150-YEAR OLD TRADITIONAL FESTIVAL IN BOGRA

The 150-year traditional "Poradaho Mela" was held in the presence of thousands of people at Golabari area under Gabtoli upazila in Bogra district on Wednesday followed by a Bou mela for women at the same location on Thursday.

Locals said that the mela is also called "Jamai Mela" and relatives, specially the son-in-laws of the area, are invited by the locals and relatives.

Different variety of fish, furniture, sweetmeats, toys, agricultural tools and fruits were being sold at the mela. A circus and entertainment have also been arranged at the mela by the organisers.

Large fish such as Baghair, Katla, Silver carp, Kalbaush, Boal, Ruhi and other fish were the main attraction at the mela and furniture, toys and cosmetics were selling in a big way. Organisers said that at least at Tk. 6-7 crore will be generated at the mela from the sales of these items. Lakhs of people from the surrounding 20 villages and surrounding upazilas turn out to enjoy the mela.

According to a court document obtained by The Associated Press, Madonna said she will keep the children's birth names in order to preserve their Malawian identity. Additionally, a Malawian caretaker will help ease the transition to the United States by accompanying the children in their travel.

The singer has previously denied rumors that she was in the southern African country to complete an adoption process, claiming she was there for charity work. Her organisation, Raising Malawi, works to improve the lives of impoverished and underprivileged children.

Madonna has four other children, two of whom she adopted from Malawi almost 10 years ago.

"Star Wars" spoof in the works from "Scary Movie" team

Jason Friedberg and Aaron Seltzer, the duo known for the parody films including the "Scary Movie" franchise, "Epic Movie" and "Vampires Suck", will next take on the iconic Star Wars franchise with their latest film, "Star Worlds Episode XXXIVE=MC2: The Force Awakens the Last Jedi Who Went Rogue".

Friedberg and Seltzer will write and direct the Star Wars spoof, which is eyeing a Fall 2017 shoot.

Covert Media's CEO Paul Hanson is producing the film alongside Broken Road Productions' Todd Garner. Covert Media also is financing the project, and launching

worldwide sales in Berlin.

"Jason and Aaron are a powerhouse duo who have proven time and time again that they are fully tapped into what audiences love," said Hanson. "Their fearless take on pop culture has us beyond thrilled to tackle the world's most popular franchise with the two of them leading us into a galaxy far, far away."

"Star Worlds" is the second project announced under the two-year first look deal between Covert and Broken Road. The partnership is currently working on the underwater action thriller "Resurface", which will be directed by Paul Franklin.

Along with writing "Scary Movie", Friedberg and Seltzer wrote and directed 2008's "Disaster Movie", 2010's "Vampires Suck" and 2014's "Best Night Ever".
