2016: A FESTIVE YEAR FOR THE ARTS

Cultural organisations remained active throughout the year. Festivals -- big and small -- were spread across the calendar, from grandiose International ones like Dhaka Art Summit, Asian Art Biennale and Bengal Classical Music Festival, to ones surely making a mark – like Dhaka International Folk Fest and Ganga-Jamuna Theatre Fest and even more niche ones like Nazrul Mela and Chhayanaut's Kathak festival, every culture-loving Bangalee had enough to indulge in. "Aynabaji" brought audience back to cinemas in hoards while other films held Bangladesh's reputation at international festivals, and the terror that struck the nation in July was defied by thousands who came out to join celebrations of our culture, music and heritage, wherever it happened. As we prepare to embrace a brand new year just around the corner, here is a fond look back at the year that passed us by, in the fields of arts and entertainment.

BANGLADESH CULTURAL FESTIVAL AT BSA

The first Bangladesh Cultural Festival was held at Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy (BSA). The 18-day (January 1-18) cultural festival, aiming to build an artistically and culturally rich, creative and humanistic Bangladesh, took place at Nandanmancha of BSA. Organised by BSA, the artistes of all the District Shilpakala Academies offered performances of music, dance, recitation, acting and traditional folk items.

YEARLONG CELEBRATIONS OF SHAH ABDUL KARIM'S BIRTH CENTENARY

In celebration of Baul Samrat Shah Abdul Karim's birth centenary, a yearlong programme began in February in Dhaka. A three-day programme was held in Sylhet first, and then in other parts of the country. The celebrations will wrap up in February 2017.

CELEBRATING LIFE 2015 GALA HELD

The awards ceremony of Standard Chartered-The Daily Star Celebrating Life 2015 took place at Bangabandhu International Conference Centre on January 10. Actress Babita, photographer Afzal H Chowdhury and lyricist Alauddin Ali received Lifetime Achievement Awards for their monumental contributions to Film, Photography and Music respectively. Popular band Chirkutt performed at the programme while Sabina Yasmin and Syed Abdul Hadi performed songs penned by Alauddin Ali.

SADRANG'S CLASSICAL MUSIC CONFERENCE IN CHITTAGONG

The 19th National Classical Music Conference was held at Chittagong District Shilpakala Academy auditorium. Organised by Sadrang Uchchanga Sangeet Parishad Bangladesh, the two-day conference featured vocal and instrumental music performances by the artistes from all over Bangladesh and Kolkata, India.

MEMORIAL FESTIVAL ON SELIM AL DEEN

Marking death anniversary of Selim Al Deen, a towering figure of Bangla theatre in post-Rabindranath era, Dhaka Theatre held a four-day programme at Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy. The event was supported by the Shilpakala Academy and Bangladesh Graam Theatre.

DHAKA INTERNATIONAL FILM FEST HELD

The 14th edition of the Dhaka International Film Festival opened in Dhaka with the theme "Better Film, Better Audience, Better Society". Organised by Rainbow Film Society, the weeklong festival featured screening of 184 films from 60 countries across four venues.

BANGLADESHI ARTISTS AT PRUDENTIAL EYE AWARDS

The third edition of the Prudential Eye Awards 2016 was held at Singapore as part of Singapore Art Week. Internationally acclaimed Bangladeshi artists Shumon Ahmed and Promotes Das vied for awards in two categories -- Photography and Sculpture respectively, where Shumon Ahmed received the award in photography category.

9TH INT'L CHILDREN'S FILM FESTIVAL HELD

The ninth edition of International Children's Film Festival Bangladesh was held at 15 venues in Dhaka, Sylhet and Rajshahi. In addition to the screening of over 150 films, the event also featured competitions in a number of categories, a seminar, workshop and more.

MADHU MELA WRAPS UP AT SAGARDARI

Madhu Mela, an annual festival celebrating the 191st birth anniversary of the pioneer of Bengali sonnets, poet Michael Madhusudan Dutta, ended on January 28 at Sagardari, Jessor. Thousands of people from different parts of the country and abroad visited the weeklong festival and fair, the largest in south-western Bangladesh.

BOOK FAIR RETURNS WITH THE SPIRIT OF AMAR EKUSHEY

In line with previous years, Amar Ekushey Book Fair returned in February with its ever-buoyant spirit. The month-long fair, the largest and most popular book fair in Bangladesh, was commenced on February 1st at Bangla Academy premises and the adjacent Suhrawardy Udyana.

INT'L POETS SUMMIT AT BSA

The inauguration ceremony of Kathak International Poets Summit 2016 was held at National Art Gallery auditorium of Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy. A group of renowned poets from Sweden, Slovakia,

Morocco and Taiwan joined the summit, along with ace Bangladeshi poets. The event featured different programmes including recitation, award giving ceremony, views-exchange and discussion where rising Bangladeshi poets interacted with noted local and international poets.

DHAKA ART SUMMIT ENTHRALLS ART LOVERS

With a call to celebrate the world's largest non-commercial research and exhibition platform for South Asian Art, the third edition of Dhaka Art Summit returned to the capital's Shilpakala Academy on February 5. The four-day summit, jointly organised by Samdani Art Foundation in association with Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy and Bangladesh Tourism Board, as well as over 50 international partners offered a cornucopia of diverse art: be it fine, video, installation, photography, performance, architecture, film, critical writing, artists' talks and more.

CHANDRASHEKHAR PERFORMS IN THE CAPITAL

Padmabhushan Professor Chandrashekhar, a Bharatnatyam dancer, musician, composer, choreographer, vocalist, natuvanar, dance teacher and researcher, conducted two dance

A three-day Lalon Smaran Utshab (Lalon Memorial Festival) was held at the shrine of Lalon Shah at Chheuria in Kushtia. Introduced by Lalon himself, the festival is held every year to celebrate Dol Purnima, where followers of Lalon's music and philosophy from all across the country come together.
