## Poor visibility causes another pile-up

1 killed; witnesses say bridge lights were off during fog; authorities claim they were on

A five-vehicle pile-up on Bangabandhu Bridge in poor visibility early yesterday left one person dead and five others injured. Drivers and locals claimed that the lights on the bridge were off when the accident happened amid dense fog but the bridge authorities maintain that those were on.

On January 9 last year, at least six people, including the son of Land Minister Shamsur Rahman, were killed during a 16-vehicle pile-up on the bridge amid dense fog. The Daily Star found that all 153 sodium lights on the bridge were off during the accident.

Yesterday, a bamboo-laden truck hit the median on the bridge about 200 metres away from east end toll plaza around 6:45am. The truck spun and partially blocked the dual carriageway.

Unable to see the stationary truck in the dense fog, four other trucks, a few of which were carrying logs, rammed it, said police, drivers and bridge officials.

The pile-up left Shafiqul Islam, helper of a log-laden truck and an inhabitant of Joypurhat, dead on the spot, said SEE PAGE 10 COL 5

#### IS claims Istanbul nightclub attack

Police detain eight suspects AFP, Istanbul

The Islamic State jihadist group yesterday claimed the shooting rampage inside a glamorous Istanbul nightclub on New Year's night that killed 39 people, as police hunted the attacker who remains on the run.

Anti-terror police made their first arrests over the attack, which unleashed scenes of panic among partygoers at one of Istanbul's swankiest venues and killed mostly foreign tourists.

The shooting took place just 75 minutes into 2017 after a bloody year in Turkey in which hundreds of people were killed in violence blamed on both IS jihadists and Kurdish militants.

In a statement circulated on social media, the jihadist group said one of the "soldiers of the caliphate" had carried out the attack on the Reina nightclub.

## Headmaster beaten with hammer

Victim says Meherpur AL leader, his men attacked him

A high school headmaster was beaten up with hammer allegedly by a local Awami League leader and his men in Gangni upazila of Meherpur on Sunday. The assault left his left leg broken.

Victim Rafiqul Islam told The Daily Star he was attacked for "refusing to recommend the leader's appointment as the president of his school's management

committee unlawfully". According to Rafiqul, 48, and local sources, the management committee election of Devipur High School was held on December 26 in the presence of Gangni Upazila Secondary School Education

Officer Mir Habibul Basher. Following due procedures, the committee elected Abdul Baki, a freedom fighter, as its president, Habibul told The Daily Star. Baki became the president beating the

## 'Saudi embassy lifts visa restrictions on Bangladeshi males'

The Saudi embassy in Dhaka has withdrawn the restriction on visas for male migrant workers, said a leader of Bangladesh Association o International Recruiting Agencies (Baira) yesterday.

The embassy had imposed the restriction, saying that recruiting agencies were not sending at least 25 percent female workers simultaneously. "Recruiting agencies are now allowed to submit applications of both

male and female workers to the Saudi embassy together or separately. There is no condition now," said Shameem Ahmed Chowdhury Noman, joint secretary general-2 of Baira.

He said recruiting agents had been facing trouble in sending workers to Saudi Arabia since November last year as the Saudi embassy had refused to accept passports for visas if 25 percent of the applicants were not females. Baira informed the expatriates' welfare ministry of the matter. Saudi

embassy officials in Dhaka then held meetings with Baira on December 15 and December 29, he said.

Shameem said Saudi embassy Consular Khaled Baksh yesterday informed Baira that the recruiting agencies seeking visas for male workers could submit applications and there was no condition of submitting applications of 25 percent females. "This is great news for Bangladesh and those seeking to go to Saudi

Arabia for work," he said. Saudi Arabia, which is home to some 15 lakh Bangladeshis and had

imposed restrictions on labour recruitment since 2008, resumed recruiting Bangladeshi female workers in early 2015.

The kingdom began recruiting male workers in the middle of 2016, but SEE PAGE 10 COL 6

#### Myanmar detains policemen

Myanmar said yesterday it has detained several police officers over a video shot by a fellow policeman that shows them beating Rohingya civilians, a rare admission of abuse against the Muslim minority. Tens of thousands of

people from the persecuted ethnic group -- loathed by many of Myanmar's Buddhist majority -- have fled a military operation in Rakhine state, launched after attacks on police posts in October.

Dozens of videos have emerged apparently showing abuses against Rohingya, but this is the first time the government has said it will take action over them.

The refugees' stories have raised global alarm and galvanised protests against Myanmar's de facto

### Selfie-seeking tourist bitten by Thai croc

A French tourist was bitten by a crocodile inside a Thai national park as she tried to get close to the fearsome animal to take a selfie, an official said yesterday.

The incident took place on Sunday afternoon in Khao Yai, a popular national park filled with dense jungle hiking trails and waterfalls three hours north of Bangkok.

"She wanted to take selfie with the crocodile who was lying down near a stream," a park official told AFP, asking not to be named because he did not have the authority to speak to the media. "It was startled and bit her on the leg."

The official said two crocodiles had made their home on that particular section of the park for years with warning signs laid out.
