### BFF trains up school coaches

The Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) has finally got itself actively involved with the Bangabandhu and Bangamata Gold Cup Primary School Football Tournaments by providing training to coaches and teachers of those schools which have qualified for the final rounds.

Though the Bangabandhu and the Bangamata Gold Cup, which involved around 65 thousand primary schools, started in 2010 and 2011 respectively, this is the first time that the game's governing body got itself involved, thanks to the success of age-level women's teams in international tournaments.

Some 28 coaches and teachers from 14 schools - seven schools each for boys' and girls' tournaments - were given a three-day training at the BFF House. The course concluded yesterday with the hope that the standard of the footballers would gradually improve.

"Although I have an AFC C license certificate, I have learnt new things from this training course," claimed Golam Raihan Bapon, a teacher of Suti BM High School of Tangail and mentor of the U-16 women's team captain Krishna Rani Sarker.

"We train the girls with our acquired knowledge but we have learnt new things such as techniques, tactics and basic stuff of football. I don't know whether it will help the girls in the final rounds due to shortage of time but I believe it will help me a lot to teach the girls in future," said ATM Masud Ahmed, head coach of Syed Arjumand Ali Primary School of Sylhet.

Primary and Mass Education secretary Mohammad Asif-Uz-Zaman, additional secretary Nazrul Islam Khan, BFF members Fazlur Rahman Babul and Satyajit Das Rupu and technical director BA Jubair Nipu were, among others, present on the occasion.

free-kick to earn Burnley a 1-1 draw on Sunday that prevented Chelsea moving 12 points clear at the Premier League summit.

Brady cancelled out an early strike from Pedro and while the point stretched Chelsea's lead to 10 points, their advantage will be trimmed to eight points if Manchester City win at Bournemouth on Monday.

Brady's goal continued his recent run of success against Chelsea manager Antonio Conte, with the winger having also scored the winning goal for Ireland against Conte's Italy in the Euro 2016 group stage.

Burnley, whose home record is bettered only by second-place Tottenham Hotspur and Chelsea themselves, looked like they might be swept away following an electrifying start from the league leaders.

But Sean Dyche's team, who had won seven straight games at Turf Moor after losing to Manchester City in mid-November, showed great resilience and deservedly equalised after 24 minutes through Brady.

#### Women's team going to Singapore

The Bangladesh women's football team will play a threenation tournament in Singapore from February 16 to 18 as part of the under-16 team's preparation for September's AFC U-16 Women's Championship. The other teams in the tournament are Malaysia and Singapore. The Bangladesh team will leave Dhaka on Wednesday.

The Bangladesh team, which features only four senior players apart from players of the under-16 team, recently played seven matches against Japanese academies as well as the under-16 Thailand team during the J-Green Sakai Lady's football festival in Japan.

"The girls will play two matches in this tournament as part of their preparation for AFC U-16 Women's Championship," Bangladesh Football Federation women's committee chairman Mahfuza Akter Kiron said during a press conference at the BFF House yesterday.

While informing that sponsors Walton will provide all the gear for the team, she also said: "There has been a bad impression on the sponsors due to negative media reports after the men's team's bad defeat against Bhutan and as a result sponsors are going away."

### Siddikur 41st in Malaysia

# Real back on top

Real Madrid returned to the top of La Liga after winning a testing away clash against Osasuna 3-1 on Saturday thanks to goals from talisman Cristiano Ronaldo, midfielder Isco and substitute Lucas Vazquez.

Osasuna striker Sergio Leon cancelled out Ronaldo's 24th-minute opener in the 33rd after defender Tano had been carried off with a sickening double leg break. Isco restored Real's lead in the 62nd and Zinedine Zidane's side added a third through Vazquez with the last kick of the game.

Real goalkeeper Keylor Navas needed to produce a string of quality saves to preserve their advantage before Vazquez sealed only a second league win in seven visits to the perennial La Liga strugglers.

Real top the standings on 49 points, leapfrogging Barcelona on 48 after the champions thrashed Alaves 6-0 on Saturday.

Zidane's side have two games in hand on their arch rivals as they bid to win the title for the first time since 2012.

and sports Biren Sikder distributed prizes where BFF president Kazi Salahuddin, former footballer Ashraf Uddin Ahmed Chunnu, assistant private secretary to the Prime Minister Saifuzzaman Shekhor and Magura zilla Parisad administrator Pangkanj Kundu were also present.

### Wenger plays down exit talk



Arsene Wenger insists he is not pre-Premier paring to end his long reign at League Arsenal despite Ian Wright's claim the Gunners boss is on the way out.

Wenger's future had been questioned in the wake of defeats against Watford and Chelsea that effectively killed off their Premier League title hopes. Wenger's side returned to winning ways as Alexis Sanchez's

double secured a 2-0 home victory over Hull on Saturday.

But after the game the Frenchman was quizzed on his future, with his current contract expiring at the end of the season and a minority of fans turning on the manager. Former Arsenal striker Ian Wright had fanned the flames by

claiming on Friday that the 67-year-old had told him he was "coming to the end" of his time after 20 years at the helm. Yet Wenger countered by saying any tiredness stems from his commitment to the job and that Wright must have mis-

understood any conversation. Asked whether he had given Wright the impression he was leaving, Wenger replied: "No, no. Mark [Gonnella, Arsenal communications director] was with me as well on

Thursday. "It was questions and answers. I could be tired because I get up early in the morning and I finish late at night, so I am tired, yes. But I didn't give any indication about my future.

"There were many people there. We (he and Wright) had a little dinner before but it was not the two of us. There were four or five." Asked if Wright could have misinterpreted any com-

ments, he said: "Yes. You know I appreciate very much that you want me to rest, absolutely. But I am not ready for that yet." If Arsenal had not won against lowly Hull, it would have

ramped up the pressure on Wenger to depart. Although not at their best, Wenger was pleased to put the recent defeats to bed ahead of a trip to face Bayern Munich

in the Champions League last first leg next week.
