

City market ravaged by 16-hour blaze

More than 300 shops burnt, part of building collapses; mayor rules out sabotage claim by businessmen

A devastating fire reduced much of the DCC Market at Gulshan-1 to rubble yesterday.

No one was killed or hurt in the blaze that swept through the two-storey building for about 16 hours since around 2:00am. But over 300 shops were gutted and a portion of the market collapsed on impact, causing losses

worth several hundred of crores of taka. Businessmen claimed the fire was an act of sabotage, but fire service officials were yet to ascertain the cause.

Several security guards who were on duty at night said the fire originated from an explosion of a transformer, only a few feet from the building.

"Around 2:00am, I saw a fire at a transformer on the southeastern corner of the market," said Nur

Mohammad, a security guard. "I screamed and ran with my colleague Matiur Rahman to that place. Matiur tried to douse the fire using a fire extinguisher, but the blaze spread very

The market housed 543 shops, including those of kitchen and household items, furniture, clothes, electronic appliances, shoes and bakery.

Helpless, they watched it all go up in smoke

55-year-old Shamsul Alam Liton and his wife Amena Alam looked shell-shocked. They stood speechless and kept staring at the smoke billowing out from the market which housed their clothing store.

The shop -- Hasan Enterprise -- that they owned for over the last 32 years has now been reduced to a pile of rubble.

It was situated on the first floor of the two-storey kitchen market building of the Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) Market at Gulshan-1. The building caved in after a devastating

A top performer in nutrition, basic medicare

Bangladesh is one of the top performers in ensuring nutrition and basic medical care, and health and wellness, according to the Social Progress Index 2016 prepared on a study on 133 countries.

Still, Bangladesh was grouped "low social country" as it was ranked 101st because of its weak performance in nine out of 12 components in the ranking, said the Social Progress Imperative, a US-based non-profit behind the rankings.

The country's score is 52.73. Finland topped the list with a score of 90.09, followed by Canada, Denmark, Australia, and Switzerland.

The Index measures social progress in three broad areas: basic human needs, foundation of well-being and opportunity.

There were 12 components under the broad areas: nutrition and basic medical care; water and sanitation; shelter; personal safety; access to basic knowledge; access to information and communications; health and wellness; and environmental quality; personal rights; personal freedom and choice; tolerance and inclusion; and access to advanced education.
