# All eyes on Narayanganj

Clean mayoral candidates, healthy campaign raise hope for fair polls in N'ganj today

With archrivals the Awami League and the BNP going head to head, the country's attention today would be on Narayanganj city, which goes to polls to elect its mayor and 36 councillors.

When compared to national polls, which involves around 10 crore voters, the Narayanganj City Corporation polls is tiny, with just about 4.74 lakh voters.

Yet, it has generated a lot of hoopla in national politics as ruling Awami League and the BNP are trying to get their person elected as mayor.

Peaceful and clean electioneering of the two main mayor candidates raised hopes for a good election today. The campaigns were free from mudslinging as well.

If the polls atmosphere remains agreeable the whole day, Narayanganj City Corporation polls may become the best election held in the last three years. If so, this may be a solace for the Election Commission which is at the end of its tenure.

## Osmans' role could be a crucial factor

Ruling party lawmaker Shamim Osman is still at the centre of discussion in Narayanganj and there are speculations among the people as to what he and his men might or might not do in today's polls.

Despite not being in the race, the controversial lawmaker remains a key character in Narayanganj as the Osman family has a vote bank in the city corporation area.

Following the electoral code of conduct, the Narayanganj-4 lawmaker did not take part in the campaign, but what his followers might do on election day is a matter of concern for both the Awami League and BNP-nominated mayor candidates.

"Many ward councillors [candidates] are his followers. To ensure their victory, Shamim's men might do something and this might create a chaotic situation, especially in Siddhirganj area," Mahmud Mia, a trader of Siddhirganj, told The Daily Star.

Though Shamim publicly extended

## 32 thrust sectors could fetch billions

Main challenge is how Bangladesh can tap the investment potential, UK analyst tells conference on new economic thinking

Bangladesh has 32 thrust sectors that have the potential to fetch billions of dollars in investment and export earnings, an analyst said yesterday.

But the main challenge will be how the country will exploit the potential, said Joseph DiVanna, managing director of Maris Strategies, UK.

He presented a keynote at a session on "the next billion dollar opportunities in Bangladesh" on the sidelines of a daylong conference -- new economic thinking:

Bangladesh 2030 and beyond -- organised by Dhaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry at Radisson hotel in the capital.

Kazi M Aminul Islam, executive chairman of Bangladesh Investment Development Authority,

moderated the session.

"All the 32 sectors have the potential to become the next billion dollar investment opportunities in Bangladesh," DiVanna said.

The sectors include apparel, agriculture,
