BFUJ seeks PM's help to form 9th wage board for journalists

A faction of Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists (BFUJ) yesterday sought Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's direct intervention in forming the 9th wage board for journalists.

"The journalists' community of the country is extremely annoyed and upset as the information ministry is dillydallying, breaching its pledges in a cunning manner despite the president's moral support and the prime minister's repeated assurance (in constituting the wage board)," said the BFUJ in a statement issued after its executive committee meeting at Jatiya Press Club with its president Manjurul Ahsan Bulbul in the chair.

Hasina seeks cooperation to sustain pace of development

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina sought cooperation from all to continue the present pace of development.

The premier was speaking at the inaugural of a three-day Development Fair-2017 across the country through videoconferencing from her official Gono Bhaban residence in the capital yesterday.

The fair has been organised to bring all people under the government's activities by informing the success stories to achieve Vision 2021 and Vision 2041 as well as Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Terming terrorism and militancy as the main barriers to development, the prime minister reiterated her call to the people of all levels to build a social spirit against the twin social vices.

Highlighting various initiatives of her government to reduce poverty, Hasina said, "Bangladesh would be considered as a poverty-free middle income country if we can cut the rate by 7/8 percent by 2021."

Elaborating her government's steps for development, the premier said, "Whenever Awami League comes to power, we think it's our responsibility to serve the people."



She said the government has introduced micro-saving project instead of microcredit to make the marginal people self-reliant and free them from the high interest rate of microcredit.

Her government is establishing 100 economic zones across the country to create employment opportunities, she added.

The premier said Bangladesh has earned food autarchy and in order to ensure food for all, misuse of agriculture land should be stopped by banning the establishment of industries here and there.

She also underscored the need for proper marketing of various agro items that are being produced in different areas of the country so that the interest of the farmers could be protected.

The premier hoped that the Bangladesh missions abroad will arrange similar fairs to project the development strides of the government to the expatriate Bangladeshis as well as the development partners.

Senior ministers and government officials were present on the occasion.

Later, the people and officials of four districts -- Tangail, Barisal, Khulna and Gopalganj -- were connected through the videoconferencing. Various government and non-government organisations, banks, insurance companies and other financial institutions are taking part in the fairs.

HC clears way to resume trial against Adilur

The High Court yesterday cleared the way for the lower court to resume trial proceedings against rights organisation Odhikar's Secretary Adilur Rahman Khan and its Director ASM Nasiruddin Elan in a case filed allegedly for distorting information.

The HC rejected an appeal filed by the two against the lower court order that framed charges against them.

The HC also lifted its earlier order that stayed the trial proceedings.

An Odhikar report had claimed that 61 people died following law enforcers' drives against Hefajat-e-Islam in Motijheel of Dhaka on May 6, 2013. But the government put the number of deaths at 13.

SC orders return of Mahmudur Rahman's passport

The Supreme Court yesterday ordered the lower court concerned to return the passport of Amar Desh acting editor Mahmudur Rahman in 24 hours.

The SC passed the order after hearing a petition filed by Mahmudur seeking review of its order that asked him to deposit his passport to the lower court. Earlier on October 31 last year, the apex court upheld a High Court order that granted bail to Mahmudur Rahman in a case filed for alleged attempt to abduct and murder Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's son Sajeeb Wazed Joy.

Zianagar to be Indurkani again

The government yesterday approved proposals to reinstate the name of a Pirozpur upazila, create a new one in Comilla and turn a Chittagong union into a municipality.

A meeting of the National Implementation Committee for Administrative Reform, where Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina was present, approved the proposals on public demand, said Cabinet Secretary Mohammad Shafiqul Alam.

Indurkani was renamed Zianagar during the BNP-Jamaat alliance government in 2002.

The 491st upazila, Lalmai will be formed with eight unions of Comilla sadar upazila and one of Laksam upazila with its headquarters at Joynagar, cover 147.03 square kilometres. Dohazari become a municipality as its population crossed the 50,000 eligibility mark.

Arrest challenged woman's 'rapist': HC

The High Court yesterday ordered the law enforcers to immediately arrest a man, who allegedly raped a mentally challenged woman in Comilla in last December.

The court also directed police to record the complaint over raping the woman and hacking her brother as the first information report of a case in 48 hours.

The Comilla superintendent of police and Bhanga Bazar police officer-in-charge were asked to submit a report before the HC by January 19 after complying with the directives. The HC bench of Justice Moyeenul Islam Chowdhury and Justice JBM Hassan came up with the order on a suomoto move following a daily's report.

Expelled North Korean diplomat's luxurious car seized at KL

Customs intelligence yesterday seized a Rolls Royce Ghost car, worth about Tk 30 crore, of an expelled North Korean diplomat at Kamalapur ICT depot in the capital.

Director General (DG) of Customs Intelligence Dr Mainul Khan said the car was imported in the name of Han Son Ik, ex-first secretary of the North Korean embassy in Dhaka, with a false declaration that it's a BMW model car and the tax of the car is Taka 22 crore. In last August, the diplomat was expelled in connection with banned cigarettes smuggling.

BCL man stabbed by rival faction in Sylhet

A BCL activist was stabbed by activists of a rival faction in front of Jalalabad College gate in Sylhet yesterday afternoon over the parking of a motorbike.

The injured -- Sayeed Ahmed, 21, of South Surma upazila in the district -- was undergoing treatment at Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital.

Witnesses said at least 10-12 activists loyal to former BCL general secretary of Sylhet city unit Rahat Tarafdar locked in an altercation with Sayeed's group over parking a motorbike in front of the college gate in Sobhanighat area around 1:00pm. Following the altercation, the activists of the former group stabbed Sayeed and injured four others, they added.

Contacted, Rahat said activists of both the groups are his followers, but there is a longstanding rivalry between these groups.

He said he was talking to both the groups to reach a solution in this regard till filing of this report as of 6:30pm.

Sohel Ahmed, officer-in-charge (OC) of Kotwali Police Station, said the attackers are outsiders. Terming the incident a BCL factional clash, the OC said they were trying to find the attackers.
