## Counter-terror unit to probe case over glitch in PM's plane

The Counter-Terrorism and Transnational Crime unit of the police will investigate the case filed over the emergency landing of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's aircraft in Turkmenistan on November 27, Noor-e-Azam, officer-in-charge of Airport Police Station, yesterday told The Daily Star.

The Biman authorities filed the case with Airport Police Station Tuesday night against its nine staff. Earlier, Biman has suspended the nine.

Three enquiry committees were formed following the incident -- one by the civil aviation ministry, one by Biman and another by the Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh.

# PM urges UK to lift ban on cargo flights

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday called upon the British government to lift an existing ban on Dhaka-London direct cargo flights as British premier's Trade Envoy for Bangladesh Rushanara Ali called on her at Gono Bhaban, reports BSS.

"In response, Rushanara Ali told the prime minister that she would discuss the issue with the UK government," PM's Press Secretary Ihsanul Karim briefed reporters after her British counterpart's envoy and lawmaker made the call yesterday evening.

On March 8 last, the UK banned air cargo directly from Dhaka until further notice citing "security concerns". The press secretary said the premier and the UK House of Commons member also discussed matters relating to boosting economic cooperation between the two countries.

Hasina expressed satisfaction over the signing of a memorandum of understanding (MoU) between a

British firm and Bangladesh Railway for construction of a railway track in Bangladesh.

Bangladesh Railway and British company DP Rail Ltd on Tuesday signed the MoU for setting up a 240km rail line between Dhaka and Payra seaport in Patuakhali's Kuakata.

She also sought more UK invest-

ment in different potential sectors.

While talking about election of three Bangladeshi-origin MPs in the British House of

Commons, the prime minister said: "She is proud to see three Bangladeshi daughters in UK parliament".

Tulip Rizwana Siddiq, a granddaughter of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and a niece of the premier, Rushanara Ali, who hails from Biswanath of Sylhet, and Dr Rupa Huq, who hails from Pabna, were elected MPs from Labour Party in the May 7, 2015 UK general elections.

British High Commissioner in Dhaka Alison Blake was present.

Meanwhile, Rushanara called on Foreign Minister AH Mahmood Ali at the foreign ministry yesterday, reports our diplomatic correspondent.

She also met BNP chairperson Khaleda Zia at her Gulshan office and discussed bilateral issues, said Khaleda's press wing member Sayrul Kabir Khan, reports UNB.

### Ctg woman's hanging body found

Alauddin, a restaurant worker, was at work, said the SI, adding, Sonia might have committed suicide.

### Ctg illegal brick kilns fined

of two Hindu women and forcing of around 400 Hindus of the sadar upazila's Sahapara union to leave the country; killing of nine people of Nandina village and looting of around 50 houses; killing of five people of Doulatpur village; and killing of seven people in Sahapara union.

On the whereabouts of a fugitive war criminal from Kishoreganj in Narayanganj's Rupganj surfacing after his death recently, Sanaul believes there was a lack of coordination among law enforcement agencies responsible for arresting fugitives. "Like the victim families, we are also frustrated," he added.

## Three killed in road accidents

Three people were killed and another was injured in road accidents in three districts yesterday.

In Narayanganj, a college student was killed as a truck hit his motorcycle in Kallandir Junction area of Araihaar upazila.

The deceased Abu Kalam, 26, of Dasirdiya village was a second-year student of Government Safar Ali College and a temporary employee of Rural Electrification Board (REB) office in the district.

In Nilphamari, rickshaw-van puller Noor Hossain, 48, of Uttar Sonakhuli village was killed as a microbus hit his vehicle on Jaldhaka-Dalia Road in Jhunagachh Chapani area.

Locals put logs on the road to stop the fleeing microbus but the driver managed to get on a truck and flee.

In Mymensingh, a motorcyclist was killed and his co-rider injured as a truck rammed his vehicle on the Mymensingh-Kishoreganj road in Rahmatganj area of Ishwarganj upazila.

The deceased was Rana, 30, of Panch Darilla.

## HC refuses hearing plea seeking stay on N'ganj district council polls

A High Court bench yesterday refused to hear a petition that sought stay on the polls of Narayanganj district council to be held on December 28. The HC said the petitioner's lawyer was late in moving the petition.

Terming the existing voter list "faulty" as per the law, Shah Jalal, a resident of Narayanganj's Araihaar, submitted the petition to the HC on Monday also seeking a stay on the effectiveness of the existing voter list.
