



TALKS ON EC FORMATION BNP, JP to seek polls-time govt

The BNP, Jatiya Party, and the LDP have planned to ask the president to form an election-time cabinet before the next parliamentary polls.

They want to propose this when they meet the president to talk about the formation of the Election Commission.

The talks are scheduled to start on December 18.

The BNP, which was invited to the talks on the first day, is likely to request the president to take the initiative to form an election-time government through discussions with political parties.

The Jatiya Party is scheduled to meet the head of state on December 20. It too

The president has been misinformed about issuance of gazette notification on the rules determining discipline and conduct of lower court judges, the Supreme Court observed yesterday.

It asked the law ministry to issue a gazette notification on the conduct rules by January 15 next year, adjourning the hearing on the Masdar Hossain case, also known as the separation of the judiciary case, till that date.

ENGLISH MEDIUM SCHOOL STUDENTS
VAT on tuition fees illegal: HC

The High Court yesterday declared the imposition of value-added tax (VAT) on tuition fees of English medium schools illegal and directed the authorities concerned to stop collecting VAT from January next year.

A bench of Justice Zubayer Rahman Chowdhury and Justice Md Mozibur Rahman Miah delivered the verdict upon hearing on a writ petition filed by two guardians seeking cancellation of VAT.

The court came up with the judgment on the ground that VAT on English medium education is discriminatory since no VAT was imposed on fees of other institutions, petitioners' counsel Shahdeen Malik told The Daily Star.

1 killed as Rab, robbers 'trade bullets' in bus

An alleged robber was killed and four others were injured when Rapid Action Battalion members and a robber gang "traded bullets" in a bus in the district's Bheramara upazila Sunday night.

Rab detained the four wounded and recovered firearms and bullets from their possession.

The dead is Abdul Salam, 32, of Boribari area of Pabna's Atikula.

Mosaddek Ibne Mujib, company commander of Rab-12, said they had

Secret operation of a young surgeon

He always kept his duties above everything.

Even when his mother and wife were undergoing treatment at a hospital the day after the Pakistan army crackdown on March 25, 1971, Dr Azharul Haque did not walk away from his duties to patients and to the nation.

As dawn broke on March 26, the 30-year-old surgeon started treating wounded people flocking to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH). He just took a brief time out to see his ailing mother and wife that day.

"It was the beginning ... He treated wounded freedom fighters secretly till his last breath," said his wife Syeda Salma Haque.

Azhar had to pay dearly for his commitment to the independence of Bangladesh. He was abducted along with another physician, Dr Humayun Kabir, on November 15, 1971 by the infamous Al-Badr Bahini.

They were brutally tortured to death and their bodies were found the next day.

Sensing imminent defeat in the war, the Pakistan army
