# Lalmonirhat farmer takes expertise to Nepal

Farmer Atul Chandra Roy, 33, from Dakkhin Durakuti village in Lalmonirhat Sadar upazila's Mogholhat union never imagined he would become an international trainer. But last year, far from the alluvial fields of North Bengal that he is used to, Atul went to share his farming knowledge with colleagues in Nepal.

"I have farmed vegetables since I was in class one," says Atul, who was unable to study beyond his Secondary School Certificate due to family circumstances. "For the last decade I have produced vegetable seeds, in particular of bitter gourd, chilli, tomato and brinjal." Atul and his family sell the seeds harvested from their eight bighas of land and an additional four bighas they lease, to a seed company. For his farming expertise Atul has gained quite a reputation.

Following noteworthy farming success again in 2015, Atul was hired

by the Bangladeshi seed company that buys his produce to travel to Nepal for three months, from September to November last year, to demonstrate high yield vegetable farming practices.

According to the seed company, Atul was tasked with farming, together with local farmers, high yield tomato, bitter gourd, brinjal and papaya on fifty acres of land in Haripur, Sreepur and Birganj villages of Sunsuri district of Nepal, around 600 kilometres from Kathmandu.

"Nepalese farmers are hardworking and honest," says Atul, "but they don't know how to produce high vegetable yields. The land we worked with in Nepal is very fertile and suitable for bumper vegetable harvests but they only use general farming techniques. I've been teaching them high yield farming."

"The new skills we learnt from Atul to produce high yield vegetable crops will benefit us a lot," says Nepalese farmer Satis Meheta, 55, from Haripur village over phone. He said previously

they had only been able to achieve general yields from their fields.

"We used to get only twenty percent result from vegetables," says another Nepalese farmer Promodh Meheta, 48, from Sreepur village. "We didn't know how to make the most of our land. From our Bangladeshi farmer friend we gained experience and skill. It will bring good fortune to us."

Lalmonirhat district's branch manager of the seed company, Shahidur Rahman, says Atul was chosen for his experience in producing high yield vegetables. "Our aim is to provide training to Nepalese farming in order that they can produce high yield vegetable seeds for the Nepalese market.

Back at home, Atul's parents, neighbours and indeed most of the inhabitants of his remote village are proud of his efforts in helping Nepalese farmers. His experience is quite the talk of Dakkhin Durakuti.

### Criminals torch 11 houses

Criminals on Monday night torched at least 11 makeshift houses erected on a disputed land at Boirchuna Jagannathpur village in Pirganj upazila on Friday.

Quoting local people, police said one Tarigul Islam and his son-in-law Ekramul Haque bought 169 decimals of land at the village in 2006 and later grew

a mango orchard there. Since buying the land, they have been contesting a case with the government

over the ownership of 133 decimals.

Suddenly on Friday night, eight local landless families erected 11 makeshift houses on the 133 decimals of land, claiming it as khas land Officer-in-Charge Mohammad Amiruzzaman of Pirganj Police Station said.

Later, in a bid to re-establish their possession on the land, a group led by Tariqul's caretaker Marfat Ali vandalised the houses around 7:30pm on Monday and set those afire.

On information, a fire fighting unit from Pirganj Fire Station went to the spot and doused the blaze, the OC added.





# Govt to ask Myanmar

The delegation will also hold talks with Foreign Minister AH Mahmood Ali at 1:30pm at the state guesthouse Padma. Foreign Secretary Md Shahidul Haque and other high officials from different ministries will attend the meeting.

During the talks, Dhaka will make it clear that Rohingyas are citizens of Myanmar and that it is Myanmar's responsibility to resolve the problems in Rakhine state. Bangladesh will also ask Myanmar to take back all registered and unregistered Rohingyas living in Bangladesh for many years, sources said.

The delegation will be reminded of the past agreements signed between the two countries, including the one in 1992, when Myanmar agreed to take back the Rohingyas and also admitted that Rohingyas are legally the citizens of

Myanmar, they added. Myanmar did not issue any clear message about the topic of discussion, but its presidential spokesman Zaw Htay said on Monday that the team would "discuss the situation on the border".

At least 65,000 Muslim Rohingyas have fled northwestern Myanmar for Bangladesh since October to escape a "counter-insurgency operation" by the military. Some 22,000 entered Bangladesh in the last one week alone, international media reported on Monday, quoting the UN relief agency.

A foreign ministry official said Bangladesh wanted a solution to the Rohingya issue and had already expressed readiness to engage with Myanmar to discuss the process and modalities of repatriation of Myanmar nationals.

On December 29, the foreign ministry summoned the Myanmar Ambassador in Dhaka Myo Myint Than and demanded an early repatriation of all Myanmar nationals living in Bangladesh.

The presence of undocumented Myanmar nationals has long been a sticking point between the two countries, with Bangladesh having repeatedly asked for repatriation of an estimated 300,000 to 500,000 that have been living illegally. This is in addition to some 32,000 registered Rohingya people living in the country for over two decades.

Amid international outcry, Director General Kyaw Zaya of Myanmar's Ministry of Foreign Affairs on December 30 told Reuters that they would take back only 2,415 of its citizens from Bangladesh. Myanmar authorities have been maintaining this num-

ber since 2010 but never started the process to take back those verified even before 2006. As part of mounting international pressure on Myanmar, the member states of the Organisation of Islamic

Cooperation (OIC) will come together in Kuala Lumpur on January 19 to discuss possible remedies to the situation of the Rohingya Muslims in Myanmar. Bangladesh will voice its concern and place its proposals

at the meeting.
