


## OSCAR TO SMASH ASIAN TRANSFER RECORD

Chelsea's Oscar is set to smash the Asian transfer record with a big-money move to Shanghai SIPG after the clubs agreed terms on a reported 70.5 million euros deal on Friday. The 25-year-old Brazil midfielder is due in the Chinese city "in the coming days" to complete the signing, which was announced by both Shanghai SIPG and Chelsea. "Shanghai SIPG has formally completed the transfer agreement of Brazil football player Oscar with Chelsea," the Chinese club said on its official social media account. "Oscar will arrive in Shanghai in the coming days to officially join SIPG." Oscar will become China's fifth Asian-record signing in less than a year. Oscar will also become Chelsea's most lucrative sale, beating compatriot David Luiz's £50 million (\$8.7 million euros) move to Paris Saint Germain in 2014.



# Sirajul crowned champion

Sirajul Islam of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) clinched the title of the first Fortune Tour de Bangladesh after overcoming a seven-point deficit against his mentor and race leader Riton Kumar Biswas in an entertaining final stage in Dhaka yesterday.

Coming into the third and final stage, held over seven laps around the inner circle of Hatirjheel Lake in the capital, the overnight second-placed Sirajul racked up 15 points from the stage.

Riton, who led his younger teammate by seven points after the end of the second stage on Wednesday, finished out of contention for points in the final round, eventually ending the race with his previous 30 points.

That allowed 28-year-old Sirajul to clinch the top position with 45 points and win a check of Tk 300,000. Alamgir Hossain of Bangladesh Army finished with 37 points, but was adjudged to have finished third behind Riton due to his inferior finish in the opening stage. Riton grabbed Tk 200,000 while Alamgir received Tk 100,000 for his efforts.

"I didn't think I would win because Riton da was far ahead of me coming into this round," said an elated Sirajul after his surprise victory. "I would have been happy had I ended in second

position and Riton da won as he is the one who brought me to BGB."

Sirajul, the son of a day labourer from Jessor, has been in cycling for more than 12 years but came into limelight in 2008 when he won two gold medals [15km and elimination race] in the national cycling championship while representing Chittagong District Association.

"Riton da was the one who told me to come to BDR [now BGB] after watching my performance. And since then I've won five more gold, 10 silver

and one bronze medal in national championships. I am indebted to him."

Sirajul's crowning moment capped off the three-stage Fortune Tour de Bangladesh, the first long distance cycling competition of the country styled after Tour de France. The organisers of the race took encouragement from the response and promised that the race would be arranged in a broader and more organised manner in the coming years.

Shoeb Mohammad Asaduzzaman, head of sales and marketing of sponsors Bangladesh Edible Oil Limited,

want to turn this event into an international standard one. So we are planning to increase the number of stages as well as number of participants from the next year," he added.

Asaduzzaman also informed that a talent hunt programme would be held early next year under the guidance of an International Cycling Union judge to find more potential cyclists for the next edition.

Imtiaz Khan Babul, the general secretary of Bangladesh Cycling Federation, thanked everyone involved with the race for making it a success.

## Saif SC back on top

## PSG agree Draxler deal

Paris Saint-Germain have agreed a deal with Wolfsburg to sign German World Cup-winning midfielder Julian Draxler for 36 million euros (£30.5m, \$37.5m), according to the website of French sports daily L'Equipe.

Draxler, 23, is on the market after a difficult first half to the season with a struggling Wolfsburg side and was widely expected to leave in the January transfer window.

# Shirin the fastest again

Shirin Akter retained the distinction as the country's fastest woman yesterday by winning the women's 100m sprint event of the 40th National Athletics Championship, clocking 12.01 seconds (hand timing) at the Bangabandhu National Stadium.

This is the fourth consecutive 100m

sprint title the athlete from Bangladesh Navy has collected from the National Athletics Championship along with one from the Summer Athletics Championship. She had finished sixth in the South Asian Games in Guwahati, India earlier this year with a time of 12.43 seconds (electronic timing) despite clocking 11.99 seconds in the heats.

And although Shirin improved on the time she set during the meet's previous edition by 0.19 seconds, it was not enough to surmount her own

AC Milan beat Juventus to win the Italian Super Cup on Thursday in a penalty shootout, the first trophy the Rossoneri have won since 2011.




Mario Mandzukic and Paulo Dybala missed their spot kicks for Juventus, with Gianluca Lapadula the only Milan player not to convert his penalty.

Juve, Italian league and cup double winners last season, had taken the lead in 18th minute after Giorgio Chiellini produced home a Miralem Pjanic corner.

At that stage it was all Juventus, but they were pegged back just before half-time when Giacomo Bonaventura beautifully glanced home a Fernandez Suso cross.

Patrice Evra scored but he was ruled offside and Dybala missed a great chance, spooning a shot over from eight yards with just four minutes remaining.
