course it is possible. Your ambassador and I will meet personally to make the idea come into reality," he concluded.

the importance not touching that button. Later in the preview, this unfortunately results in Baby Groot running off with the bomb while Rocket asks Star-Lord if he has any

tape to put over the 'death button'. The rest of the "Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 2" trailer is an amazing blend of action scenes and awesome music, the latter by blasting "Fox on the Run" by Sweet. The highlights include Star-Lord evading enemy ships, Gamora jumping onto the Abilisk to kill it, Drax yelling out, "Screw you, spaceship!" and Rocket blasting away at foes. It's also good to see that even with his small stature and adorably squeaky voice, Baby Groot is not someone you want to piss off.

The trailer ends with arguably its most hilarious scene, as new member Mantis is introduced, with her ability to sense someone's feelings

just by touching them also demonstrated.

Set two months after the first movie, "Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 2" will revolve around the eponymous heroes traveling across the cosmos and trying to keep their weird family together. Along with Chris Pratt, Zoe Saldana, Dave Bautista, Bradley Cooper and Vin Diesel reprising their respective roles, the other returning folks include Karen Gillan as Nebula, Michael Rooker as Yondu, Glenn Close as Nova Prime and Sean Gunn as Kraglin. The new players include Pom Klementieff as Mantis, Elizabeth Debicki As Ayesha, Chris Sullivan as Taserface and Kurt Russell as Ego.

"Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 2" hits theatres on May 5, 2017.
