

# Bir Shreshtho Ruhul Amin's anniversary of

Bir Shreshtho Shaheed Md Ruhul Amin Memorial Library and Memorial Museum arranged a discus-


sion and a milad mahfil. Born on February 1, 1934 in Baghpanchra of Sonaimuri upazila in Noakhali, Ruhul is one of the seven Liberation War heroes who got the highest gallantry award.

Ruhul joined the then Pakistan Navy as a sailor in 1951. In 1968, he was posted to BNS Baktiar in Chittagong and had been serving there till the 1971 Liberation War.

On December 10, 1971, a convoy of three ships, including The Palash of which Ruhul Amin was a sailor, reached near Khulna, four enemy aircraft bombed on the convoy that caught fire. Ruhul did not leave the ship, tried to extinguish the fire and continued the attack. Meantime, he became injured and fell into the river

He reached the shore but unfortunately got caught by Razakars who killed him later.

# Family suspects local miscreants, one held

Gol-e-Noor wailed as she visited the place again yesterday.

In a densely populated Chondipur Adarshapara area of Rajshahi city, it is hardly a 1,000 square feet of vacant land. Its three corners are surrounded by a fivefoot boundary wall while a two-storied building covered the fourth.

The body of Anny Khatun, Noor's 11year-old granddaughter, was found lying upside down there on Thursday noon. The autistic girl had been missing since Tuesday evening.

A forensic lecturer of Rajshahi Medical College Hospital who performed her autopsy confirmed that she was gang-raped and tortured before murder.

Noor was raising Anny for the last two years after her son and Anny's father Golam Mostafa Ratan died and Ratan's wife left their son and Anny with her. "Often, Anny used to go missing as she couldn't remember the address but people always brought her back. She never went missing for long," she said. Around 8:00pm on Tuesday, Noor found Anny was missing. Once the news spread, a woman who lived on the two-storied building beside the land informed

about the body. When this correspondent went to talk to her and other residents, none were willing. The land belonged to the owner of the building, one Raihan Ali, they said but were reluctant to share his contact information. "We found burn and bite marks and bruises all over her body. Her scarf was tied around her neck," said Anjuara Khatun, Anny's aunt. The family suspected that the miscreants must be from the locality.

"No outsiders would have dared to commit such a heinous crime," said Anny's uncle Joynal Abedin Swapan, who filed a gang-rape and murder case with Rajpara Police Station accusing unnamed people. Often, local miscreants and drug addicts gather near that place. "Dwellers are afraid of them as some carry arms," he alleged.

Police detained a local youth Momin, 21, Thursday night, who was placed on a seven-day remand by a court, said OC Amanullah of the station. "We have also collected DNA samples."

Meanwhile, demanding punishment, Bangladesh Mahila Parishad at a press conference in the city said they recorded 437 incidents of rape and torture on women and children in the district from January to November this year.

### Pregnant woman dies after being burnt 'by husband' OUR CORRESPONDENT, Noakhali

An eight month pregnant woman succumbed to her injuries at Dhaka Medical College Hospital early yesterday after she had been set on fire allegedly by her husband over

dowry in Noakhali three days ago. Giasuddin, father of the victim, Kamrunnahar Nipu, 19, filed a case with Sudharam Model Police Station in Noakhali against her husband Mohsin, who is on the run, said Officer-in-Charge Anwar Hossain.

Her family alleged that Mohshin used to torture Nipu over dowry at their Dharmapur house in Noakhali Sadar upazila and on Wednesday he set her on fire by pouring kerosene on her.

They said Mohshin even threat ened to kill her for dowry and several arbitrations were arranged on the issue earlier.

Nipu was first taken to Noakhali General Hospital and later was shifted to the burn unit at the DMCH.

Her relatives said they will take the body to Noakhali after an autopsy.

They are trying to arrest Mohshin, said the OC.

# CLASH OVER ESTABLISHING SUPREMACY 30 BCL men held at CU

Police detained at least 30 activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) yesterday when raiding Shahjalal Hall and Shah Amanat Hall of Chittagong University (CU).

They also recovered 30 machetes and two sacks of brickbats and iron rods from the dormitories, said Rezaul Masud, additional superintendent of police of Chittagong.

Police detained the BCL men following a chase and counter-chase between followers of BCL CU unit president Mohammad Alamgir Tipu and those of general secretary Fazly Rabby Sujan over establishing supremacy on the campus, said campus sources.

Witnesses said the chase and counter-chase occurred around 11:30am when BCL activist Fahim Hasan, loyal to Tipu, was "beaten by Sujan's followers" over an altercation.

Later, police brought the situation under control with permission from the university authorities and deployed additional policemen.

Sujan alleged, "Police attacked our activists during the raid." "We will go for a tough movement if actions are not taken

against the policemen responsible," he added. On Thursday, at least 19 BCL activists were injured in a clash between the two factions.
