# Patients suffer for lack of surgeons

Agailjhara Upazila Health Complex has been running without surgeons and anaesthetists for long, causing immense sufferings to patients.

In most of the cases, critical patients were asked to go to Barisal Sher-E-Bangla Medical College Hospital (SBMCH), said Dr Altaf Hossain, upazila health and family planning officer (UHFPO).

In spite of having operation theatre and other equipment at the 50-bed hospital, no operation was conducted on patients due to lack of surgeons and anaesthetists, said Resident Medical Officer (RMO) Dr Bakhtair Alam, who joined the health complex 18 months ago.

the hospital for long time, critical patients are referred to SBMCH, said the family planning officer.

Only eight physicians, including RMO and UHFPO, out of 22 doctors are working here for so many patients, he said, adding that without a surgeon and anaesthetist, most services, especially operations have been closed for a long time.

They informed the higher authorities several times but to no effect yet, said Dr Altaf.

"We trained some health assistants as anaesthetists but this batch will come out next month," said Civil Surgeon AFM Safiuddin.

"If we receive some trained anaesthetists, the problem will be solved," he said.

## 2 militant suspects held

Counter Terrorism Unit (CTU) of Dhaka Metropolitan Police arrested two students on suspicion of involvement with militancy from Companyganj upazila in the district on Sunday.

The arrestees are Amjadul Islam Rasel, 23, son of Nasir Ahmed of Ward No 8 in Basurhat municipality, and Abu Abdullah Ishtiaque, 17, son of Sarwar Hossain Liton of ward No 4 in Charkakra union. They were held from their homes at night.

Rasel is a 7th semester student of CSE department at Uttara University while Ishtiaque is a Class X student of Basurhat Government High School.

Officer-in-Charge of Companyganj Police Station Syed Fazle Rabbi said a team of CTU led by its Inspector Shawkat Ali conducted a raid from 8:00pm to 11:00pm and arrested the two.

## Two rapists get life

A court here yesterday awarded imprisonment for life to two men on rape charge.

Judge of Women and Children Repression Prevention Tribunal-2 SM Zillur Rahman gave the verdict and also fined them Tk 20,000 each. If unpaid, they will have to stay in jail for three more years.

The convicted are Jewel Sikder, 30, son of Rahman Sikder, and Haider Sheikh, son of late Majon Ali Sheikh of Lahuri village in Indurkani upazila.

Court sources said Jewel stopped a Class VI student while she was going to a local high

school and forcibly took her to a nearby garden where he raped her on July 8, 2010.

Victim's father filed a case with Indurkani Police Station on August 1, accusing Jewel and two or three unnamed people, after photos of the incident were circulated via mobile phone.

Police arrested Jewel soon after filing of the case. He confessed that he raped the girl and Haider took photos of the incident on his mobile phone. Police arrested Haider following information given by Jewel.

Jewel went into hiding after getting bail from the High Court, while Haider was present in the court when the verdict was pronounced.

## Students forced to buy lottery tickets

Authorities of Domar High School compelled every student to purchase at least two lottery tickets in the name of raffle draw during the sports competition on Saturday.

Teachers, with backing of the headmaster, lured students to buy tickets with chance of getting prizes.

Headmaster Rabiul Alam said it was not a lottery and the money left after giving prizes would be utilised for betterment of students.

Upazila Education Officer Sakerina Begum said arranging such a raffle draw is not permitted, and the school authorities did not inform her about the matter.

President of the school managing committee Aktaruzzaman Sumon told journalists not to poke their noses in the matter.

## 14 years' RI for JMB man

A court here yesterday awarded 14 years' rigorous imprisonment to a member of banned militant organisation Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) under the Arms Act and Anti-terrorism Act.

Judge of Special Tribunal-2, also Additional District Judge of Chapainawabganj, Ziaur Rahman handed down the verdict in presence of the JMB man.

The convict is Abdur Rakib alias Sumon, 28, son of Aftab Hossain of Shamjola village in Shibganj upazila.

According to the prosecution, police raided Bismillah Store in Kansat Bazar and arrested Sumon from there on June 17, 2009. Police seized a firearm and three bullets from the shop.

Sub-Inspector Mizanur Rahman of Shibganj Police Station filed a case against Sumon under the Arms and Anti-terrorism Acts with the police station that day.

On completion of investigation, police placed charge sheet against him on July 8, 2009.

The court handed down the verdict after examining the prosecution witnesses and relevant documents.

## Villagers volunteer to repair dyke in Jhalakathi

Villagers, finding no alternative, have joined hands for reconstructing a one kilometre embankment to stop Bishkali river erosion at Palat in Rajapur upazila of the district.

Despite repeated calls, the authorities concerned are yet to take any initiative to repair the damaged portion of the embankment, said locals.

They are also engaged in voluntary work to repair a damaged road there.

Bishkali continues to erode the area round the year, said Alamgir Sharif, a resident of the village.

Financed by a benevolent man of the area, the embankment reconstruction work started at the beginning of the month, he said.

Alamgir hoped that the work will be

completed within this month.

At least 200 families, especially fishermen community, will be benefited after completion of the work, he said.

It is a matter of joy that they will be able to use the road after completing the work, said another villager Marry Akhtar.

"I get immense pleasures and mental peace by doing such works for the betterment of people," said Shahadad Hossain Kajal, a businessman in Dhaka who passed his childhood and boyhood in the village.

Zakir Hossain, executive engineer of Water Development Board in Jhalakathi, said a project for building an embankment on the riverbank has been sent to the higher authorities but this time, the area is not enlisted in the project.

They will do work on it next time, he said.

## WOMAN EXPATRIATE MURDER

# Threat to withdraw case

Family members of a slain expatriate alleged that the prime accused is threatening them to withdraw the murder case that they filed with Sarishabari Police Station.

Victim Lili Akter's husband Imam Ali made the allegation at a press conference at his village Charsarishabari on Sunday.

Lili, an expatriate to Italy, was killed on January 11 allegedly by her nephew Nazmul Hassan Sumon, 23, son of the victim's elder brother Joyal Abedin of Satpua area in Jamalpur town.

Demanding Sumon's immediate arrest, Imam said since filing of the case they are under pressure by the accused to withdraw the case.

Imam said Lili returned home from Italy on January 1 and went along with her family

members to her cousin's house in Satpua area on January 11.

Sumon went to that house and put pressure on Lili to return 10 decimals of land in the area that she bought from Joyal in 2010, Imam added.

As she refused, an angry Sumon went out of the house after an altercation with his aunt over the issue, Imam said.

Sumon stabbed to death Lili in front of TDC Primary School while she along with her family members was returning home around 7:00pm, he added.

Imam filed a murder case accusing Sumon and three to four unnamed people with Sarishabari Police Station in this regard the following day.

Officer-in-Charge of the police station Rezaul Islam Khan said they are conducting drives to arrest the prime accused in the case.

## Prof Jasim first BAU Pro-VC
