Siddikur facing cut in Singapore

Siddikur Rahman was facing cut in the SMBC Singapore Open, the first Asian Tour event of the season, after racking up one-over-par (72) in consecutive rounds.

AFC Women's Asian Cup Qualifiers

Bangladesh says no

Even though Bangladesh's women's teams have recently been doing well both at junior and senior level in international tournaments,

Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) has surprisingly decided not to send the women's national team to the AFC Women's Asian Cup Qualifiers, which will get underway in Amman on April 3.

The draw for the competition will be held today with 21 participating nations, split into four groups, vying for four spots of the eight-team final round. The top three highest-ranked women's teams - Japan, Australia and China - and hosts Jordan will directly join the eight teams in the final round to be held in 2018.

Though all the Asian teams are eligible to participate in this competition, the BFF did not send an entry, letting go of opportunity to see where the team stands at Asian level.

"Our senior team is not in that shape. We will only participate in the Asian Cup Qualifiers once we have a proper squad and proper training. Most of our national team

players are 16-year-olds. After two years, they will be fit for the national team," BFF president Kazi Salahuddin said while explaining reasons behind not sending an entry.

Asked whether the Asian Cup Qualifiers could have been a preparatory stage for the girls who have been training for September's AFC U-16 Women's Championship, the BFF boss said, "The girls will play practice matches in Japan. Besides, I don't want to give extra load on them who can't take much pressure in training at the moment."

Though there is a whisper that the game's governing body has pulled back from taking part in the qualifiers due to financial constraints, Salahuddin said, "It is rubbish. There is no financial problem."

The Bangladesh team, which comprises mostly of under-16 players, became runners-up in the SAFF Women's Championship and qualified for finals of the AFC U-16 Women's Championship as group champions.

Though Bangladesh team has historically taken part in regional competitions, they had once taken part in the Olympics Qualifiers in 2011 where they lost to India and Uzbekistan by identical 0-3 margins.

Andy, Roger storm through

Andy Murray and Roger Federer put on a masterclass on Friday as they swept into the last 16 of the Australian Open, hoping to take advantage of Novak

Djokovic's shock exit. Murray swamped Sam Querrey 6-4, 6-2, 6-4 and Federer humbled Tomas

Berdych 6-2, 6-4, 6-4 in just 90 minutes, maintaining his 100 percent record over his old rival at Melbourne Park. Women's world number one

Angelique Kerber also hit form as she dropped only four games against Kristyna Pliskova to race into a fourthround meeting with America's Coco Vandeweghe.

Murray and Federer had both watched from afar on Thursday as Djokovic, the defending champion and six-time winner, suffered a stunning defeat to 117th-ranked Denis Istomin.

Querrey also upset Djokovic at Wimbledon last year but Murray, made a knight in Britain's New Year honours, never looked like slipping on any banana skins in round three.

He put Querrey away 6-4, 6-2, 6-4 in just under two hours, winning 77 percent of points on his first serve and facing only three break points in a

clinical display.

The Scottish world number one also showed no signs of discomfort in his right ankle, after he rolled it painfully during his second-round win over Andrey Rublev.

"I felt better and better as the match went on in terms of my movement," he said. "The ankle was a little sore and I was a little tentative at the start but it got better and better through the match."

Federer, 35 and returning from an injury lay-off, said he even surprised himself with an imperious win over Berdych that left the Czech shaking his head as he departed.

"In practice things were going well, but I've never been the practice king. I was winning tons of sets," Federer said, adding: "It's been unbelievable. I did surprise myself."

Murray and 17th-seeded Federer are on course to meet in the quarterfinals, with the Scot next facing Mischa Zverev and the Swiss veteran up against Kei Nishikori. Japan's Nishikori should provide a stern test for Federer and the fifth seed underlined his confident form by seeing off Slovakian qualifier Australia's Ashleigh Barty in three sets. Lukas Lacko 6-4, 6-4, 6-4.

Stan Wawrinka, the 2014 champion, survived a four-set tussle with Viktor Troicki 3-6, 6-2, 6-2, 7-6 (9/7) and now faces Italy's Andreas Seppi,

who ousted Steve Darcis of Belgium.

Jo-Wilfried Tsonga also came through in four sets against American Jack Sock and will play Briton Dan Evans, who beat Australia's Bernard Tomic 7-5, 7-6 (7/2), 7-6 (7/3).

In the women's draw, Kerber finally got into her stride with a 6-0, 6-4 destruction of Kristyna Pliskova, the 58th-ranked twin sister of Czech fifth seed Karolina. The German defending champion was an early loser at both of her warm-up tournaments and was taken to three sets in unconvincing wins in round one and two.

But Kerber clicked into gear against Pliskova, winning in just 55 minutes to set up a last-16 clash with America's Coco Vandeweghe, who ousted Canadian starlet Eugenie Bouchard. Svetlana Kuznetsova outlasted fellow

thirty-something Jelena Jankovic 6-4, 5-7, 9-7 and will next play fellow Russian Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova. Venus Williams beat Duan Yingying

6-1, 6-0 to end Chinese interest, earning a match with German qualifier Mona Barthel who overcame

French Open champion Garbine Muguruza was a 6-4, 6-2 winner against Anastasija Sevastova, setting up an encounter with Romania's Sorana

Lyon sign

Olympique Lyonnais have signed Dutch winger Memphis Depay from Manchester United on a four and a half year contract, the French Ligue 1 club said on Friday.

Lyon paid 16 million euros (\$17 million) for the 22-year-old Netherlands international.

Memphis scored seven goals in 53 appearances for United after moving from PSV Eindhoven for 25 million pounds (\$30 million) in May, 2015 but he has played only eight minutes since the end of October.

"He was a fantastic professional," United manager Jose Mourinho told a news conference. "If someone thinks it didn't work because he wasn't a great professional, that's totally wrong."

Memphis was the leading scorer in the Dutch top flight in 2014-15 and was signed by former United manager Louis van Gaal.

Kottan issue hanging

The possible appointment of George Kottan as the head coach of the Bangladesh national team is seemingly hanging in the balance after the 70-year-old Austrian demanded high salary from the game's governing body.

Kottan, who guided Bangladesh to their maiden SAFF Championship title in 2003, was offered the head coach's position for a ten-month period recently. However, the veteran coach, who guided Abahani to Federation Cup and Bangladesh Premier League titles last season, has demanded three times more than what he received from Abahani, according to a source inside the BFF. Kottan, reportedly offered 10,000 dollars per month, was

supposed to inform about his decision within three days after the National Teams Committee meeting on January 16, but the Austrian has yet to reply. "We decided to appoint him as he knows Bangladesh

football and the players pretty well. Besides we also know how much salary he drew from Abahani. But he has demanded too much compared to BFF's offer," said the source on condition of anonymity. The veteran coach, through an online conversation with a

journalist, claimed that he demanded 25,000 dollars for sixmember coaching staff -- head coach, assistant coach, fitness coach, goalkeeping coach, team doctor and a masseur.

"I think the amount I demanded for six persons is not that big and any football federation in the world must bear such expense for good results but they [BFF] didn't agree, Kottan said. "I have closed the chapter three days ago and have set a year-long programme with FIFA."

Payet's car damaged

French international Dimitri Payet's refusal to play for West Ham has led to his car being vandalised according to English tabloid 'The Daily Mail' on Friday.

The 29-year-old -- who along with his wife Ludivine are keen to return to the south of France and are demanding he be allowed to join former club Marseille -has also been effectively closed out by his teammates who have deleted him from the team's WhatsApp group.

He has also been barred from team-bonding sessions and dinners effectively being sent to 'Coventry' -- the English term for shutting someone out and refusing to engage with them.

"The team are all part of a WhatsApp group and they were all messaging each other to arrange going for dinner at the start of this week," club insider ExWHUEmployee told The Sun.

Chelsea will not dwell on Costa



Chelsea will bid to put the Diego Costa crisis behind them

when the Premier League leaders host Hull, while title chasing Tottenham aim to maintain their hot streak

at troubled Manchester City on Saturday. Blues striker Costa reportedly clashed with Chelsea boss Antonio Conte last week over the club's treatment of his back injury.

Amid reports that Costa was also the subject of a lucrative offer from Chinese Super League club Tianjin Quanjian, Conte kept his players focused as they crushed Leicester 3-0 last weekend despite the absence of the Spain striker.

With Chelsea refusing to consider selling their leading scorer, Conte appears to have smoothed any troubled waters and Costa returned to full training this week.

Conte has refused to acknowledge there was even a dispute with Costa, but it will be instructive to see if he restores the notoriously volatile star to his starting line-up with

so much at stake in the title race. Hull haven't beaten Chelsea since 1988, but Tigers goalkeeper Eldin Jakupovic says the third bottom team are a more dangerous unit under new boss Marco Silva.

"He gives us confidence. We have to play our football. That's sometimes difficult in the Premier League but he's doing a good job and the players have been doing a good job," Jakupovic said.

In the unlikely event of a Chelsea slip, second placed Tottenham could close the seven-point gap on their London rivals when they travel to Eastlands.

City's 4-0 thrashing at Everton last Sunday was the heaviest league loss of Pep Guardiola's glittering managerial career and left them languishing 10 points behind Chelsea after a second defeat in their last three league games.

That prompted Guardiola to write off City's title hopes and led critics to question whether the former Bayern Munich and

Barcelona chief can succeed in England. Tottenham pose another threat to Guardiola's equilibrium after reeling off a

six-game winning run. But Spurs manager Mauricio Pochettino, who handed Guardiola his first defeat as City boss in October, is certain his rival will

eventually make his mark. "Guardiola is one of the best managers. It is difficult to come to a new club and bring a new philosophy but he is doing very well. I am sure

he will be a success," Pochettino said. With his squad short on energy and inspiration in recent weeks, Guardiola could freshen up his attack by giving a debut to teenage Brazil forward Gabriel Jesus, who officially completed his move from Palmeiras this week.

"I've watched the Premier League and noticed it's very hard, intense style of play,' Jesus said.

"I hope to adapt as quickly as possible in the first contact I have with the game."

Liverpool striker Divock Origi has challenged his team-mates to keep the pressure on Chelsea when they host relegation-threatened Swansea.

Jurgen Klopp's side are seven points behind Chelsea in third place after losing ground in the title race following a frustrating 1-1 draw at bitter rivals Manchester United last weekend.

Retired Germany striker Lukas Podolski, who now plays for Galatasaray will write a weekly column which he says will be "technical, professional, but also written with humour".

The 32-page 'FussballBild' will be published from Monday to Saturday and costs a euro (\$1.06).

The content will be pooled from the 23 regional editions of Bild. The tabloid-format daily

has been tested since the start of the season in Munich and Stuttgart, but from Friday has been distributed nationwide. It has been launched by




